QUICK KICKS

- Florida State is ranked No. 1 in both the NSCAA and TopDrawerSoccer polls for August 25. It is the third-straight week and 11th time overall that the Noles have been ranked No. 1 by the NSCAA.
- FSU enters the weekend on a program-record 23-game unbeaten streak, as well as a 12-game winning streak that sits as the second-longest in school history.
- The Seminoles and Lions have met only one time previously as FSU defeated Southeastern Louisiana, 4-1, in the opening round of the 2009 NCAA Tournament.
- Florida State trails 10-12 all-time in the series with Florida, but the Seminoles have won three of the last four meetings. The Noles are 6-6 on the road versus the Gators, winning each of the last three contests in Gainesville.
- Florida State is 115-9-4 (.914) at home under Mark Krikorian. The Noles have only lost one game at home in their last 49 contests, a 2-1 defeat to Florida on September 5, 2014.
- Cheyna Williams tallied a goal and two assists on opening weekend and has either scored a goal or recorded an assist in nine of the last 10 games she has played. The senior forward has totaled seven goals and five assists over that span.

PRODUCTION FROM THE TOP

Senior forward Cheyna Williams was all over the field and the box scores in FSU's pair of wins at the Lobo Invitational on August 21-23, tallying a goal and two assists.

Williams has picked up right where she left off in 2014 as she has either scored a goal or recorded an assist in nine of the last 10 games she has played, dating back to the ACC semifinal game against Notre Dame in 2014. She has totaled seven goals and five assists over that span.

ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Redshirt junior defender Kirsten Crowley was key in FSU's two wins at the Lobo Invitational on August 21-23 and was selected as the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on August 25.

Crowley captained the Florida State defense as the Noles gave up just five shots against New Mexico, defeating the Lobos, 3-1.

Against RV/No. 23 USC on Sunday, Crowley and the FSU defense did not allow a shot on goal, and only two shots total, in a shutout of the Trojans. Crowley had an impressive tackle on a breakaway opportunity by USC in the first half that set up an FSU scoring chance.

It is the second time in Crowley's career that she has been selected as an ACC Player of the Week.

CAN'T STOP. WON'T STOP

The Florida State offense has been difficult to stop by opponents as the Seminoles have scored a goal in a school-record 28 straight matches. The last time that FSU has been shutout in a game was versus UCLA in the 2013 College Cup Final, falling to the Bruins, 1-0, in overtime.

During the 28-game streak without being shutout offensively, the Noles have recorded 20 shutouts defensively.

PRESEASON NO. 1

Florida State entered the 2015 season as the No. 1 ranked team by both the National Soccer Coaches Association and TopDrawerSoccer. It was the first time that FSU had received a preseason No. 1 ranking and the 10th time overall that the Noles were No. 1 in the NSCAA poll. In 2012, Florida State earned the program's first No. 1 ranking on August 28 after opening the season with a 2-0 record. The Noles held on to the No. 1 spot for eight consecutive weeks in 2012. FSU regained the No. 1 spot in the final poll of the 2014 season after winning the national championship.

OPENING DAY RECORDS

Florida State is 15-5-1 all-time on opening day, including a mark of 5-4-0 when opening the season away from Tallahassee. The Noles are 10-1-0 on opening day under head coach Mark Krikorian, including a mark of 5-1-0 on the road. FSU has won eight straight season openers, outscoring the opposition 22-3.

The new Florida State freshmen have wasted no time in making an impact for the Seminoles. Midfielders Natalia Kuikka and Megan Connolly scored their first collegiate points in the season opener at New Mexico on August 21.

Kuikka scored the game's first goal in the 12th minute off an assist from Cheyna Williams to give the Noles a 1-0 lead. Connolly assisted on the game's final goal, striking a ball that was blocked by the UNM keeper and put away by Williams as the Noles defeated the Lobos, 3-1.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY PRESEASON WATCH LIST

The Seminoles placed two student athletes on the preseason watch list for the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy. Seniors Isabella Schmid and Cheyna Williams were two of 28 players recognized on the preseason list.

FSU is one of five teams with two student-athletes on the Watch List, joining Florida, Stanford, Virginia and West Virginia. It is the 12th straight season that the Seminoles have had a student-athlete named to the preseason Watch List and Florida State has had two players chosen eight times in the last 10 seasons.

In 2007, Mami Yamaguchi won the MAC Hermann Trophy, the first and only player in school history to win the award. Yamaguchi led the country in points that season with 66, while finishing second in goals (24) and assists (18).

The Seminoles look to continue their early season success with two more games in the month of August. - Florida State head coach Mark Krikorian took over the Seminole women's soccer program in 2005 and has proven to the nation that FSU soccer will be a national title contender on an annual basis.
- In his first 10 seasons in Tallahassee, Krikorian has led FSU to a 2014 National Championshpi, eight College Cup appearances, including a recent string of four straight trips (2011-14), three appearances in the national championship game (2007, 2013 and 2014) and three ACC titles (2011, 2013 & 2014).
- Under Krikorian, Florida State is the only school in the country that has finished ranked in the top 10 of the final NSCAA poll over the last 10 years.

Krikorian recorded career college win No. 300 with a 1-0 win at Arkansas in 2012 becoming the 25th coach across all NCAA divisions to reach that milestone.

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

Florida State has assembled an impressive schedule as they look to compete for another national championship in 2015.

Eight of Florida State's 18 regular season opponents – including five conference foes – were ranked in the 2015 NSCAA Preseason Top 25. The Noles will face No. 5 Texas A&M, No. 8 Florida and No. 17 UCF before starting the challenging Atlantic Coast Conference schedule with No. 2 Virginia, No. 7 North Carolina, No. 9 Notre Dame, No. 13 Virginia Tech and No. 22 Clemson.

Three other 2015 opponents - Duke, Boston College and Southern California - received votes in the preseason NSCAA poll, with the Trojans coming in at No. 23 in the preseason TopDrawerSoccer poll.

FRESH FACES

The Seminoles welcome eight freshmen to the squad in 2015, including two who had already enrolled at Florida State for the Spring 2015 semester. Midfielder Holly Fritz (Cape Coral, Fla.) and defender Macayla Edwards (Palm Beach Gardens, Fla.) each got an early start at Florida State, joining the team in January and training with the Seminoles throughout the spring.

Six others arrived for the fall, with three Americans and three international players. Midfielders Kaycie Tillman (Rowlett, Texas) and Dallas Dorosy (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) along with defender Olivia Bergau (Merritt Island, Fla.) represent the newcomers from the United States.

The trio of international players from Europe that will be competing for the Noles this fall are midfielders Megan Connolly (Cork, Ireland) and Natalia Kuikka (Kemi, Finland) and forward Elin Jensen (Reykjavik, Iceland).

NO GOALS FOR YOU!

The Florida State defense was nearly impenetrable in 2014, as the Noles surrendered only nine goals on the season and recorded two separate streaks of over 500 scoreless minutes.

FSU began a stretch of 589:00 minutes without allowing a goal in the first half at UConn on September 18 and held opponents scoreless until October 12 on a second half goal by Virginia Tech. The streak ranks as the fourth-longest in FSU program history.

The Seminoles capped the 2014 season without allowing a goal in the final 630:03 of the season, including seven shutouts. That streak continued into the 2015 season before being snapped by a goal at 53:04 of the season-opener at New Mexico. The overall streak of 683:07 ranks third all-time in school history. The longest shutout streak at Florida State came in 2012 when the Noles did not surrender a goal over 934:09 from September 7 to October 18.

IMAIZUMI RETURNS

Back on the sideline for Florida State this season will be assistant coach Morinao Imaizumi. He initially joined the Seminole staff as a volunteer assistant in 2011, helping lead Florida State to an 18-win season, its first ACC Championship and a berth in the College Cup.

In 2012, Imaizumi stayed on as an assistant coach as the Seminoles opened the season with a program-record 14 consecutive wins and earned their sixth overall appearance in the College Cup.

A native of Japan, Imaizumi returned home in 2013 and resumed work the Japan Football Association, coaching a JFA Academy U-15 team to a runner-up finish in both the 2014 and 2015 All-Japan Tournament.

SHUTOUT RECORD

Playing every minute of the 2014 season, goalkeeper Cassie Miller set an NCAA individual record with 19 shutouts on the season. The redshirt freshman also set a school-record goals-against-average of 0.34 in her first year of collegiate soccer.

So far in 2015, Miller and the Noles have already posted a shutout against RV/No. 23 Southern California (1-0).

LET ME HELP YOU!

The Seminoles return their top two and six of their top eight assist leaders from 2014, led by seniors Carson Pickett and Megan Campbell who had 13 and 12 assists respectively. The team produced a school-record 90 assists in 2014, surpassing the total of 71 set in 2007.

DEFENDING ACC CHAMPS

Florida State open the season as the defending champion for the third time in school history and the second year in a row. The Seminoles are the only school other than North Carolina to win back-to-back ACC titles.
