Content on JSTOR

JSTOR values its collaborations with publishers who entrust their journals to the archival collections for long-term preservation. In 2012, **945** publishers from **53** countries entrusted **1,941** journals to JSTOR.

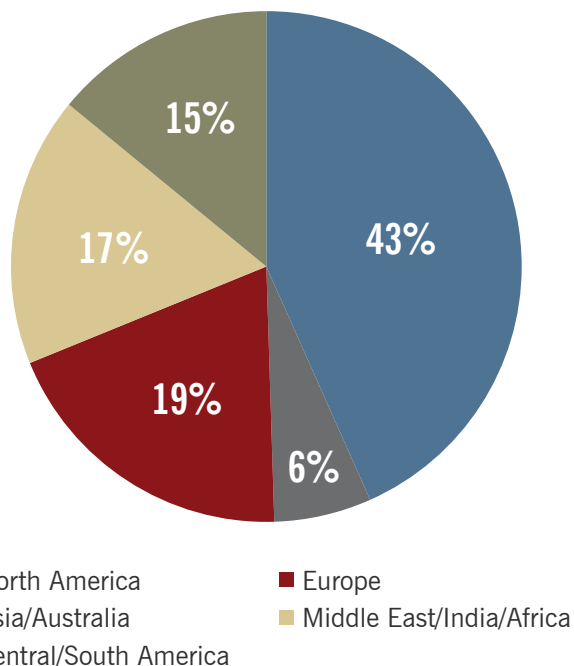
After making an additional **139** journals publicly available on the platform, JSTOR currently hosts: **1,695** digitized journals = **8,198,859** digitized articles = **46,285,956** digitized pages.

A Growing Audience

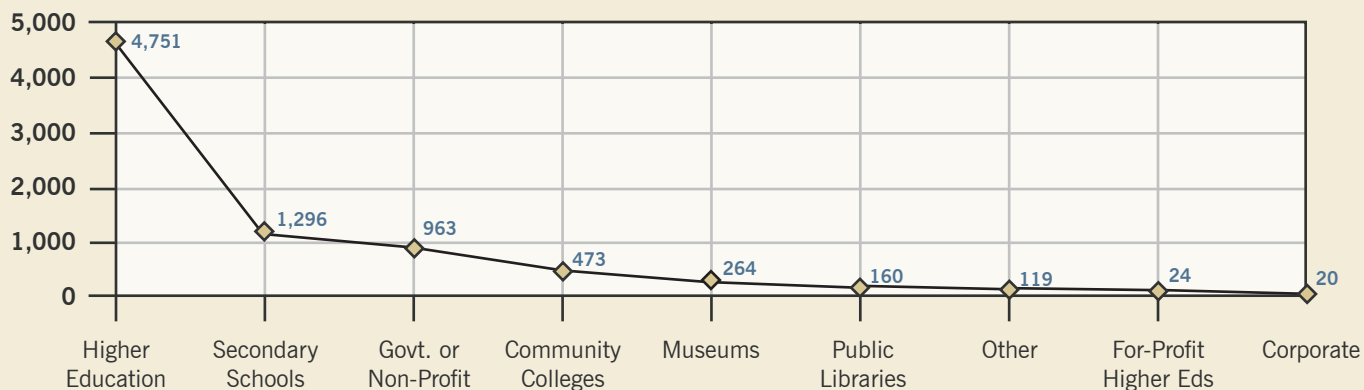
In 2012, **8,070** institutions, including **711** new participating institutions, in **167** countries licensed at least one JSTOR archival collection. JSTOR works one-on-one with libraries worldwide as well as **53** consortia and **6** licensing agents in **51** countries to broaden access to publishers' content as widely as possible. JSTOR also supports the African Access and Developing Nations Access Initiatives, which waive or reduce fees for **1,231** not-for-profit institutions in developing countries.

In addition to the more than 4,000 higher education institutions, JSTOR works with secondary schools, governments, not-for-profit organizations, museums, and public libraries to facilitate access to scholarship.

Regional Breakdown of 2012 JSTOR Archive Participating Institutions

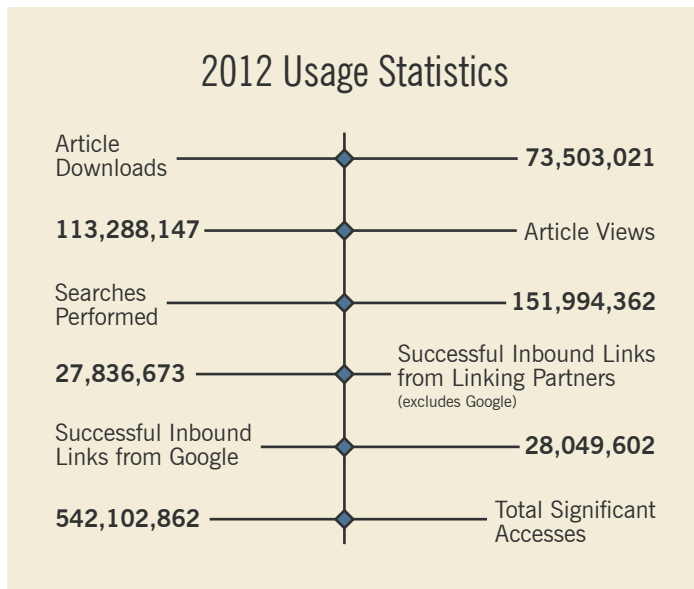


Community Breakdown of 2012 JSTOR Archive Participating Institutions



JSTOR Usage in 2012

JSTOR usage exceeded 500 million significant accesses in 2012. This includes the total number of article views, downloads, performed searches, and citation captures (saving, emailing, or exporting).



Register & Read (R&R)

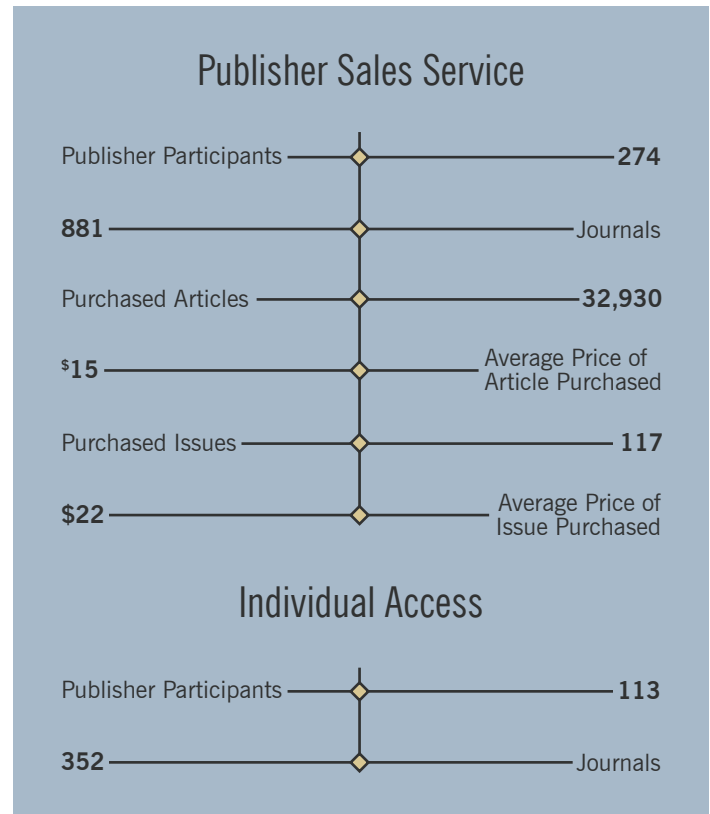
Introduced in March 2012, Register & Read aims to help unaffiliated users (individuals without institutional access) to discover publishers' content on JSTOR. Users register for a MyJSTOR account to receive free, read-only access for up to three articles that can be refreshed every two weeks. Users can also purchase and download articles if journals are part of the Publisher Sales Service program.

During the March to December 2012 beta period, R&R attracted 208,332 MyJSTOR registrants who accessed more than 30,000 articles. In January 2013, R&R expanded to more than 1,200 archival journals from nearly 800 publishers. As JSTOR continues to monitor the program, we will release usage updates throughout the year.
