ON BOJANOVSKY: Will play in his fourth season as a Seminole in 2015-16 and has become one of the top shot blockers in school history...will undoubtedly finish his career as one of the top five shot blockers in school history...has an uncanny knack for executing the high pick and roll with a tremendous ability to roll directly to the rim and finish above defenders who are working to earn the high airspace that he earns because of his height...his incredible length and stride-ability makes him a prime defender as he extends his arms and gets in passing lanes to bother an offensive player's vision...enters his senior season tied for sixth in school history with 136 career blocked shots...needs only 24 blocked shots to move into fifth place in school history and needs only 29 blocked shots to move into third place all-time at Florida State...the school record for blocked shots in a career is 239 by Rodney Dobard (1990-93)...has blocked an average of 1.3 shots per game for his 102-game career and averages 45.3 blocks per season during the first three years of his career...averages more blocked shots in ACC games during his career (1.4 bpg / 78 blocks in 54 games) than he does in non-ACC games (1.21 bpg / 58 blocks in 48 games)... his 67 blocked shots during the 2013-14 season ranks as the seventh best single season total in school history and is the second best single season total by a Seminole sophomore...his 67 blocked shots ranked behind Solomon Alabi's Seminole sophomore record of 75 blocked shots during the 2009-10 season...enters his senior season as one of the top field goal shooters in school history as he is tied for eighth with a career shooting percentage of .575...he is looking to become only the ninth player in school history to shoot .575 from the field or better for his career...the school record for career field goal shooting percentage is .668 by Murray Brown (1977-80)...has played in 70 consecutive games (including every game of his sophomore and junior seasons)...has earned playing time in 102 career games and could approach the school record for games played by the end of his senior season...the school record for games played in a career by a Seminole player is 139 by Okaro White (2011-14)...has totaled three double-doubles during his career – one as a sophomore (12 points and 12 rebounds against Maryland in the ACC Tournament) and two during his junior season (10 points and 10 rebounds against Nebraska in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and 13 points and 10 rebounds at Clemson)...his 13 points against the Tigers on February 4, 2015 ranks as his career high scoring total in an ACC game...an instant classic in the history of Florida State basketball as his dunk with 0.4 seconds remaining in Florida State's second round game of the 2014 ACC Tournament gave the Seminoles their 67-65 win over the Terps in Maryland's final ACC game before it moved into the Big Ten...took an interior pass from senior Okaro White and dunked over Maryland's Dez Wells and Jon Graham for the game clinching basket...totaled 12 points and 12 rebounds as he recorded his first career double double in the victory over the Terps that advanced them into the quarterfinals of the tournament...has played in the European Championships three times – the U-18 tournament in 2010 and 2011 and the U-16 Tournament in 2009...averaged a double double of 22.0 points, 13.3 rebounds and 4.2 blocked shots while shooting .594 percent from the field as a member of the U-18 Slovakian Team at the U-18 European Championships...scored 34 points against Switzerland in the U-18 European Championship...at least 23 points in six of the games in which he played including 34 points against Switzerland, 25 against Norway and 23 each against Austria and Romania...multiple blocked shots in five of his six games including seven against Austria, six against Sweden and five against Switzerland...totaled four steals against Austria and three against Romania...pulled down 22 rebounds against Sweden and 14 against Switzerland...a near triple double of 23 points, 11 rebounds and seven blocked shots against Austria...ranked first on the Slovakian team in field goals made (10.0 per game), defensive rebounds (9.7 per game), blocked shots (4.2 per game), double doubles (six) and field goal percentage (.583 percent)...recorded a double double in all six games played during the 2011 U-18 European Championships...averaged 13.0 points and 7.1 rebounds in seven games during the U-18 European Championships...averaged a double double of 15.6 points and 10.9 rebounds in seven games during the U-16 European Championships in 2009...played at the same prep school that originally brought former Seminole football player Menelick Watson to Florida State...Watson was a second round draft pick of the Oakland Raiders in the 2013 NFL Draft...earned the First Year Academic Achievement Award and shared the award for the Seminole with the best field goal percentage at Florida State's annual Honors Banquet in 2013...presented with the award as Florida State's best field goal percentage shooter at the Seminoles' season-ending banquet in 2014...presented with a team-high three awards at the Seminoles' 2015 honors banquet as he earned the Academic Achievement, the Sixth-Man and Best Field Goal Percentage awards...

AS A JUNIOR (2015): Averaged 5.1 points (sixth on the team), 3.4 rebounds (fifth) and 1.3 blocked shots (first) while shooting a team-leading .576 from the field...played in all of Florida State's 33 games as a junior and has played in 70 consecutive games entering his senior season...ranked seventh in the ACC with his 1.33 blocked shots per game average and is one of six returning ACC player who averaged 1.3 or more blocked shots per game during the 2014-15 season...ranked fourth in the ACC in blocked shots in conference games with 30 blocked shots in 18 ACC games for a 1.67 blocked shots per game average...blocked his junior season high of four shots at Syracuse (Jan. 11) and in the Seminoles' double-overtime victory over Wake Forest (Jan. 28)...three blocked shots at Pitt (Jan. 14), in a victory at Georgia Tech (Feb. 14) and against NCAA Tournament participant Louisville (Feb. 28)...multiple blocked shots came 13 times as a junior, including 10 times against ACC opponents during the season...averaged his ACC career high of 5.4 points in 18 conference games as he scored in double figures in three games against ACC competition...had more steals in 18 conference games as a junior (12) than he did in his first two

seasons of ACC games (11 steals in 36 conference games)...scored in double figures a total of six times as a junior including his career and season-high of 18 points against UMass in the final round of the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic (Nov. 23)...made his career and season-high of seven field goals and made four free throws in scoring 18 points against the Minutemen...his ACC career and season-high of 13 points came at home against Clemson (Feb. 4)...scored 10 points in Florida State's 65-63 win over Florida to mark the second consecutive time he had scored in double figures against the Gators...he scored 14 points against Florida in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on November 29, 2014...was Florida State's leading rebounder in four games with a team-high 10 rebounds coming against Nebraska in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge (Dec. 1) and in ACC games against Notre Dame (Dec. 13) and Clemson (Jan. 19) and a team-high nine rebounds against Louisville...led Florida State with three games of 10 rebounds (against Nebraska, Notre Dame and Clemson)...led the Seminoles with two double-doubles (10 points and 10 rebounds against Nebraska and 13 points and 10 rebounds at Clemson)...his double-double against Nebraska in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge was the second of his career...led the Seminoles and the game with his season-high tying 10 rebounds...also blocked two shots in 23 minutes of playing time against the Cornhuskers...earned his career-high for steals with 22 including two each in six different games...totaled 22 steals as a junior after earning 23 steals in his first two seasons as a Seminole...**(vs. Boston College):** Scored two points, pulled down two rebounds and blocked one shot in Florida State's only game of the season against Boston College...totaled two second half free throws as Florida State topped the Eagles, 69-60, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Feb. 18)...a starter in the second half of the game and helped Florida State outscore the Boston College 42-28 over the final 20 minutes to take the win...his first free throw shot at the 19:50 mark of the second half brought the Seminoles to within four at 32-28 while his second made free throw shot gave the Seminoles a 53-50 lead at the 6:22 mark of the game...**(vs. Clemson):** Averaged 5.7 points, 4.3 rebounds and shot .667 from the field in three games during the season against Clemson...the Seminoles leading shooter from the field (.667) and tied for second on the team with 13 total rebounds as the Seminoles defeated the Tigers in two of three games during the season – once at Clemson during the regular season and in the second round of the ACC Tournament...also shot .833 from the free throw line (five of six) against the Tigers during the three-game series...totaled two points and two rebounds in five minutes of playing time as Florida State defeated Clemson, 59-55, in Clemson (Jan. 19) in the first of the three meetings between the two teams...a second half dunk at the 14:35 mark gave the Seminoles a 42-32 advantage...the dunk proved important as the Tigers worked their way into the game and trailed by only one (56-55) with 26 seconds left to be played in the game...the Seminoles scored the final three points of the game to gain the victory...totaled a double-double of 13 points and 10 rebounds for the Seminoles who fell to the Tigers, 52-56, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Feb. 4)...was his second double-double of his junior season with his 13 points ranking as his ACC career-high for points in a conference game...four points in the first half and nine in the second half as Florida State fought to get back into the game after trailing by 10 in the second half...his ACC career high 13 points came on five of eight shooting from the field and three of four shooting from the free throw line...his 10 rebounds were split evenly – five defensive and a season high five on the offensive end of the court...scored two points and added one rebound as Florida State topped Clemson, 76-73, in the second round of the ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum (March 11)...the Seminoles topped the Tigers to advance to the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament for the current ACC-best eighth consecutive season...two points came on two free throws at the 14:22 mark of the second half to give the Seminoles a 47-35 advantage...Florida State needed all of the points they could get as Clemson whittled the Seminoles' lead to two points (75-73) with 25 seconds remaining in the game...two free throws by Phil Cofer gave the Seminoles their 76-73 winning advantage...**(vs. Duke):** Scored three points to go along with two rebounds in Florida State's only game of the season against NCAA Tournament Champion Duke...earned 13 minutes of playing time as Florida State played the national champions down to the wire before falling, 73-70, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Feb. 9)...his three points came on an old-fashioned three-point play at the 3:37 mark of the first half which brought the Seminoles to within three points of the Blue Devils at 22-19...made a lay-up and completed the three-point play with a free throw after he was fouled by Duke's Justise Winslow...helped Florida State outscore the Blue Devils by a 46-41 margin in the second half of the game to close their deficit to one point with 12 seconds left to play...**(vs. Georgia Tech):** Totaled six points, three blocked shots and one rebound in Florida State's only game of the season against Georgia Tech...his play helped Florida State to a come-from-behind 57-53 win over the Yellow Jackets at McCamish Pavilion in Atlanta (Feb. 14)...was a perfect four of four from the free throw line – with all four free throws coming in the final 2:39 of the game and helping the Seminoles to the victory...his only field goal of the game also came in the second half (at the 10:22 mark) and gave the Seminoles a 41-40 lead...Florida State scored the final nine points of the game to rally from down 53-48 (with 4:10 left to play) to up 57-53 (at the final buzzer)...Bojanovsky scored four of the Seminoles' final nine points of the game (all from the free throw line) and was credited with one rebound and one assist in the final 2:39 as Florida State gained the always important ACC road victory...began the final stretch of the game with two free throws at the 2:39 mark to pull the Seminoles to within three at 53-50...hit two more free throws at the 1:50 mark to pull Florida State within one at 53-52)...Bojanovsky was fouled both times by Charles Mitchell to have the opportunity to take (and make) four free throws within 49 seconds of each other...credited with an assist in the game-winning jumper by Xavier Rathan-Mayes with 54 seconds left to play – a basket that gave Florida State the 54-53 lead...Florida State scored the final three points of the game (all on free throws) to gain the victory...**(vs. Louisville):** Scored a near double-double of 11 points and nine rebounds in Florida State's only game of the season against NCAA Tournament participant Louisville...his 11 points were tied for his third highest point total of the season and was his highest scoring total against a ranked team during his career...Louisville defeated the Seminoles, 81-59, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee...played well in the post against Cardinal All-American Montrezl Harrell as he attempted a season-high eight free throws, making five...one of the highlights of his career was a steal and a full court romp for a dunk at the end of the first half...his dunk drew Florida State to within 10 at 36-26 after the Seminoles had trailed by 15 in the first half...**(vs. Miami):** Averaged 6.5 points and 1.0 rebound in two games against NIT participant Miami...shot the ball well against the Hurricanes (three of five from the field and seven of eight from the free throw line) as the in-state rivals split the regular season series...the Seminoles won in Tallahassee and the Hurricanes won in Coral Gables...scored eight points, earned two steals and pulled down one rebound as Florida State defeated Miami, 55-54, in Tallahassee (Feb. 1)...totaled five first half points and three in the second half as the Seminoles battled back from a 16-point deficit...his most important points came as an old fashion three-point play at the 12:25 mark of the second half...made a jumper, was fouled by Miami's Joe Thomas and made the ensuing free throw to pull the Seminoles to within four at 45-41...more impressive than his offensive impact was his defensive prowess in the second half of the Seminoles' victory over the Hurricanes...played 10 minutes and totaled three rebounds and two steals as Florida State held Miami to 18 points in the second half of the win...Miami led 36-25 at the half and Florida State held the Hurricanes to 18 points and .316 percent shooting from the field in the second half...his second steal led directly to a dunk by Jarquez Smith – a basket that allowed the Seminoles to cut their deficit to 51-50...Florida State scored the final seven points of the game to help Florida State gain the victory...scored five points and pulled down one rebound in 11 minutes of playing time as Florida State fell, 81-77, to the Hurricanes at the BankUnited Center in Coral Gables (Feb. 25)...three second half points as the Seminoles rallied from 18 points down on the strength of 30 points in the final 4:38 by Xavier Rathan-Mayes...**(vs. North Carolina):** Scored two points and blocked two shots in the Seminoles' only game of the season against NCAA Tournament participant North Carolina...the Tar Heels weathered a strong Florida State comeback late in the second half to gain the 78-74 win at the Dean E. Smith Center in Chapel Hill...his only basket of the game – a jumper in the paint – brought Florida State to within two at 48-45 as they worked to get back into the game after trailing by 11 in the second half...the Seminoles pulled to within as few as four points on the shoulders of Xavier Rathan-Mayes who scored 35 points in the historic Dean Dome...**(vs. NC State):** Totaled zero points and four rebounds in Florida State's only game of the season against NCAA Tournament participant NC State...earned 14 minutes of playing time as the Seminoles nearly pulled off the come-from-behind victory before falling, 72-63, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Jan. 17)...totaled a team high two blocked shots against the Wolfpack...**(vs. Notre Dame):** Totaled six points and an ACC career high tying 10 rebounds in the Seminoles' only game of the season against ACC Champion and NCAA Tournament participant Notre Dame...was one of three times during the season that Bojanovsky pulled down 10 rebounds in a game...Notre Dame won the ACC opener for both teams, 83-63, at the Purcell Pavilion in Notre Dame, Ind. (Dec. 13)...totaled four first half points and six first half rebounds against the Irish...**(vs. Pitt):** Averaged 4.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 1.5 blocked shots in two games against NIT participant Pitt...the Seminoles and the Panthers split the two-game regular season series

with both teams winning on their home court...made six of seven free throws (.857 percent) in the two games against the Panthers...Totaled two points and five rebounds in 16 minutes of play as the Seminoles traveled to play at Pitt...the Panthers outscored the Seminoles, 40-32, in the second half to gain the 73-64 win at the Petersen Events Center in Pittsburgh, Pa. (Jan. 14)...totaled two first half points as Florida State built an eight-point first half lead...a first half lay-up at the 5:57 mark gave Florida State a 22-18 lead...scored six points and pulled down three rebounds in Florida State's 61-52 victory over Pitt at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee...was a perfect six of six from the free throw line – including four of four in the second half – in helping the Seminoles to the victory...his six free throws made ranks as his career high for free throws made in a single game...his two most important free throws in the game came with 34 seconds remaining in the Senior Day game and gave Florida State a 59-52 lead...**(vs. Syracuse):** Totaled 10 points and two rebounds in Florida State's only game of the season against Syracuse...his 10 points against the Orange ranked as his third highest ACC scoring total of the season...was a perfect five of five from the field in scoring his 10 points including a perfect two of two from the field in the first half and a perfect three of three from the field in the second half...the Orange won 70-57 in the Seminoles' first visit to the Carrier Dome to play Syracuse as members of the ACC (Jan. 11)...was Florida State's second leading scorer in the game behind only 14 points from freshman Xavier Rathan-Mayes...**(vs. Virginia):** Averaged 7.0 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.5 blocked shots against ACC regular season champion and NCAA Tournament participant Virginia...shot well from the field (five of seven, .714 percent) and from the free throw line (four of five, .800 percent) in the two games won by the Cavaliers...tied for the team lead with three blocked shots in the two games against the Cavaliers...Virginia won at home during the regular season and in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament...totaled eight points, three rebounds and one blocked shot as Florida State fell, 51-41, in Charlottesville (Feb. 22)...made three of four field goal attempts (.750 percent) and was a perfect two of two from the free throw line (1.00 percent) in the ACC road loss...totaled six points, three rebounds, two blocked shots and one steal in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C. (March 12) ...helped Florida State outscore the Cavaliers in the second half but Virginia won the game 58-44...**(vs. Virginia Tech):** Averaged 4.5 points, 2.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocked shots in two games against Virginia Tech...shot the ball well in both games (three of four, .750 percent from both the field and the free throw line)...averaged 15.5 minutes played in the two-game regular season sweep against the Hokies with wins in both Tallahassee and Blacksburg...totaled six points (on two of two shooting from the field) and blocked two shots in Florida State's 86-75 win over the Hokies in Tallahassee (Jan. 6)...three points in both halves...a jumper at the 15:14 mark of the first half gave the Seminoles a 13-11 lead...added a first half free throw at the 6:20 mark to give Florida State a 34-26 advantage...two first half blocked shots on the defensive end helped the Seminoles to a 53-point first half scoring output and a 53-45 halftime lead...a starter in the second half of the game for the Seminoles...an old-fashioned three-point play at the 18:53 mark of the second half opened Florida State's lead to 10 at 57-47...the Seminoles didn't trail by less than seven points for the remainder of the victory...totaled three points, three rebounds and two blocked shots in Florida State's 73-65 victory over Virginia Tech at Cassell Coliseum in Blacksburg (Feb. 7)...another old-fashioned three-point play gave the Seminoles a 13 point lead at the 8:30 mark...Bojanovsky made a lay-up, was fouled by Malik Muller and made the ensuing free throw...also blocked two second half shots as the Seminoles led throughout the final 20 minutes of the game despite the Hokies pulling to within one point before the Seminoles stretched their lead into double figures...**(vs. Wake Forest):** Totaled five points, seven rebounds and a season-high tying four blocked shots in Florida State's only game of the season against Wake Forest...all of his five points came from the free throw line as he made five of six shots from the line...helped Florida State recover from a 15-point first half deficit to top the Demon Deacons, 82-76, in double overtime at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Jan. 28)...played all 10 minutes in the two overtime periods in leading the Seminoles to another come-from-behind win...Florida State trailed 19-4 at the 10:43 mark of the first and by a 33-27 margin at halftime...Florida State tied the game at 65-65 at the end of regulation...the game was tied at 72-72 at the end of the first overtime and the Seminoles outscored the Deacons 10-4 in the second overtime to gain the victory...totaled four points on a perfect four of four shooting from the free throw line in the first half...scored his fifth point of the game with 11 seconds remaining in the second overtime period to put the exclamation point on the Seminoles' comeback for the ACC win...totaled two first half blocked shots and two second half blocked shots...his second half blocked shots came within four seconds of each other (at the 15:25 and 15:21 marks) and helped the Seminoles keep the Deacons within striking distance...Florida State took its first lead of the game less than two minutes after Bojanovsky's defensive efforts...**(vs. Florida):** Scored 10 points, pulled down two rebounds and earned two steals in Florida State's 65-63 victory over Florida in its only game against the Gators during the 2014-15 season...was one of four Seminoles in double figures as he made four of five shots from the field as the lead was exchanged eight times during the game before the Seminoles won on a last second basket...totaled six points on three made field goals in the first half to help the Seminoles to a 26-24 lead at the intermission...of his three baskets in the first half two were dunks...four second half points including a third dunk at the 19:32 mark to give Florida State a 30-24 lead...**(In Four Games During the Basketball Hall of Fame Tournament):** Averaged 5.8 points, 2.8 rebounds and 0.7 blocked shots in four games during the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off Classic...scored his career and season high of 18 points in the fourth game of the event against UMass...was Florida State's fifth leading scorer in the event despite averaging 16.5 minutes per game and coming off of the bench in all four games...**(vs. Manhattan):** Scored zero points and pulled down zero rebounds in four minutes of play in the Seminoles' season-opener against NCAA Tournament participant Manhattan...the Seminoles topped the Jaspers, 81-66, in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Nov. 15)...Florida State outscored Manhattan 44-35 in the second half to pull away for the victory...**(vs. Northeastern):** Totaled five points and added four rebounds in Florida State's second round Hall of Fame tournament game against NCAA Tournament participant Northeastern...the Huskies led at halftime by two points (40-38) and won the game as they outscored the Seminoles in the final four minutes of the game to take the 76-73 win at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Nov. 18)...totaled four second half points as Florida State worked to get back into the game after trailing by seven points in the second half...**(vs. Providence):** Scored zero points, pulled down one rebound and blocked two shots in Florida State's game against NCAA Tournament participant Providence in the third round of the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic...the Friars topped the Seminoles, 80-54, in a game played at the Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn. (Nov. 22)...**(vs. UMass):** Scored 18 points and pulled down four rebounds against UMass in the final round of the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic...the Minutemen rallied from a nine-point deficit to take the 75-69 victory over Florida State at the Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn. schedule (10.4 mpg)...was at his best offensively in 18 home games (4.2 ppg) as compared to 11 true road games (3.1 ppg) and five neutral site games (2.0 ppg)...his 25 blocked shots are tied for the ninth highest single season total in school history by a freshman...blocked at least one shot in 12 different games with his season high of four blocked shots coming in the Seminoles’ win at Maryland (Jan. 9)...earned multiple blocked shots in eight different games with at least three coming at Maryland (four), against Minnesota (Nov. 27, three), at home against Wake Forest (Feb. 26, three) and at North Carolina (March 3, three)...led the Seminoles with a .547 field goal shooting percentage – he was the most accurate shooting freshman on the team and one of only three Seminoles (also Okaro White and Kiel Turpin who both shot .511 from the field) to shoot .500 percent or better from the field...was perfect from the field on multiple shots in four different games: against Buffalo (Nov. 12, 2-2), against BYU (Nov. 16, 2-2), at home against Maryland (Jan. 30, 2-2) and against Clemson in the ACC Tournament (March 14, 2-2)...Florida State was victorious in each of those four a third time in the first round of the ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum...scored four points and pulled down three rebounds in his first career ACC game as Florida State opened its ACC schedule at Clemson...the Seminoles led by as many as 16 points in the first half, led by a 38-25 score at the intermission and won the game, 71-66, at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson (Jan. 5)...scored
