Panuatu hemi kaontem yu!

Vanuatu Hemi Kaontem Yu

During the four months from May to August 2009, Census interviewers visited almost all of the households in Vanuatu and counted the number of people who usually live there. They also used GPS units to obtain information on the location of the household¹. This was the first major undertaking of the 2009 Census.

The listing is the foundation of the Census on 16 November. The Listing Results are used to determine how many Census forms have to be printed; interviewer work loads; the complex logistical arrangements for the delivery of field materials; as well as providing the basis for the mapping of the Census results through the GPS information.

So, for example, for the province of Penama the Census project will be organising the delivery of approximately 6,600 household questionnaires to the main islands of Ambae, Pentecost and Maewo where field staff supervisors will organise the delivery of the forms to the interviewers. The Preliminary Counts also show that the average number of people per household in Penama was 4.8; with slightly more males than females in total (104.6 males for every 100 females). This information will form the basis of quality control measures at the time of the Census to ensure that everyone is counted.

The Census 2009 Preliminary Counts show that since the last Census in 1999 the population of Vanuatu has grown by 2.8% a year, with the urban centres of Port Vila and Luganville increasing by 4.1% a year with the highest annual growth rates in Port Vila at 4.7%.

The next major activities for the 2009 Census are the training of field staff – Area managers, supervisors and interviewers – to enable them to interview all men and women, young and old, in Vanuatu on 16 November 2009.

¹ A household is defined as 'those who usually eat together and share the work of preparing the food and/or the cost of work of providing it'.
