### Foreword

Census data is an invaluable source of information pertaining to the population of distinct areas, from small territories, whole countries, and for the entire world. There has been recent media focus on the world population passing the 7 billion mark, and the challenges this presents for the global community we all live in. The Norfolk Island 2011 Census report presents us with a detailed analysis of the characteristics of the people present on Norfolk Island on Census night, 9<sup>th</sup> August 2011.

The 2011 Census on population and housing provides valuable information for policy making and for development planning on Norfolk Island, not only in the area of demographic change, but also in priority areas such as public health, disability and education. I strongly believe in the importance of sound and relevant data as a contributing factor towards effective decision-making and to enable monitoring of government policies and programmes. The availability of **robust data** and **reliable statistics** and the analysis of such data are crucial if we are to enhance our efforts towards more evidence-based policy making.

# Introduction

The primary aim of the Norfolk Island 2011 Census report is to provide census users with a better understanding of the state of affairs on Norfolk Island in the various areas covered by the 2011 Census. There are three parts to this report:

**Part 1** provides an overview of the organizational and operational background of the 2011 Census. It includes all the activities undertaken in the 2011 Census process.

Part 2 provides the analysis of the 2011 Census results and addresses various thematic areas including a brief on the Norfolk Island population profile and change in terms of its population size and distribution, its population structure by age and sex, and its population growth between census years (2.4). Movement of people in terms of immigration is also discussed (2.3). The report further analysed the social characteristics, hence providing a social profile of the Island (2.2) which combines analysis of disability and type of disability (2.4). The economic profile (2.5) deals with economic activities of individuals and also includes activity status, employment, occupation and industry in paid work, and unpaid activities. Finally, the last component of analysis is based on the household characteristics (2.6) of the 2011 Census and includes, among other things, the use of construction materials for houses. In addition, it addresses access to facilities and other housing amenities. Under each thematic area, it concludes with a brief summary of the main findings of the 2011 Census and attempts to distil implications for policy making and development planning on Norfolk Island.

**Part 3** provides the basic tables of the 2011 Census from which most of the major key indicators have been derived from for the analytical report of the 2011 Census

# Part 1. Organisational and operational backgrounds of the 2011 census

#### 1.1. General background

Censuses held at regular intervals provide an important source of information for the Administration of Norfolk Island, as well as for the private sector and not for profit organizations. The census is a vital instrument in a wide range of activities. Such activities include policy development and planning by the Norfolk Island Administration and by private organisations and interest groups, and the establishment of sample frames for surveys on specific topics.

The 2011 Census on Norfolk Island was preceded by full censuses undertaken during 1981, 1986, 1991, 1996, 2001, and 2006. In ensuring alignment with Australia, Norfolk Island conducts its censuses at the same time as Australia. In accordance with section 8 of the *Census and Statistics Act 1961*, Norfolk Island was divided into six Census Districts (CDs). Given the census district demarcation, it was also expected that a census district collector be assigned to each census district purposely to carry out duties in relation to the taking and collection of the census district. Thus, the census district collector's primary role is to distribute Householder's Schedules to all people present in the census district prior to the night of the census and to collect those Schedules after census night.

Apart from the providing the core information about population distribution and change, the 2011 Census is designed to provide information on areas of interest as defined by the *Census and Statistics Act 1961*, consistent to information provided in the previous censuses for purposes of comparison.

#### 1.2. Geographical

For operational purposes, the Norfolk Island is divided into six census districts. Although the census districts do not have any official administrative status, the divisions may serve as a framework for future surveys in inter-census periods. Annex II provides a map of Norfolk Island.

#### 1.3. Enumeration methods

An efficient collection operation is essential to the success of the Census. As in previous Censuses, the 2011 Census is *self-enumerated*. This means that each household is asked to fill in the details required on the Census form. A Collector is to provide assistance if and when a household requires additional assistance on the census form. A Collector collects the census forms the day after the census night. Where a Collector is not initially successful in collecting a Census form, he/she is required to return to the household up to at least two to three times in the week period following Census Night to attempt to collect the form.

#### 1.4. Census funding

Adequate financial support is required for a successful census. The total financial commitment to the 2011 Census was AUD\$30,000 solely financed by the Administration of Norfolk Island and with no external funding source. This will need to increase in the subsequent censuses.

#### 1.5. The 2011 Census programme

#### 1.5.1. Census Staffing

In the initial stages of the census planning and preparation of the 2011 Census, there were two core team members which included the Census Statistician and the Census Field Supervisor. Six census district collectors were recruited for the census enumeration period and two staff from the Administration of Norfolk Island provided valuable assistance to the final stages of the census exercise. All staff was appointed under the *Census and Statistics Act 1961* and was subjected to the strict confidentiality provisions of the *Census and Statistics Act 1961*.

#### 1.5.2. Mapping

The production of accurate maps for use by Census Collectors is important to the collection of the Census in order to avoid omissions and double counting. They make it possible for Census Collectors to deliver and collect forms from every household on Norfolk Island. Census collectors were provided with a hard copy of their maps. However, for subsequent censuses high resolution quality maps may need to be considered to ensure that a more detailed and appropriately scaled maps for use by Census Collectors, leading to better coverage of the population.

#### 1.5.3. Household Schedule

The household schedule consisted of 8 pages of A3 sheets printed back to back on white paper which could be prone to wet fieldwork conditions. The household schedule comprised of two main parts: a segment on individual persons information (7 pages) and a segment on dwelling information (one page). An additional household schedule was provided for households that exceeded more than 7 household members. In the segment on individuals/persons there were 44 questions and in the segment on dwelling there were 15 questions. A copy of the household schedule is attached as Annex III to the report.

#### 1.5.4. Pre-Publicity and Awareness

A publicity campaign was initiated to create awareness of the census among the population, as well as to help the public to understand why and how the census would be conducted.

The census publicity exercise included the following activities:

- A schedule of announcements for broadcast in "Local Notices" at Radio Norfolk was prepared and aired on Radio Norfolk during the days leading up to the census enumeration
- A series of media releases was published via the "Norfolk Islander", the Norfolk Window and Norfolk Online. The media releases also included an article providing clarity and justification on the "time capsule" question that was included in the household schedule

#### 1.5.5. Training

Enumeration Training for the Collectors is vital in ensuring that a Collector is fully versed and knowledgeable in achieving the expected census results and outcomes. A training session for the Collectors took place on Tuesday, 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2011, which was 7 days before the Census night on the 9<sup>th</sup> August 2011. The need to conduct a series of training sessions is of importance.

#### 1.5.6. Logistics

**Transport:** For the census enumeration, the census Field Supervisor and the Collectors used their personal vehicles to distribute and collect the household schedules. Costs incurred were reimbursed by the Norfolk Island Administration.

**Equipment:** The field equipment for the census district collectors included: Householder's Schedule; Envelopes for Householders Schedules (Black Lettering); Envelopes for Personal/Private Form (Red Lettering); Record Book, containing also 'Authority to Act as Collector' and a description of Collectors boundaries; Call-back/thank you cards; Mileage Claim for reimbursement of fuel expenses; Time Sheets to record hours worked; Collector's Badge (adhesive paper badge); One packet of pins; Two green and a carrying satchel for each Collector.

**Office Space:** For purposes of maintaining confidentiality of the 2011 Census household schedules, an office was provided for use at the Administration of Norfolk Island, to store the 2011 Census forms as well as to process the data.

#### 1.5.7. Fieldwork

**Distribution of Census Forms:** The Collectors started the first round of distributing the census forms on Friday, 5th August 2011. The Collectors were required to distribute each census form to each household in their district. Where no body was at home, a Collector would leave a call back card.

**Collection of Questionnaires**: The collection of the questionnaires commenced on Wednesday, 10<sup>th</sup> August 2011, the day following the census night. Upon completion of collection, all census documents were dispatched to the Census Field Supervisor and subsequently to the census office at the Administration of Norfolk Island. The last boxes with census results were received at the census office at the Administration on Thursday, 18<sup>th</sup> August 2011.

#### 1.5.8. Data processing

**Manual checking and coding:** The checking and coding of the census was done by the Statistician with the assistance of the two staff members from the Administration.

Census District batches of census forms were manually checked and manually coded, including checks on household identification of the census forms against the 2011 census record books; general checks which included checks on completeness; general coding which included coding of questionnaires, and coding of answers and general checks on the outputs.

**Data entry:** After completion of the manual checking and coding, the information on the 2011 Census household schedules was entered manually in the computer using Microsoft office excel. Two computers were installed in the census office, one of which was for use by the Statistician and the other for use by the data entry officers. To make optimal use of computers, the two data-entry officers worked in a two-three hour shifts one during official hours and the other after official hours. Data entry was completed by Thursday, 4<sup>th</sup> November 2011 and once data entry process was completed the census data was then consolidated.

As the Administration of Norfolk Island did not have a data processing programme such as IMPS (Integrated Microcomputer Processing System) or Census and Survey Processing System

(CSPro) to perform major tasks in data processing (data entry, data editing, tabulation, dissemination, statistical analysis and data capture control), Microsoft Office (excel) was used for data processing. This was time consuming and slowed the process of data entry.

**Data edition and imputation:** On completion of data entry, all data was edited to identify any inconsistencies of the census data. In cases where there appeared to be an inconsistency, reversion to the raw data was made and manual corrections had to be applied to the raw data. Several runs of the spreadsheets were required before the batch was sufficiently cleaned. Lastly, the resulting household and population totals were checked against the manual counts by the census district Collectors. In cases of inconsistent of the census outcomes, the batches with original census forms were checked to identify the source of each inconsistency.

**Final Data:** The final outcome of the 2011 Census is a file of coded records for each person, family, and dwelling enumerated in the Census. The data released in files and tables do not allow the identification of individuals.

**Archiving of Census Forms:** In preceding censuses, all census forms and other name-identified records were destroyed once the statistical data required for the purposes of the Census was extracted. The 2011 Census for the first time, gave each person the opportunity to have his or her Census information kept and then made publicly available after 99 years. Where a response to this question clearly indicates a respondent's agreement to have their Census information retained, and the form has been signed, the respondent's information will be stored.

**Recycling and Destruction:** Once all the statistical data has been extracted and completed and the census forms are no longer needed for processing, they will be destroyed.

### 1.5.9. Coverage and quality

**Coverage:** No attempt was made to undertake a post-enumeration survey for the 2011 Census given the tight work schedule. A few cases were reported of individuals who claimed not to have been visited by the census district collectors or had not received a census form, but data scrutiny revealed that information about some of these was apparently collected in their absence through other members of the household. The population counted in the 2011 Census appears to be low. However, this is consistent with intercensal data which seems to suggest a low population growth.

**Quality:** In general, the quality of census data is satisfactory as the number of errors and omissions remained within acceptable limits. Some of the mistakes and omissions were corrected during the phases of manual checking and data editing. Remaining offending values were re-coded as 'not stated'.

#### 1.5.10. Analysis and dissemination

**Analysis:** The basic tables were used as the basis for analysis and further data manipulation. The analysis of the 2011 Census is captured in Part 2 of this report.

**Dissemination:** The publication of this report is the initial stage of the 2011 Census dissemination exercise. Other forms of dissemination of the 2011 Census will take the form of press releases on specific matters covered in the 2011 census that maybe relevant to a wide audience.

# Part 2: Results and Analysis of the 2011 Census

#### 2.1 **General Population Profile and Change**

This section briefly discusses the basic demographic characteristics of the population of Norfolk Island reported in the 2011 Census, and in addition addresses its change over time. In doing so, it refers to on previous census data where information is comparable. Apart from absolute numbers of people and their geographic distribution, division of the population by on age and sex is the most important information in this section. Such information constitutes is essential for successful development planning, which often targets specific groups since needs vary with sex or age. Planning in the areas of social services, housing, employment or food supply, for instance all depend on reliable details on the age and sex composition of the population.

Norfolk Island has conducted its own census every five years since 1961. Before that population figures were based on head counts which date back to 1791. In 1841, a first census-like operation was carried out on the Island.




Figure 2.1: Population Size by Census Years

Census data from 1986 to 1996 indicates a declining population, then a rise in 2001 and a subsequent decline to present. The temporary rise may be due a tourism boom, and hence an increase in numbers of visitors, TEPs, and returning residents to work in their business. Figure 2.1 presents population sizes as reported in the censuses between 1986 and 2011.

# Population size and geographical distribution

The 2011 Census recorded a population of 2,302 people on Norfolk Island on census night, of whom 1,220 were females and 1,082 were males. The enumeration included ordinarily residents comprising of Residents, General Entry Permit and Temporary Entry Permit holders and secondment officers, as well as visitors who were on the Island on census night




Figure 2.2: Population Distribution by Census Years

As expected, the Norfolk Island is dominated by ordinarily residents at 78 percent and 22 percent accounts for visitors' population on census night. *Figure 2.2* represents the population distribution between ordinarily residents and visitors population.

### Population density

Norfolk Island as a whole has a medium to high population to land ratio: the Island's total population, including visitors, density is 66 persons per square kilometre<sup>3</sup>. If we were to exclude the visitors population density this would be at 51 persons per square kilometre. The overall density is somewhat misleading, however, since a large part of the Island plus all of Phillip and Nepean Islands are for conservation purposes and hence are largely uninhabited.

# Age Sex Structure




Figure 2.3: Percentage of Population Distribution by Age

The 2011 Census population make up indicates the population under 15 years of age amounted to 16 percent of the total population, which represents a sizeable decline since the 2006 census of 19 percent. The population of above between 15 years and 64 years amounts to more than 54 percent while the population of 65 years and above constitute a proportion of 24 percent. *Figure 2.3* presents population distribution by age between total population and ordinarily residents.





Figure 2.4: Total Population Pyramid by Age and Sex

The population structure by five-year age categories for the 2011 Census reveals a generally older population. Close inspection reveals that the 20-24, 25-29 and 30-34 age groups are small and narrow compared with most other jurisdictions, indicating that many in this age group may have moved away from the Island. In contrast, the 60-64-age category appears broad, indicating that this age group is the largest on the Island on Census night. *Figures 2.4 and 2.5*, confirm and display a lower number or percentage of younger people while displaying a much older population on Norfolk Island.

# Median Age

The median age is a measure that divides the population into two equal parts (the age at which half of the population is older and half is younger). Change in the median age shows if the population is aging or growing younger. The median age is especially useful as one measurement when comparing the composition of a population over time and to other populations. The 2011 Census indicated that the *median age* for total population including the visitors on census night was 58 years (56 for men and 60 for women), while the *median age* for ordinarily resident population was for 46 years (45 years for men and 47 years for women).

# Sex Ratio<sup>4</sup>

The proportion of males to females in a population is important background information for development planning. It has far-reaching implications in a wide range of areas like employment and marriage opportunities, population growth, and demand for social services, et cetera. The expected sex ratio —the number of males per 100 females— population category follows a pattern in which females outnumber males, hence an indication of a "male deficit".




Figure 2.6: Sex Ratio of Ordinarily residents Population by census years

The 2011 Census indicates that sex ratio for total population was 89, while for ordinarily residents on Norfolk Island was 92 and for visitors' population was 79. In further examining and comparing sex ratios between census years, *figure 2.6* reveals that over the last 20 year period sex ratio amongst ordinarily residents (i.e. excluding visitors) was equal (one female to one male) but has then declined. The 2011 Census depicts a scenario where for about every ten ordinarily resident females, there are about nine ordinarily resident males on the Island. The sex ratio is consistent with the population size and growth.

# Population Growth




Figure 2.7: Intercensal Growth Rate by Census Years

The population of 2,302 people enumerated in 9<sup>th</sup> August 2011 implied a - 9.6 percent decrease in the 5 years since the 2006 Census. On an annual basis this indicates a growth rate of -1.8 percent per year. Between the 1996 and 2001 Censuses, there was a high population growth (3.5%) but then growth rate declined between the 2001 and 2006 Censuses. The positive population growth between 1996 and 2001 may indicate a tourism boom and presumably this may have led to an increase in the number of TEP holders or it may indicate that residents returned to the Island for employment or to operate businesses on the Island. The declining growth rate between 2001 and 2011 indicated on *Figure 2.7* is consistent with the figures that go back to 2002/03, which clearly show the continual decline since the 2001 Census. The Norfolk Island Annual Report of 2001/02, stated that tourism declined in that year by 16.6% due to collapse of the airline in June 2001 and the attack on the World Trade Centre in New York in 2001.

# Summary and Conclusion

The population of the Norfolk Island has maintained a negative growth rate since 2001. The 2011 Census annual growth rate of -1.8 would imply that in 5 years time the projected total population will be 2,104, while the projected total population in 10 years time would be 1,923 assuming that if the growth rate remains constant.

The age structure recorded in the 2011 Census displays a low number of younger people between the age group of 20 years and 34 years. The population pyramid further reveals a generally older population and therefore there will be a much greater demand for services to cater for the needs of this age group particularly increased demand for medical and other geriatric services. The provision of such services would have implications for associated expenditures on services. However, the older population may also provide a potential economic stimulus. A largely healthy, independent older population can also form a valued social resource, for example in providing care for others, sharing skills and knowledge and engaging in volunteer activities.

#### 2.2 Social Profile

This section addresses several social characteristics of the Norfolk Island population that were covered by the 2011 Census household schedule.

# Religion




Figure 2.8: Percentage Distribution of Ordinarily Resident Population by Religion, all ages

The 2011 Census reveals that 62 percent of its population reported that they belong to Christian churches with Church of England remaining dominant at 34 percent. Almost a quarter of the ordinarily resident population reported to have no religion (*Figure 2.8.*) In examining the male and female distribution there is a pattern indicating that more females (33 percent) than males (27 percent) reported Christian church affiliation.

### Language

The 2011 Census contained one question regarding language, namely: "Does this person speak a language other than English?" The question was put to all age groups, but it was noted that there are babies and young children who may not speak a language well at their age. The census should have placed a cut off or reference point to target an age range on this question. Nevertheless, the 2011 Census recorded that 32 percent of the total population indicated speaking other languages other than English. Almost three quarter of the total ordinarily resident population reported to speaking Norfolk Island language.




Figure 2.9: Percentage Distribution of Ordinarily Resident population by other language

#### **Marital Status**

Marital status is an important determinant for a person's position in his or her life course. Getting married and the ending of a marital relationship for any reason —death of the partner, divorce or separation— are significant transitions in people's lives. They are accompanied by changes in rights, obligations, options and constraints. For instance, widowed women often constitute a vulnerable group, because they lack the support and income of their husbands and may lose access to housing or materials that were part of the household when they were married. Getting married also means new obligations and may interfere with an educational or professional career.

The 2011 Census distinguished persons who had never married, who were married at the time of the census, who were widowed, who were divorced or separated, or who were in a defacto relationship. A child who is under the age of 15 years was included in the "never married" category.

The 2011 Census recorded that almost half of the total ordinarily resident population for both male and female indicated at the time of the Census as been married: 21% and 21% respectively. Almost equal numbers of males and females of the ordinarily resident population have indicated as been single: 17% and 17% respectively. The 2011 Census revealed that there are more female widows (5%) than male widowers (1%).




Figure 2.10: Percentage Distribution of Ordinarily Resident population by Marital Status

# Usual or main activity




Figure 2.11: Distribution of Ordinarily Resident population of all ages by usual or main activity

The information on the usual or main activity of individuals in this report refers to all individuals of all ages at the time of the census<sup>5</sup>. The 2011 Census indicated that more than half of the ordinarily resident population (57%) are working in a job, business or farm while 19 percent of the ordinarily resident population are at primary or secondary school. *Figure 2.11* presents the distribution of ordinarily resident population by usual or main activity.

# Household Composition and Head of Household

In 2011 Census information was obtained in 1,017 households which were occupied dwellings on the night of census. Of this, 805 (79 percent) were private households and 212 (21 percent) were tourist accommodation dwellings which were occupied by visitors on the night of census. Average household size for all occupied dwellings was 2 persons per household.

#### Head of household

Everyone in the household was asked to state their relationship to the head of household. These relationships were classified in eight categories. The proportion of head of household is almost equal between male and female (55 percent for male and 45 percent for female).

# **Summary and Conclusion**

Figure 2.10 reveals that there are more female widows (4%) than male widower (1%) on Norfolk Island. While widowhood may have consequences and adverse effects on well being of a widowed person, this may not be the case on Norfolk Island given the active support network of families and friends that exists here on the Island. However, given the age sex structure of the population that depicts a generally older population, the proportion of widowed person will slightly increase over time.

# 2.3 Immigration Profile

# Country of Citizenship




Figure 2.12: Distribution of Total Population of all ages by Country of Citizenship

In the 2011 Census, almost 80 percent of the total population reported their citizenship as Australian, followed by New Zealand at 13 percent. *Figure 2.12* presents the distribution.

# Country of Birth

In the 2011 Census, people were asked what country they were born in. Of the total Population, 43 percent reported that they were born in Australia, followed by 24 percent who reported that they were born on Norfolk Island. Of the population (76 percent) who had reported that they were born outside of Norfolk Island, almost half of them (45 percent) reported that they arrived on Norfolk before 1995.




Figure 2.13: Distribution of Total Population of all ages by Country of Birth

# Ordinarily Resident Population of Pitcairn Descent

Relating to country of birth and citizenship is the relationship to ancestry. As in previous Norfolk Island Censuses, the 2011 Census again asked a question relating to Pitcairn descent. In comparing the responses between census periods of between 1986 and 2006, the ratio of a "yes, of Pitcairn descent" and "no, not of Pitcairn descent" response is around 1:1. For the 2011 Census, the ratio has slightly changed to 1:1.5. Thus for two persons of Pitcairn descent, there are three persons of non Pitcairn descent in the ordinarily resident population on Norfolk Island. This may imply that persons of Pitcairn descent may have relocated temporarily or migrated and that the increased number of persons of non Pitcairn descent is a contributing factor in the ratio.




Figure 2.14: Distribution of Ordinarily Resident Population of all ages by Pitcairn Descent

#### Residential Status on Norfolk Island




Figure 2.15: Distribution of Ordinarily resident population of all ages by Residential status

As in previous censuses, a question is asked on the residential status of persons on Norfolk Island. Of the Ordinarily resident population, permanent population accounts for 76 percent who are Residents and 9 percent are General Entry Permits (GEPS)<sup>6</sup> while the itinerant population<sup>7</sup> accounts for about 15 percent (*Figure 2.15*).




Figure 2.16: Distribution of General Entry Permit Holders of all ages by basis of GEP Permit

The 2011 Census specifically asked persons with General Entry Permits on the basis for the permit. *Figure 2.16* presents that 30 percent of the GEP holders indicated that they have an existing business while about 19 percent have indicated that they are self funded. A high proportion (36%) of GEP holders has indicated that none of the options provided was applicable.

# Summary and Conclusion

Migration would be the one population dynamic that would have an important consequence for the (re)distribution of the population and change on Norfolk Island, given that natural growth (i.e. fertility and mortality) appears small. While the 2011 Census did not go in detail to capture immigration ratios and rates, it would obviously be useful to closely examine the immigration data and to identify impacts on population change and to further examine the likely associated implications for Norfolk Island.

# 2.4 Disability Profile

The 2011 Census question on disability screens the population by self-perceived status of health in terms of disability. The question reads: "Is this person disabled by a serious long term illness on physical or mental condition?"

# Disability

Overall prevalence of disability

In the 2011 Census, a total of 82 persons (3.5% of the total population) reported as having a disability. There were slightly more men (3.6% of all males) than women (3.5% of all females) reported as having a disability. *Table 2.1* also indicates that disability amongst ordinarily resident population was higher amongst men (3.7% of all ordinarily resident males) than amongst women (3.3% of all ordinarily resident females)

# Type of Disability





Figure 2.17: Ordinarily disabled resident by type of disability (all ages)

Not all disabilities are equally common. Figure 2.17 show that "disability in other ways" (20%) exceeds all other categories, followed by "in acts of daily living" (14%) and "in doing housework" (8%). Further, not all disabilities are equally common in terms of the reason for need of assistance. Figure 2.18 indicates that "old or young age" (37%) is most common amongst disabled persons as the reason for need of assistance, followed by "disability of more than 6 months" (27%).

# **Summary and Conclusion**

The 2011 Census indicates that prevalence of disability amongst ordinarily resident population is higher in men than in women: 3.7% and 3.3% respectively. Types of disability are not equal. Disabled persons require assistance, and the most common reason for needing assistance is due to either "old age or young age". The age sex structure in Figures 2.4 and 2.5 showing a generally older population on Norfolk Island is therefore reasonable.

#### 2.5 **Economic Profile**

The information on the work activity of individuals refers to the population aged 15 and over at the time of the 2011 Census. In some places this is referred to as the 'adult' population, to distinguish it from the total population, and when percentages or rates are used they are usually based on this group<sup>8</sup>.

# Highest Level of Educational Attainment




Figure 2.19: Population 15+ years by Highest Level of Educational Attainment

Human resources in terms of people on the Island with tertiary qualification are very small. In examining the highest level of educational attainment by labour force population (figure 2.19) on Norfolk Island, the 2011 Census revealed that there are differences between males and females of ordinarily residents' population in terms of educational attainment as well as gaps between the categories of educational attainment. The most obvious difference and gap is reflected in the "trade certificate" category where 23 percent of ordinarily resident population reported that they have attained a Trade Certificate. Attainment of trade certificate is higher for males (15%) than females (9%) while only about 14 percent of ordinarily resident population have any major university degree (Bachelor's, Master's or PhD).

#### **Activity Status**

The 2011 Census question asked "Did this person have a full time or part time job or business of any kind last week?" Thus it was intended to include not only those earning wages or salaries, but also those who earned money (or payment in kind) from other activities such as business or farms as well as those who do unpaid work such as voluntary work or unpaid family work.




Figure 2.20: Working Age of Ordinarily Resident Population

Figure 2.20 reveals that of the total ordinarily resident population, the age group between 35 years and 74 who reported having a full time or part time job accounts for three quarter (75%)

while the age group between 20 years and 34 years reported that they have a full time or part time job this accounts for less than 15 percent. Concentration of working age is therefore within the 35 to 74 age range.




Figure 2.21: Distribution of Ordinarily Resident Population by type of work or activity

Figure 2.21 indicates that regardless of type of work, working age is more concentrated within the 35 and 74 age range than it is between the 15 and 34 age range.

# Age Sex Structure of Labour Force





Figure 2.22: Distribution of Ordinarily Resident Male and Female Population by type of work or activity

The 2011 Census reveals (*Figure 2.22*) indicates that there was a slight difference between men and women working in the private sector as an employee with more women than men working as a private employee: at 45 percent and 55 percent respectively. Upon further analysis, 7 percent of the adult population were unemployed but actively seeking work, with more men than women who reported this: 5 percent versus 3 percent.

# Industry

Employment work by industry sector

The sectors of highest employment in the ordinarily resident population are in the sales, wholesale and retail trade industry (18%) followed by hotels, accommodation and pubs (18 percent), and community and personal services (14%).

The main area of employment growth among the industries between census periods is not comparable as the classification of industry used in the 2011 Census differed from the previous censuses and further analytical work may be required in order to identify potential areas for employment and growth.




Figure 2.23: Distribution of Ordinarily Resident Population by Industry

# Occupation

*Employment work by occupations: what people do for money* 

The basic table B5.03 presents information on the occupations on Norfolk Island with a break down of occupations into seven major categories. By far the largest occupational group on Norfolk Island is "clerks" which includes "office clerks and customer services" at 25 percent followed by that of "skilled technicians and trade workers" at 19 percent.




Figure 2.24: Distribution of Ordinarily Resident Population by type Occupation

# Individual Gross Weekly Income




Figure 2.25: Distribution of Ordinarily Resident Population by Individual Gross Weekly Income

Figure 2.25 depicts the distribution of individual gross weekly income amongst ordinarily resident population. It reveals that individual gross weekly income is not evenly distributed within the earning brackets and is concentrated in the middle of the chart. It further reveals that about 34 percent of ordinarily resident individual earning income falls between the \$400 and \$800 earning brackets while only 9 percent of ordinarily resident's weekly income falls below \$249.00. Upon close inspection of the distribution, the *median* weekly income amongst ordinarily resident population of working age (i.e. 15+ years) is \$555.00 per week.

### **Summary and Conclusions**

As Norfolk Island's population continues to age, there may be an increasing desire by the Government to attract migrants particularly of persons within the age range of between 20 and 34 years who would contribute to the labour force on the Island, in turn pay taxes and thereby increasing government revenues to cover associated expenditures. At the same time, should this may be an option; there will be a need to plan for infrastructure to accommodate the changing size, composition and distribution of the population on the Island.

# 2.6 Housing and Dwelling Profile

The housing and dwelling situation on Norfolk Island and the availability of specific amenities is revealed in the 2011 Census.

### **Dwelling**

The 2011 Census differentiates between buildings, houses, and dwellings. A building refers to any construction that has a roof and walls. It may be a house, a flat, a shed, a shop, a factory, or a combination of any of these. Buildings may include vacant houses and also factories, shops, sheds, et cetera as long as these are also used to house people. A house is a building in which people live; it may include a freestanding house, an apartment or flat complex, a house may be occupied by more than one household and, therefore, may contain more than one dwelling. A dwelling refers to the living space that is occupied by a household. It can be a house or part of a house occupied by households. Thus, a dwelling may be a whole house or only part of a house. And, as there is only one household per dwelling, the total number of occupied dwellings equals the total number of households in the country.

#### Dwellings and households

In the 2011 Census, a total of 1,144 dwellings were counted on Norfolk Island. Of these, 127 were vacant during the census period, resulting in an occupancy ratio of almost 89 percent. However, there may be cases where dwellings in some areas of the Island that may have been missed, and the census district collectors may not include in their coverage. If all missed dwellings were captured, the occupation ratio would be slightly lower than reported.

#### Construction materials

The reported construction materials for walls, roofs and floors indicate that the majority of dwellings on Norfolk Island consist of timber wall dwellings with either corrugated or colarbond roofs. In these houses, timber floors are the most common (72%), followed by concrete or concrete block flooring (21%). Fibro-walled dwellings (25%) mostly have timber floors, or otherwise concrete floors. Concrete-walled houses practically always also have concrete floors.

Occupied Private Dwellings on Holding used for agricultural and pastoral purpose

The 2011 Census indicates that 23 percent of occupied private dwellings reported to have holding used for agricultural and pastoral purposes while 76 percent have reported that the holdings are not used for agricultural of pastoral purposes. Only 1 percent of occupied private dwellings reported "not stated" (*Figure 2.26*)





Figure 2.27: Occupied Private Dwellings on holding used for agricultural or pastoral purposes and by size of holding

In further examining the occupied private dwellings that reported on the holding used for agricultural and pastoral purposes, 26 percent of occupied private dwellings reported that they had holding size of less than 1 acre while 74 percent of occupied private dwellings reported that they had holding size of more than 1 acre (*Figure 2.27*)

Figure 2.26: Percentage of Occupied Private Dwellings Reporting holding used for agricultural or pastoral purposes

# Dwelling amenities,

The general access of the population to water, sewerage disposal, electricity and other basic amenities are an important measure of development. Improving the quality and access to electricity, water supply and sanitation are essential for social and economic growth, and employment creation. Comparison with the 2006 and previous censuses is possible because the former censuses included questions on dwelling amenities.

#### Water supply

According to the 2011 Census, "own rain water" is the most common source of water supply and accounts for 97 percent of occupied dwellings, and the remaining 3 percent of occupied dwellings reported their main source of water supply was own ground water.




Figure 2.28: Occupied Dwellings by Source of Water Supply

#### Source of Sewage Disposal

According to the 2011 Census, 79 percent of occupied private dwellings have septic tanks as the major source of sewage disposal, while 12 percent of occupied dwellings reported to being connected to the Water Assurance Scheme<sup>11</sup>. 7 percent of occupied dwellings, comprising of occupied tourist and accommodation units did not state the source of sewage disposal and presumably occupants did not know.




Figure 2.29: Occupied Dwellings by Sewage Disposal

#### Other Dwelling Amenities

Overall, 92 percent of occupied private dwellings use electricity as the major source of lighting. At the time of the 2011 Census, more than 90 percent of occupied dwellings relied on gas for cooking, while more than half of the occupied private dwellings use solar as the major source of water heating. The question asked in the 2011 Census does not clearly identify all those households that benefit from solar panels that power day time domestic electrical appliances.

# Vehicle Registration




Figure 2.30: Distribution of Vehicles by Vehicle Registration status

The 2011 Census recorded 1,992 vehicles on Norfolk Island on census night. Of the total number of vehicles, 90.5 percent (n=1,803) were owned by occupied private dwellings and 9.5 percent (n=189) of vehicles were owned by occupied tourist accommodation dwellings. The 2011 Census further recorded that of the vehicles that were owned by occupied private dwellings 77 percent were registered and 13 percent were unregistered (*figure 2.30*)

#### Internet Accessibility

Unlike the previous censuses, the 2011 Census asked a question on whether the dwelling can access internet connection. 76 percent of occupied private dwellings reported that they had broadband connection, 18 percent of occupied private dwellings had no internet connection and 6 percent of occupied private dwellings had dial up connection (Figure 2.31).

Consensus to retaining and storage of 2011 Census Form




Figure 2.32: Distribution of Ordinarily Resident Population by agreement to storage of 2011 Census

For the first time in a Norfolk Island Census, a question asked of householders if they will agree to the information they provide being stored and made publicly available after 99 years. Answering this question was optional. Figure 2.32 reveals that 50 percent of ordinarily resident population agreed to have their information stored and be made available after 99 years, 20 percent of ordinarily population did not agree to have their information stored and 30 percent of ordinarily resident population did "not state" whether to agree or disagree having their census forms stored.

# Part 3. Table Specifications and Basic Tables

#### 3.1. Introduction

The basic tables included in this report represent the 2011 Census of Norfolk Island. Although the tables can be used by a wider audience, they are specifically meant for users with some statistical background, such as planners, researchers, specialists and interest groups.

The basic table contains 51 tables distributed over 6 thematic groups:

- 1. General population characteristics
- 2. Social characteristics
- 3. Migration characteristics
- 4. Disability and Education
- 5. Economic activities
- 6. Household and housing amenities

The tables are grouped per theme rather than by unit of enumeration (person, household, dwelling, and building) as this better suit the average user who will be looking for information about a specific topic irrespective of the unit of enumeration.

The tables are further divided by population groups that are by total population which includes all ordinarily residents and visitors, by Norfolk Island population, excluding visitors and by visitors' population, excluding ordinarily residents. Since the focus is on

#### 3.2. Technical notes on basic tables

#### 3.2.1. General technical notes

The information presented in the basic tables refers to the population as enumerated on 2011 Census night of Tuesday, 9<sup>th</sup> August 2011.

Almost without exception, the figures in the tables represent *absolute numbers*. Percentage figures and other data manipulations are usually not included, so as to save space and keep the volume manageable, and because they usually depend on specific preferences of users.

All table titles are in a standard format in order to maintain consistency throughout. All tables start with a table number. This number is composed of a 'B' (for 'Basic table'), the thematic group number and the sequence number within the thematic group.

Sometimes it would be noted that population differ between tables according to the age groups selected. This reflects either the fact that certain information is only available for persons above a certain age limit or the fact that certain information is only meaningful or relevant for certain age ranges.

Many tables are too large to fit on one page and are therefore continued on subsequent pages. In these cases, the title and the headings are repeated on each subsequent page (with the abbreviation 'cont.' for 'continued from the previous page' added to the title), while the stubs continue to change.

Most variables include a category 'not stated'. This category contains cases in which respondents did not give an answer, and cases where information was missing or not reported. . Empty table cells are represented with a dash ('-') rather than a zero ('0'), which enhances readability of the table.

### 3.2.2. Specific technical notes

### **Group 1: General population characteristics**

B1.01 Like all other tables, B1.01 reflects the situation as found on midnight on the night of Tuesday, 9<sup>th</sup> August 2011 and annual growth rates between censuses are calculated accordingly.

#### **Group 2: Social characteristics**

Relationship to head of household. Often included in most census and reflects an interest in household composition

Religion. Religion may refer to any religion.

## **Group 3: Immigration characteristics**

Country of citizenship and country of birth. The classification of countries of citizenship and countries of birth was based on previous census but with slight adjustments.

*Place of birth.* The information given for place of birth refers to the place the person was born.

*Place of usual residence*. The usual place of residence is the place where a person usually resided. For people who moved around a lot, it refers to the place where they had spent most time in the last half-year.

#### **Group 4: Disability characteristics**

Disability. Disabled people are people with a physical or mental disorder who are limited in the kind or number of activities that they can perform because of the disorder and who will not recover within a limited period. The categories distinguished in the tables follow descriptions specified in the Australian 2011 census questionnaire, hence were not in previous censuses of Norfolk Island.

#### **Group 5: Economic characteristics**

Highest level of education: This refers to the highest level of education completed and or achieved.

Activity status: A person's activity status states whether or not he or she was involved in paid or unpaid work in the week before enumeration. People who were temporarily not active because of illness, holiday, special leave or a big celebration are included in the active population. With respect to paid work, those who were not working in the week before enumeration, but who were seeking paid work are also included in the active population. In this respect the economically active population is equivalent to the labour force.

For people engaged in different types of paid work during the week before enumeration, information about employment status, industry, paid occupation and hours worked for pay refer to the type of paid work on which people spent most time. For people engaged in different types of unpaid work during the week before enumeration, information about unpaid activity refers to

the (unpaid) activity on which people spent most time. However, information about hours spent on unpaid work in the week before enumeration refer to the time spent on all unpaid activities combined.

*Employment status*. Employment status refers to the work arrangement under which a person working for pay carries out his or her activities.

*Industry*. Industry refers to the major activity of the establishment involved in the production of goods or services, for which the respondent was working in the week preceding enumeration (or would have been working if not temporarily absent because of illness, holiday, special leave or a big celebration). Classification of industries follows the UN International Standard Industrial Classification of all economic activities (ISIC), but slightly adjusted to industries specific to Norfolk Island and further to maintain consistency to 2006 Census.

Occupation. Occupation refers to the kind of work done in the week preceding enumeration (or work that would have been done if the respondent was not temporarily absent because of illness, holiday, special leave or a big celebration). Classification of occupations follows the ILO International Standard Classifications of Occupations (ISCO-88) which was again slightly adjusted to occupations specific to the Norfolk Island and maintaining consistency to 2006 Census

*Paid work.* The Norfolk Island 2011 Census defines paid work as any type of work for which the worker received pay, either in money or in kind.

*Unpaid work*. In the Norfolk Island 2011 Census, unpaid work is defined as any type of work through which persons supply labour for the production of economic goods and services and for which they received no pay, either in money or kind.

# **Group 6: Housing characteristics and Amenities**

Building. The term 'building' refers to a construction with a roof and walls. It may be a shed, a shop, a factory, a house or a combination of these. Buildings included in the census tables may include vacant houses – but not abandoned houses – and also factories, shops, sheds, etc. as long as these are also used to house people.

*Dwelling.* A dwelling refers to the living space occupied by a household. A dwelling is considered permanent if it is well-planned and is mainly made of durable materials (like concrete, corrugated iron, fibro or timber) with a sound foundation. Dwelling in the census tables may also include unoccupied and vacant houses

A dwelling may refer to a part of a house that is occupied by a household (with sometimes other parts of the house – or dwellings – occupied by other households). A dwelling may also be part of a building, for instance in the case of a flat.

*Room.* Rooms include bedrooms, (open) living rooms, lounge rooms, dining rooms, (separate) kitchens, studies or working rooms as long as they are large enough to contain a large bed. Passageways, bathrooms, storerooms and toilet rooms are not included as rooms.



#### Annex IV

#### **Concepts and Definitions**

**Activity status** identifies the activities a person was engaged in during the week before enumeration, including paid work, unpaid work or neither;

**Age-sex structure**: The composition of a population as determined by the number or proportion of males and females in each age category.

**Dependency ratio** is the number of persons under 15 and over 60 per 100 persons aged 15-59;

**Disability** is an umbrella term for impairments, activity limitations or participation restrictions, which respectively refer to problems an individual may have with physiological functions of the body system, including psychological functions ('body function') or problems with anatomical parts of the body such as organs, limbs and their components ('body structure') (impairments), difficulties an individual may have in executing activities ('activity limitations') and problems an individual may experience in involvement in life situations (participation restrictions).

**Employment status** refers to the work arrangement under which a person working for pay carries out his or her activities;

**Growth Rate**: The number of persons added to (or subtracted from) a population in a year due to natural increase and net migration expressed as a percentage of the population at the beginning of the time period

**Industry** refers to the main activity of the establishment employing a worker;

**Labour force** includes all persons doing paid work or looking for paid work;

Natural growth is the difference between the number of births and deaths in a population;

**Occupation** refers to the kind of work done in the week before enumeration (e.g. primary school teacher, labourer et cetera);

**Paid work** is any type of work for which the worker received pay, either in money or in kind;

**Permanent dwelling** is the type of dwelling that is well-planned and is mainly made of durable materials (e.g. concrete, corrugated iron, fibro or timber) with a sound foundation;

**Population Projection**: Computation of future changes in population numbers, given certain assumptions about future trends in the rates of fertility, mortality, and migration

**Rate**: A ratio between events having occurred in a population during a year and the number of persons in a population in the middle of the year. When the events are observed over a period shorter or longer than a year their number is multiplied or divided by the appropriate factor so as to preserve the rate's annual dimension

**Sex ratio** is the proportion of males to females in a population, expressed as the number of males per hundred females;

**Unpaid work** is any type of work for the production of economic goods and services for which a person received no pay, either in money or in kind.
