By Mr. Scaccia of Boston, for the committee on Rules and the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently, that Joint Rule 12 be suspended on the following petitions:

Petition (accompanied by bill) of Ronald Mariano and Andrea F. Nuciforo. Jr., relative to home service contracts under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Insurance. To the committee on Financial Services.

Petition (accompanied by bill) of John J. Binienda and others relative to the payment of certain tax title charges by owners of condominiums. To the committee on Revenue.

Petition (accompanied by bill) of James E. Vallee for legislation to designate a certain bridge on Route 140 in the town of Franklin as the Lance Corporal Shavne Cabino Bridge. To the committee on Transportation.

Referred, under Joint Rule 29, to the committees on Rules of the two branches, acting concurrently.

Subsequently Mr. Scaccia of Boston, for said committees, reported, asking to be discharged from further consideration of the order: and recommending that the same be referred to the House committee on Rules. Under Rule 42, the report was considered forthwith; and it was accepted.

By Mr. Mariano of Ouincy, for the committee on Financial Services, on a petition, a Bill relative to health insurance premiums (House, No. 2985). Read; and referred under Joint Rule 1E, to the committee on Health Care Financing.

By Mr. Murphy of Lowell, for the committee on Higher Educa- Campus tion, that the recommitted Bill establishing a campus rape and sexual rape prevention assault advisory council (Senate, No. 2460) ought to pass with an arcil. amendment by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the text contained in House document numbered 4969. Referred, under Rule 33, to the committee on Ways and Means with the amendment pending.

By Mrs. Walrath of Stow, for the committee on Health Care Nurses, staffing. Financing, that the Bill relative to patient safety (House, No. 4965) ought to pass [Estimated Cost: \$3,092,634.00 to \$6,773,809.00] [Senators Moore and Brown dissenting]. Referred, under Rule 33, to the committee on Ways and Means.
