

COMMENTS:

This hill overlooks the site of Tousey Town where there was once a store, warehouse, and a horse-powered ferry operated by Moses Tousey (rhymes with How-zee). Fine Boone County products such as hemp, pork, flour, and tobacco were brought to the warehouse where they were inspected before shipment to the lower reaches of the river. The town existed but a few years as it was overshadowed by Lawrenceburg, Indiana and Petersburg, Kentucky. Many of the gravestones found here are quite elaborate.

Albert G. Porter, whose ancestors are buried in the above cemetery became governor of Indiana. He worked on the ferry here when his father was the proprietor.
