Some people believe Shakespeare's plays were heavily influenced by his own life. As you watch the video segments from *Shakespeare Uncovered*, use the chart below to collect examples of how Shakespeare's own life may have influenced his plays.

Events from Shakespeare's life	How they may have affected his plays
Shakespeare was the father to twins, Hamnet and Judith.	Shakespeare uses twins for comedic effect in his plays, like The Comedy of Errors and Twelfth Night.
	The twins in Twelfth Night, like his own, were a boy and a girl.
Shakespeare's son Hamnet died at age eleven.	The loss of a brother is a central theme in Twelfth Night - the girl twin believes her brother is lost, and that loss is central to the mood of the play. At the end of Twelfth Night, the brother and sister are reunited. Shakespeare might have been fulfilling his wish in his play.
Shakespeare's daughter Judith became engaged to a man who had made another woman pregnant.	The Tempest shows a father testing a man to see if he is suitable for his daughter.
