

Auf den Rängen 75000 Zuschauer, 22 Spieler im Bemühen, notfalls mit List und Tücke zum Erfolg zu kommen, am Rand des Spielfelds eine laute Bank mit Coach, Pflegern und Ersatzleuten – das ist das »feindliche« Umfeld, in dem der Schiedsrichter seine Entscheidungen fällen muß. Es gibt keine vergleichbare Aufgabe mit jener eines Schiedsrichters, der in extremen Drucksituationen innerhalb von Bruchteilen von Sekunden mehr oder weniger folgenschwere Entscheide fällen muß.

In Italien standen Schieds- und Linienrichter mehr denn je im Brennpunkt der Kritik. Eine der Ursachen dafür waren die Fernseh-Monitore, welche die FIFA und das lokale Organisationskomitee als Arbeitshilfe für die Pressevertreter auf den Medienrängen installieren ließ. Das hatte zur Folge, daß die Journalisten gleich an Ort und

Stelle mit Hilfe von Zeitlupenwiederholungen und technischen Analysen der staatlichen TV-Anstalt RAI über die Entscheide der Spielleitung richten konnte. Ohne Monitore hätten die Berichterstatter der Presse weniger gesehen als die Schieds- und Linienrichter. Die Kritik an deren Leistungen hätte milder ausfallen müssen.

Teils war die Kritik berechtigt, teils artete sie in Polemik aus. Es sollen an dieser Stelle die Leistungen der 41 Schieds- und Linienrichter nicht analysiert, sondern sachlich auf objektive Probleme hingewiesen werden, mit denen sich die FIFA auf dem Gebiet der Spielleitung auseinandersetzen muß.

□ Eine »Unité de doctrine«, eine einheitliche Regelauslegung, konnte für 36 Schiedsrichter aus 34 Ländern (fünf Italiener kamen zusätzlich nur als Linienrichter zum Einsatz) in der verfügbaren Zeit der Ausbildung und Instruktion nicht erreicht werden. Diese Aufgabe gehört weiterhin zu den größten Problemen der Schiedsrichterausbildung und muß in Zukunft mit neuen Mitteln angefaßt werden.

□ Im Weltfußball muß der Ausbildung der Linienrichter mehr Aufmerksamkeit gewidmet werden. Die Aufgaben von Schieds- und Linienrichter sind zu verschieden, als daß sie in großen Turnieren von den gleichen Personen gelöst werden können. Es gilt, nebst dem traditionellen Schiedsrichter in Zukunft auch den spezialisierten Linienrichter heranzubilden. Gleichzeitig müssen sowohl Schieds- als auch Linienrichter nebst sportlichen auch minimalen sprachlichen Anforderungen genügen. Das

Beherrschen einer universalen Sprache, vor allem des Englischen, muß zum Handwerkszeug eines Spielleiters gehören.

□ Der Schiedsrichter ist bei großen Spielen der einzige Amateur unter Professionals. Unter diesen Voraussetzungen besitzt er für das Bewältigen seiner Aufgabe keinesfalls ideale Voraussetzungen. Die finanzielle Komponente ist dabei nur einer von mehreren Aspekten: Training, Körperpflege, Regeneration, Ernährung, psychische Fitness sind weitere Faktoren, die ein moderner Spielleiter nur unter verbesserten Bedingungen fachgerecht berücksichtigen kann. Das Schiedsrichtertum muß an der Spitze Abschied vom reinen Amateur nehmen und sich in Richtung Professionalisierung wenden.

□ Dazu gehört auch die Verjüngung der Schiedsrichterkader. Die athletischen Anforderungen an die Spielleiter können nicht hoch genug eingeschätzt werden. Die Wechselwirkung von athletischer Belastungsfähigkeit und mentaler Stärke liegt auf der Hand. Ein Schiedsrichter sollte seine schwierigsten Spiele in einem Alter leiten, da er körperlich und psychisch zu Höchstleistungen fähig ist. Ein Spitzenschiedsrichter ist zugleich auch Spitzensportler. Das hat zur Konsequenz, daß die Teilnahme an einer FIFA-Weltmeisterschaft nicht mehr ohne weiteres als Karriereabschluß geplant werden soll. Karrierehöhepunkt ja, aber zu einem früheren Zeitpunkt – das müßte das Ziel der zukünftigen Spielleiter-Generation sein. Nicht technische Hilfsmittel wie der Beizug von Video-Aufnahmen schaffen bessere Schiedsrichter, sondern vielmehr die erhöhte fachliche Kompetenz. Diese wiederum hängt von der Persönlichkeit des Schieds- und Linienrichters ab, die im modernen Spitzensport nur durch Eröffnen neuer Perspektiven in der erforderlichen Qualität heran- gebildet werden kann.

unfair spirit than normal but rather a reflection of the fact that the referees were instructed, in the course of training seminars prior to the kick-off of competition, to protect the play-

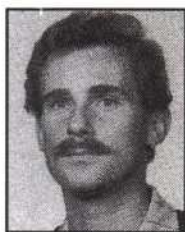
ers better and to come down hard on dangerous tackles.

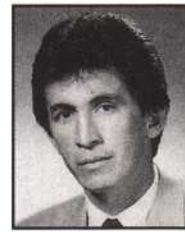

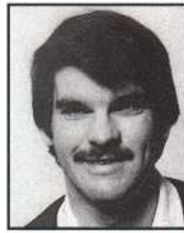

In addition to the list of goal scorers it is also interesting to compile a table relating to the players who set up the goals. It is of course difficult to establish objective criteria for the allocation of assist points since successful finishing is often the

outcome of a series of connected moves. We would therefore like to briefly elucidate the criteria which we have employed in the allocation of assist points.

1. The player who was the last to pass to the eventual goal-scorer receives an assist point.
2. In the event that the penultimate pass may have decisively influenced the play leading up to the goal, the player who executed this pass

may also be allocated an assist point.

3. The player whose shot led to the rebound that enabled the goalscorer to successfully complete the action was also granted an assist point.

4. Where goals resulting from penalties are concerned, the player who is fouled in the area receives an assist point (unless, that is, the player who is fouled subsequently executes the penalty himself.)
5. For goals which are the result of solo efforts (dribbling runs, etc.) no assist points are given.

6. No assist point is allocated in those cases where a goal is scored as the result of a mistake made by the opposing team.

Penalties with as little risk as possible: The numerous penalties which were awarded during the World Cup final rounds provide the opportunity for an analysis of the way in which they were taken. The respect of the player who places the ball on the penalty-spot for the reflexes of the keeper has obviously increased. Almost all the penalties taken were belted with full force. The times when players attempted to deceive the goalkeeper by sending him the wrong way and then just gently placing the ball in the net are over. The goalkeepers neither let themselves be duped nor do they just blindly leap in one direction; they await their chance with a heightened degree of alertness ready for reflex action. Both Diego Maradona (Argentina) and Michal Bilek (Czechoslovakia) discovered this to their great sorrow, as they saw their gently placed penalties against Yugoslavia (Goycochea) and the U.S.A. (Meola) saved.

Italy did not become World Champion but the football-crazy nation found a new hero at the "Mondiale". Salvatore "Toto" Schillaci thrilled the masses with his six goals and seemed destined to shoot Azeglio Vicini's team into the final. Italy's great dream was admittedly not fulfilled but Salvatore Schillaci managed to secure his place among the immortals of football.

Toto Schillaci like Paolo Rossi

The little Sicilian who started off on the substitutes' bench and then edged the established star Gianluca Vialli out of the team was not just top goal-scorer, he was also elected Best Player of the Tournament. As was the case where Paolo Rossi was concerned eight years previous in Spain, the two Adidas special trophies, the "Golden Ball" (for the best player) and the "Golden Shoe" (for the top goal-scorer), went to one and the same person. The Best Player was elected by the sports journalists present at the World Cup.

Advertisement for football and for fair play

England was one of the positive surprises of the World Championships. After the group games in Cagliari, Bobby Robson's team steadily improved and produced several games which were among the best in the tournament. In the process, England displayed the characteristics typical of British football: untiring effort and exemplary fair play. And so it was no fluke that England won the official FIFA Fair Play competition (Sport-Billy Trophy) – ahead of Italy by the way. The scenes after the third place play-off when English and Italian players fraternized as they took their leave of the World Championships before 52,000 spectators fitted this picture very well.

Giacinto Facchetti, vor zwanzig Jahren standen Sie in Mexiko mit Italien im Endspiel. Welche Vergleiche ziehen Sie zur jetzigen WM, die Sie als Mitorganisator und Zuschauer verfolgen?

Nun ja, wenn man wie ich an einer Weltmeisterschaft wie derjenigen 1970 in Mexiko als Spieler vom Anfang bis zum Schluß miterlebt hat, stellt man an jeder darauffolgenden WM spontane Vergleiche an. Natürlich ist in der Erinnerung alles schöner, aber ich glaube dennoch, die Stilarten verschiedener Mannschaften einigermaßen objektiv bewerten zu können.

Am augenfälligsten sind für mich die Unterschiede in punkto Mentalität und der sich daraus ergebenden taktischen Verhaltensweisen der Teams. In Mexiko herrschte noch eine »offensive« Einstellung vor. Kaum befand sich eine Mannschaft in Ballbesitz, suchte sie resolut den Weg zum Tor. Hier in Italien ist das nicht so. Die Mannschaften kommen mit einer defensiven Grundeinstellung auf das Feld. Die Verantwortlichen richten ihr Augenmerk in erster Linie auf die Stärkung der Abwehr und des Mittelfelds und nominieren eine, höchstens zwei Sturmspitzen, die praktisch auf sich allein gestellt sind.

Ihr damaliger Finalgegner Brasilien wird ja häufig in diesem Zusammenhang als negatives Beispiel genannt. Sebastiao Lazaroni wurde vorgeworfen, mit seinem Defensivkonzept den brasilianischen Fußball verraten zu haben.

»ES HAT EIN VÖLLIGER WERTEWANDEL STATTGEFUNDEN«

Interview mit dem früheren italienischen Internationalen Giacinto Facchetti



Es hat ein völliger Wandel der Werte stattgefunden, und Brasilien versinnbildlicht ihn geradezu. In Mexiko stürmte eine Angriffsreihe bestehend aus Jairzinho, Tostao, Gerson, Pelé und Rivelino; alles Spieler, die fähig waren, Tore zu schießen. Zudem stießen die Verteidiger und Mittelfeldspieler häufig vor und gaben ihnen so noch zusätzliche Unterstützung. In Turin hat man nun eine ganz andere Elf am Werk gesehen. Nicht nur war die Abwehr mit einem »Liberò« verstärkt worden, auch das Mittelfeld hatte Zuwachs erhalten. Vorne blieben einzig Müller und Careca, die zu keiner Zeit auf Un-

terstützung hoffen konnten. Zu sehr waren ihre Kollegen darauf bedacht, ja keinen Gegentreffer zu erhalten.

Es überrascht, diese Kritik gerade aus Ihrem Mund zu hören. Italien war und ist doch bekannt für seine defensiv spielenden Mannschaften?

Das stimmt. Aber hier an dieser WM hat selbst Italien, das man zeitweise mit Recht als »Könige« des defensiven Spiels bezeichnen durfte, ein besseres Gleichgewicht zwischen Verteidigung und Angriff gefunden. Angetrieben von den eigenen Fans, hat unsere Elf häufig angegriffen und sich nebst der BR Deutschland und der Tschechoslowakei am meisten Abschlußmöglichkeiten erarbeitet.

Haben Sie auch Fortschritte gesehen?

Positiv überrascht haben mich die bemerkenswerten Fortschritte der afrikanischen Vertreter. Mit ihrer hochstehenden, individuellen Technik und ihrem taktischen Können gepaart mit der bekannt guten physischen Voraussetzungen haben Kamerun und Ägypten gezeigt, wie nahe die afrikanischen Mannschaften an die traditionellen Fußballnationen herangerückt sind. Es fehlt ihnen einzig die Möglichkeit, regelmäßiger gegen starke Gegner zu spielen, wie dies die Europäer und Südamerikaner tun können. Sobald die Afrikaner vermehrt gegen Widersacher mit technisch und taktisch verschiedenen Spielsystemen antreten und aus den gemachten Erfahrungen lernen können, wird es schwierig sein, sie zu schlagen.

Einen großen Anteil an den Fortschritten des Schwarzen Kontinents darf die Technische Abteilung der FIFA für sich in Anspruch nehmen. Im Rahmen des von ihr geschaffenen Kursprogramms wurden in den vergangenen Jahren unzählige Kurse organisiert. Die von der FIFA gestellten Experten zahlreicher Verbände haben mit ihrem Wissen und ihrer Erfahrung mitgeholfen, das vorhandene Potential auszuschöpfen und die Fortschritte, wie sie bei Italia '90 deutlich wurden, zu erzielen.

In Italien auf sich allein gestellt: Brasiliens Careca, der außer im ersten Spiel gegen Schweden in keiner Phase des Turniers seinem Ruf als Goalgetter gerecht werden konnte.

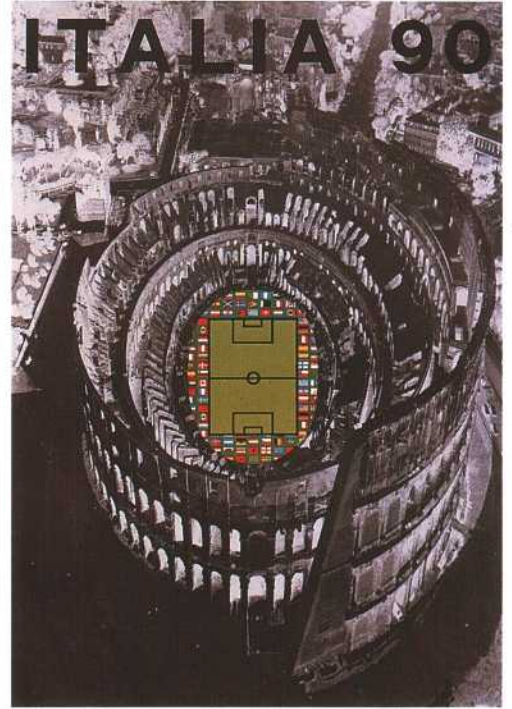
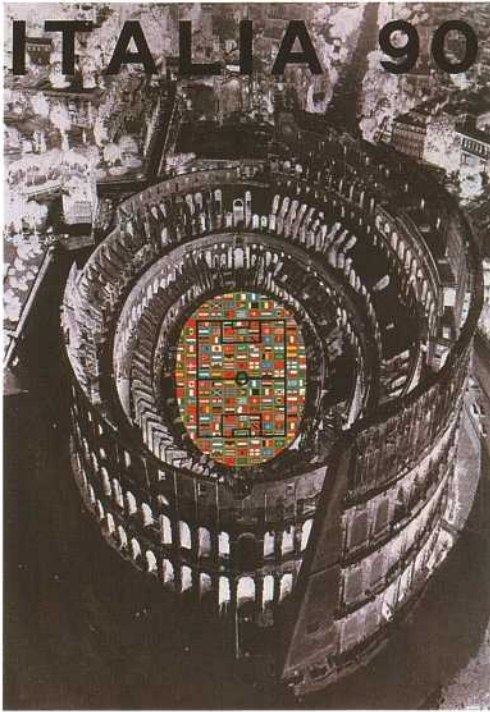

Bei der Weltmeisterschaft in Italien wurde die Fairplay-Kampagne der FIFA einer ersten großen Bewährungsprobe unterstellt.

Zwei Jahre lang hatte der Weltverband den Slogan »Fair play, please!« in Zusammenarbeit mit zahlreichen Landesverbänden verbreitet und propagiert. Die einfache, aber klare Botschaft sollte nicht nur auf dem Rasen, sondern im gesamten Umfeld des Fußballs und wenn möglich darüber hinaus Beachtung finden. Angesprochen waren nicht zuletzt die Fans, deren Verhalten in der jüngsten Vergangenheit so manchen Schatzen auf diesen Sport warf. Durch die Fair-Play-Fahne, die vor jedem Spiel von den Balljungen aufs Feld getragen worden ist, wurde während eines Monats fast täglich an dieses

sportliche Ideal erinnert. Entsprechende Instruktionen hatten die Mannschaften bereits bei einem Informations-Seminar drei Monate vor Turnierbeginn und erneut vor den ersten Einsätzen erhalten. Was blieb davon in der Schlußbilanz übrig? Wurden die Fairplay-Appelle auch in die Tat umgesetzt, oder blieb die Aktion in der guten Absicht stecken? 16 Feldverweise und 163 Verwarnungen – so lautet das disziplinarische Fazit aus 52 Spielen, und erstmals mußte ein Schiedsrichter in einem Endspiel zur roten Karte greifen. Rein zahlenmäßig ist das ein unerfreulicher Rekord und keine schöne Bilanz. Wie so manche statistische Angabe erfordern diese Zahlen allerdings eine Interpretation. Aufgrund der klaren Instruktionen an die Schiedsrichter, die Regeln so streng wie nie zuvor zu interpretieren, lag die Reizschwelle für Verwarnungen und Feldverweise sehr tief. Wo früher ein Pfiff des Schiedsrichters oder allenfalls eine Ermahnung genügte, griffen die Spielleiter nun zur gelben Karte. Entsprechend wurden Spieler nicht erst ausgeschlossen, wenn sie sehr grobe Fouls oder Tätlichkeiten begingen, sondern bereits bei wiederholtem Foulspiel oder

nach harten Attacken in die Beine des Gegners. Die Folge dieser Maßnahmen waren zwar eine noch nie gesehene Flut von gelben und roten Karten, aber – so paradox dies klingen mag – auch eine gegenüber früheren Turnieren viel fairere Spielweise.

Der Respekt vor den Maßnahmen des Schiedsrichters führte zu bedeutend weniger harten Attacken im Zweikampf und hatte die erfreuliche Konsequenz, daß im gesamten WM-Turnier kein einziger Spieler wegen einer Verletzung als Folge einer unkorrekten Attacke ausscheiden mußte. Bedauerlicherweise ist diese Feststellung

in der teilweise polemischen Kritik an der Spielleitung untergegangen.

Erfreulich waren auch die zahlreichen Gesten des Fairplay unter Spielern und Trainern. Es gab wohl kaum einmal zuvor ein WM-Turnier, an dem derart viele Shake hands und andere versöhnliche Gesten unter den Spielern festzustellen waren wie in Italien. Daß die Disziplinarkommission der FIFA nur einen einzigen der ausgeschlossenen Spieler mit mehr als einer Sperre (Frank Rijkaard) belegen mußte, beweist ebenfalls, daß unrühmliche Zwischenfälle, wie sie in früheren Turnieren immer wieder vorkamen, in Italien ausgeblieben sind.

In dieses Gesamtbild paßt, daß die englische Nationalmannschaft, die in gewohnter Härte, aber mit dem ebenso bekannten britischen Fairplay spielte, den Fairplay-Preis gewann. Und geradezu exemplarisch für den gestiegenen Respekt unter den Spielern waren im Final die Zweikämpfe zwischen Diego Maradona und Guido Buchwald, die trotz des restlosen Einsatzes beider Spieler nicht nur korrekt ausgetragen wurden, sondern auch mit Gesten der sportlichen Versöhnung endeten.

Das sind ermutigende Fakten. Fairplay war bei ITALIA 90 wirklich mehr als nur ein Schlagwort.



The Fair Play Campaign was not just a mere matter of discussion it was also put into practice on the field. In spite of the enormous pressures weighing on them, the players but rarely lost respect for each other. In the photo above, the Englishman

McMahon is seen helping Schillaci to his feet again after a hard tackle. The gesture of reconciliation between Maradona and Buchwald (No. 6) proves that fair play in Italy was really more than just an empty slogan (see below).

**Billy Bingham
(Northern Ireland)**

Born on 5 August 1931. Played amongst other clubs for Sunderland, Everton and Luton Town. Bingham began his coaching career with Linfield. Following this he became coach of the Greek national team. With various stops on the way (including a spell at Everton) he once again for the second time after 1967 took over the Northern Irish side and qualified with them for both the 1982 and 1986 World Cups. His first commission in the framework of the Technical Study Group was in 1983 on the occasion of the WYC in Mexico.



**Dettmar Cramer
(Federal Rep. of Germany)**

Born on 4. 4. 1925. He worked with West German coaches Sepp Herberger and Helmut Schön, helping to prepare the

national team for the World Cups from 1954 and 1966. Coach with Bayern Munich (European Cup Winners in 1975 and 1976, Intercontinental Cup Winner 1976), Eintracht Frankfurt and Bayer Leverkusen, national coach of Japan and the USA. As FIFA instructor and technical adviser, Dettmar Cramer has travelled to over 70 countries. The first time he functioned as a member of the FIFA Technical Study Group was at the 1970 World Cup in Mexico.



**René Hüsey
(Switzerland)**

Born on 19 October 1928. He played for the Grasshopper-Club in Zurich and for Lausanne Sports. During his coaching career he had spells with FC Winterthur and his old club the Grasshopper-Club in Zurich (Swiss League Champions in 1971) before taking over the Swiss national team in 1973. René Hüsey worked as a FIFA instructor on various FIFA/Coca-Cola Development Programmes before being elected a member of the FIFA Technical Committee in 1988. He was first nominated to the Technical Study Group at the 1982 World Cup in Spain.



**Sepp Piontek
(Federal Rep. of Germany)**

Sepp Piontek (46) began his playing career with Germania Leer. Later he played 203 league games for Werder Bremen. He played six times in the

German national team. His coaching career took him via his first club, Fortuna Düsseldorf, the national squad of Haiti, and St. Pauli, to the position of national coach of the Danish team in 1979. In 1984 at the European Championships in France and in 1986 at the World Cup in Mexico, the football world took great pleasure in the refreshing attacking football played by the Danish national side. After his first ever nomination to the Technical Study Group for the 1990 World Cup in Italy, he will commence work as coach of the Turkish national side.



**Carlos Queiroz
(Portugal)**

Born on 1. 3. 1953. Coach of the Portuguese youth and junior national teams. In Saudi Arabia in 1989 he won the FIFA/Coca-Cola Cup with his team and in the same year finished third in Scotland at the FIFA Under-16 World Tournament. Carlos Queiroz was nominated for the first time to the Technical Study Group for the 1990 FIFA World Cup in Italy.



**Oswaldo Ramirez Salcedo
(Peru)**

Born on 28 March 1947. He played with various Peruvian, Venezuelan and Mexican clubs. In the course of his career he won national championship titles twice with both Universitaria Deportes and Sporting Cristal (Peru). Ramirez played for his country from 1968 to 1981 (World Cup participation in Mexico in 1970).

After ending his playing career he was elected to the Executive Committee of CONMEBOL and took over the presidency of his former club Sporting Cristal de Lima. Oswaldo Ramirez has been a member of the FIFA Technical Committee since 1986. 1990 in Italy was the first time he worked for the FIFA Technical Study Group.



**Ivan Toplak
(Yugoslavia)**

Born on 21 September 1931. His twelve year long playing career led him to Olympia Ljubljana and Red Star Belgrade. He was also nominated to play for his country on 20 occasions. As coach he watched over the fortunes of Red Star Belgrade from 1962-66 before working with various clubs in the United States. He had repeated spells as Yugoslavian national coach. In 1982, for example, he took the Yugoslavian team to the World Cup in Spain. Ivan Toplak has been a FIFA instructor since 1977 and has conducted courses in this capacity all over the world. His first nomination as a member of the Technical Study Group dates back to the 1986 World Cup in Mexico.
