Basics of the Brigade

- 1 attending doctor, 1 nurse practitioner, 9 residents, 1 social worker
- Collaboration between the University of Rochester and the First Unitarian Church
- Duration: 2 weeks
- Location: San Jose, San Marcos de la Sierra, Honduras
- Projects: latrine and cookstove construction, microfinance loans, fish farm building, clinic access, pharmaceutical distribution, improved access to clean water, middle school scholarships, curriculum development and instruction, tutoring program, English teaching

A Bit of Background Information...

- Rural community; houses mostly accessible by foot
- 3000 people living in the 7 communities of San Jose
- Individuals live on approximately \$1/day
- Subsistence farmers
- Lenca Indian
- High illiteracy rate
- Generally quiet demeanor
- Hard-working men and women
- 2 seasons each year: wet and dry
- VERY hilly!



How Did Kirsten Occupy Her Time? (During this Brigade!)



School Curriculum Teaching Sessions: Cuentos de Creación

- Completed in 5 elementary schools:
 - San Jose Centro
 - Portillon
 - Guanacaste
 - Potreros
 - El Horno
- With ~130 students in the 4th, 5th, and 6th grades







- Mayan Cuento de Creación (creation tale) read aloud and masks developed based on characters
- Students utilized various supplies (paper plates, crayons, feathers, yarn, googly eyes, etc.) to create unique "mascaras"
- Some masks were collected and brought back to Rochester

6th Grade Scholarship Applications

- Meeting for 6th grade scholarship applicants
- 30 students attended
- Representation from all 5 elementary school









- Topics of meeting:
 - How scholarship recipients are chosen
 - Where funds come from
 - What funds are used for
 - When/how selected students will be announced

- Necessary paperwork:
 - Student applications
 - Parent financial information forms
 - Grades/recommendations from teachers

Scholarships for Colegio

- Meeting held for 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th grade scholarship recipients
- Paperwork collected and questions answered
- 13 students and respective parents attended





Later in the Day/Week, Kirsten...

- Talked with current 9th grade students about plans and budget proposals for next year
- Received educational plans and budget proposals for three of the four 9th grade students

Tutoring Program for Scholarship Recipients

- Meeting with Santa Froglan (tutor for scholarship recipients)
 - Educational progress of students
 - Location of sessions
 - Attendance sheets
 - Sessions run from 8 am to 1 pm on Saturdays
- School materials provided for future tutoring sessions

English Teaching Session with Guanacaste School Teachers

- Held with three teachers from the Guanacaste elementary school
- Kirsten and Jen taught for 1.5 hours
- Worked on vocabulary, pronunciation, and sentence structure
- English vocabulary focused on family words and household items
