ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to amend the *Municipalities' Advances Act 1895.*"

"An Act to indemnify the Councillors of various Municipalities for Borrowing Moneys by Overdrafts on Bankers for the purposes of their Municipalities contrary to the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* and for other purposes."

"An Act to subsidize and enable Companies to further develop Gold Mining and for other purposes."

REGULATIONS BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC HEALTH UNDER THE FACTORIES
AND SHOPS ACTS.

THE BOARD OF PUBLIC HEALTH in and for the Colony of Victoria, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. Every person who is in occupation of any office, building, or place which is about to become for the first time, or after a period of disuse is about to again become a factory or work-room, shall, before the same is used or again used as such, forward to the Council for the district full particulars as to such office, building, or place in the following form, namely:—

2. No building or place shall be approved as a factory or work-room unless proper means be adopted to the satisfaction of the Council for the prevention and extinction of fire, and for the escape of the inmates in the event of fire occurring.

3. No building or place shall be approved in which it is proposed to employ a greater number of persons than one person for every four hundred (400) cubic feet of space below the level of thirteen (13) feet above the floor of any of the rooms.

4. No building or place shall be approved unless the work-room be provided with means and appliances for efficiently warming the same when such means and appliances are considered necessary by the Council.

5. No building or place shall be approved unless, in the absence of an approved system of artificial ventilation, each work-room be provided with means of ventilation by openings for the inlet and outlet of air in the proportion of not less than 12 square inches of inlet openings and 12 square inches of outlet openings for each person employed in such work-room; such space to be calculated exclusive of all bars, ornamentation, or other obstruction thereto. Such inlet openings shall be provided at the height of about 7 feet from the floor level by tubes, shafts, or hoppers in the external walls, external doors, or external windows, and shall be provided with means by which they may be readily closed and opened and by which they may be kept open; and such outlet openings shall be provided either in the walls of such room by externally hooded openings as close to the ceiling thereof as may be practicable, or else in the ceiling; and in the latter case there shall be connected with each such opening an open tube or shaft having a transverse area equal to that of the clear transverse area of such opening, and leading through and above the roof of the building, and having its upper end terminating in a cowl or other similar contrivance.

The provisions of this Regulation shall not, unless considered necessary by the Council, apply to a work-room in which there are a fire-place with chimney and a window made to open, and in which not more than four persons are to be employed.

If, in the opinion of the Officer of Health of the district, any of these provisions concerning ventilation is unnecessary or unsuitable for any particular building or place by reason of any special circumstances of the case, then such building or place may be approved of by the Council without such provision or provisions being carried out.

6. Every heating appliance in any work-room, whether used for warming for the persons there engaged or used in the manufacturing process, shall be provided with a flue of at least 4 inches diameter, and extending to the outer air to a point at least 8 feet above the appliance, and capped at the outer end by a fixed cowl.

7. No building or place in which females are to be employed shall be approved unless the factory or work-room be provided with properly-appointed lavatories, affording the means of free ablution for the females employed therein, in the proportion of at least one lavatory or basin for every twenty females employed. When considered necessary by the Council, properly-appointed lavatories, sufficient in number to provide the means of free ablution for the males employed, may also be ordered in any factory or work-room, in the proportion of at least one lavatory or basin for every twenty males employed.

8. No building or place shall be approved unless the factory or work-room be provided with proper closet accommodation in the proportion of one closet at least for every twenty persons employed therein; and where persons of different sexes are employed all such accommodation shall be separate for the sexes, and approaches thereto properly separated for the sexes shall be provided. Adequate urinal accommodation shall be provided for every factory or work-room in which four or more males are to be employed, and separate and distinct urinal accommodation for the use of the females employed may be ordered for every factory or work-room in which more than twenty females are to be employed. Provided that in factories and work-rooms in which the majority of those employed are to be of one sex, and not more than two are to be of the other sex, separate and distinct privy accommodation for the persons of different sexes shall not be required, if in the opinion of the Council the same is suitably provided in adjoining or adjacent premises.

9. No building or place in which any articles of wearing apparel (including boots) are prepared, or any article of food for human consumption is being manufactured, shall be approved as a factory or work-room unless all the walls, ceilings, passages, and privies have been recently limewashed, painted, or papered.

10. If in any building or place any manufacture is to be carried on of such a nature as to necessitate the females employed changing their dresses on entering or on leaving such factory or work-room, then such building or place shall not be approved unless the factory or work-room be provided with a suitable dressing-room for the use of the females employed therein.

11. The following rules respecting the materials and the construction of factory buildings are to be observed as far as possible in approving of the same :—

CLASS A.

Buildings for ham and bacon curing, fish-curing, meat-preserving, jam-making, fruit-preserving, and dairy-produce manufacturing, and such other trades.

The ceiling or roof to be not less than 12 feet in height; walls to be painted, plastered with smooth cement, or covered with other impervious material at least 6 feet in height above floor level, so as to be easily washed and cleaned. The ground floors to be imperviously paved, and all floors laid so as to drain into paved channels; the latter to be intercepted by deodorizing tanks when required by the Council. All yards to be either gravelled or paved, as may be required by the Council, and well drained.

CLASS B.

Buildings to be used as bakehouses or butchers' small goods houses.

The ceiling or wall plates to be not less than 12 feet in height. The roof of the bakehouse and of the small goods house to be lined if no ceiling has been provided. Bakehouses to be provided with floors or to be imperviously paved. Small goods houses to be imperviously paved and laid so as to drain into paved channels. All yards to be either gravelled or paved and well drained. No part of a manure receptacle, earth-closet, or privy to be within 12 feet of any building or room in which the making of bread or of small goods is carried on.

CLASS C.

Buildings for fellmongery, leather-dressing, tanning, parchment-making, and similar trades.

The ground floors to be imperviously paved, and laid to drain into paved channels intercepted by deodorizing tanks. All yards to be gravelled or paved and well drained.

CLASS D.

Buildings for soap and candle works, glue-making, bone and carcass boiling-down, bone-crushing, manufacture of artificial manures, and such like trades and works.

The roofs or ceilings to be not less than 15 feet in height. The floors to be imperviously paved, and laid so as to drain into paved channels intercepted by deodorizing tanks. Close boilers or covered vats only are to be used, from which pipes are to be fixed to convey the vapours and fumes through an effective disinfecting and deodorizing apparatus.

CLASS E.

Buildings for antimony works, smelting works of any kind, works for treatment of pyrites, ammonia, and other works.

Buildings for works included in this class to be provided with suitable condensing apparatus, so as to render the fumes innocuous.

All ground floors should be imperviously paved and laid so as to drain to channels intercepted by deodorizing tanks. All yards to be gravelled or paved and well drained.

CLASS F.

Marine stores.

The yards and floors of the buildings shall be imperviously paved and laid so as to drain into paved channels.

CLASS G.

Bedding and mattress works; biscuits, bread, confectionery, &c., works; boot, shoe, &c., factories; boxes, trunks, bags, &c., factories; brush, broom, &c., factories; cigar, tobacco, cigarette, &c., factories; clothing factories; corset factories; dressmaking, millinery, mantles, ladies' underclothing, &c., work-rooms; dye works; grocers' sundries, maizena, spices, &c., factories; hat and cap factories; hosiery works; printing, stationery, book-binding, card boxes, &c., works; shirt factories; laundries; umbrella works; waterproof clothing factories; woollen mills.

No room to be used by females in buildings of the above kinds shall be approved if the roof of such room be of iron, and at a shorter distance than 20 feet above the floor, unless the said room be ceiled or the roof be lined.

12. If the building or place proposed to be registered does not come up to the standard required by these Regulations, or by such one or more of them as may be applicable to the particular building or place in question, the Council shall notify to the person in occupation of such building or place the particular objection which, on examination, is disclosed, and such building or place shall not be registered until these Regulations are complied with.

13. When the Council has approved of any such building or place as suitable for a factory or work-room, the Town Clerk shall issue an approval in writing in the following form:—

EXHIBITION OF A NEW LIGHT.

Port of Hangarkotta, South Canara District, Madras Presidency,
India, West Coast.

1. A 6th order red dioptric port light was exhibited at this port on the 9th November, 1896, and is visible seaward about 8 miles on a clear night from north through east to south, except where obscured by trees between south and S. 9° E., and by St. Mary's Isles between north and N. 5° E., and between N. 5° E. and N. 15° E. All bearings magnetic.

2. The apparatus, which is 12 feet above high water, is placed on the top of the small masonry column on the beach marking the northern limit of the port, and not on the southern pillar, as stated in the preliminary notice issued on the 27th October last.

3. As this light is only intended for the use of coasting vessels during the fair-weather season, it will be extinguished yearly between the 1st June and the 14th September, both days inclusive.

No. 1111, section 83) it is enacted that the Licensing Court for each Licensing District shall, in the month of December in every year, hold an annual sitting of the Court at the place appointed, of which annual sitting one month's previous notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*: Provided that the Governor in Council may, by an Order in Council, extend the time for the holding of such Court by a period not exceeding two months from the thirty-first day of December: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order extend the time for holding the Annual Sitings of the Licensing Court appointed to be held in the month of December, 1896, at Mornington, by a period not exceeding two months from the thirty-first day of December, 1896.

And the Honorable Henry Cuthbert, Her Majesty's Solicitor-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which shall be paid in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

2. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by measure, shall be—

(1) If for domestic purposes and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

4. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house-walls or carriages, or watering horses, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

5. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

7. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

8. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first fixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

9. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

10. Water-clocks will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that no more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

11. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

12. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person; either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

13. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

14. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Kyabram Waterworks Trust."

15. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

16. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap, or in any way interfere with, any main the property of the Trust. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be £1.

The rate to be paid in respect of unoccupied allotments of land shall be Five shillings for each allotment not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, Ten shillings if more than a quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre, Fifteen shillings if more than half an acre but not exceeding three-quarters of an acre, with a maximum charge of One pound sterling for any parcel of land within the boundary of the Urban Trust.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

REGULATION.**

THE Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 3.—URBAN DISTRICT OF DONALD.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Donald Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Donald, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes.

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.
3. For all tenements in the said Urban District, situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, One-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, One-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuations.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1897, commencing on the 1st of January, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1897, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st of January, and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

REGULATION FOR 1897.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

REGULATION No. 17.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Five per cent. per annum upon the municipal value of such property.
3. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
4. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Four per cent. per annum on the annual municipal value of such property, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound sterling.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
6. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount equal to Four per cent. per annum on the annual municipal value of such piece or allotment of land, provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound sterling.
7. For every water-trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 12,000 gallons.
8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement, for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

9. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter, where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens), equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

10. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year.

11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or, if there be no contract thereupon, the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

12. For water supplied to market gardens, the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 200,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

13. For water supplied to breweries, the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

15. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

16. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

17. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1897, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR THE YEAR 1897.**

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the said Trust shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, the sum of One shilling in the pound sterling.
3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied township or subdivisive allotments shall be Sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value, provided that no rate of less than Ten shillings shall be made.
4. Water supplied for other than domestic use shall be by measure or by special agreement, and shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at the price mentioned, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive, according to his assessed rate for the year, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1897, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized, to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust this 2nd day of November, 1896, and the seal of the Trust was hereunto affixed in the presence of—

**TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1897.—No. 1.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1897 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant and unoccupied allotments of land, and vacant and unoccupied pieces of land, or any other property liable to be rated, shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.
2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling.
3. For each and every vacant allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.
4. For each and every unoccupied allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.
5. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.
6. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling.
7. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) a charge of One shilling and fourpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.
8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by measure, shall be—
 - (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling and fourpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 - (b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate, at One shilling and fourpence per 1,000 gallons, shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.
9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July, 1897.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate. Made this 16th day of November, 1896.

**TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION
No. 2, 1897.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, repeal the following Regulations heretofore made by them, viz.:—Regulation No. 2, 1891, passed on the 24th day of November, 1890, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of December, 1890; Regulation No. 2, 1893, passed on the 3rd day of October, 1892, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 21st day of November, 1892; and Regulation No. 2, 1895, passed on the 19th day of November, 1895, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 2nd day of December, 1895; and do hereby, in further pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

1. No person receiving water from the Trust at or upon any premises shall allow any person to carry or take away any water from such premises, and no such person shall sell any water to any other person.
2. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall be of the best galvanized quality, and all cocks shall be of high-pressure pattern, and all such service-pipes and cocks shall not be laid or connected with the pipes of the Trust until approved of, in writing, by the Trust's officer or some other person authorized by the Trust in that behalf, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—
For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, $\frac{1}{2}$ in. diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diameter; for the supply of water for all other than domestic purposes by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize, in writing, in each case.
3. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any land or tenement who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, and is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of any such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

4. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing an efficient self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

5. No overflow pipes to private baths shall be connected or affixed.

6. No water-closets shall be supplied direct from any main of the Trust, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush.

7. No extension or alteration of any service whatever will be permitted without the written permission of the Trust, and such extension or alteration shall be under the supervision of the Trust's officer or some other person authorized by the Trust in that behalf, and no meter shall be affixed unless the same shall have been submitted to and approved of by the Trust or the Trust's officer or by such other person as may be authorized by the Trust in that behalf; and no meter shall be removed by any person without he shall give six clear days' previous notice, in writing, to the Trust of his intention so to do.

8. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise as may be deemed expedient, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause or complaint remains or is not remedied.

9. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through the pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

10. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap or in any way interfere with any main the property of the Trust. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

11. Any person infringing these Regulations, or any of them, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Tatura Waterworks Trust.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust, within the Urban District of Wycheproof, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.
3. For all tenements in the said Urban District, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1897, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1897, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1897, and shall be payable the one moiety on the 1st January and the other on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates.

The foregoing Regulation No. 17 was made by the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust on the 18th day of November, 1896.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Eleven pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Eleven pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 23,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre. For every additional acre and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1897, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1897, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1897, and the 1st day of July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

MURCHISON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.—No. 9.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Murchison Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust area, according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings.

2. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes, by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements of any one ratepayer of an annual municipal value of £25 and upwards in the aggregate shall be the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity to lands and tenements of the aforesaid annual municipal value and upwards shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

3. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes, by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), to lands or tenements of any one ratepayer of an annual municipal value of less than Twenty-five pounds, Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be charged,

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provided that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall in each case be the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons shall be made, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

5. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the 1st day of January, 1897, and one moiety on the 1st day of July, 1897.

6. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

7. Clauses one and two of Regulation No. 1, made by the Commissioners of the Trust on the 6th day of December, 1890, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 8th day of December, 1890, are hereby repealed.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1897 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Tungamah, as such district has been proclaimed and defined by an Order in Council:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.

5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.

6. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.

7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1897.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation No. 20 was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 7th day of December, 1896.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban excepted), and at the Central Booking Office, Flinders-street, from 19th December till 4th January (both days inclusive, Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. On tickets issued at Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations and at the Central Booking Office, Flinders-street, bearing dates from 19th till 26th December inclusive, and from 27th December till 4th January inclusive, the journey may be commenced on any day during the respective period, and the tickets will be available for return till 26th January or 4th February inclusive (as the case may be).

Sydney, Adelaide, Brisbane.—From 11th till 31st December (both dates inclusive) excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne at the following return fares, viz.:

Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line, except on payment of 15s. first class and 10s. second class. Adelaide and Brisbane excursion tickets will be available by the express and ordinary trains. In all cases the journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and the address should be affixed in such a way that it will not come off.

Horses and Vehicles.—From 21st December till 4th January (both dates inclusive) the Department cannot engage to forward horses or vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From 21st December till 4th January (both dates inclusive) commercial travellers' samples will only be taken to or from road-side stations by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On 24th and 31st December parcels must be at the parcels offices at Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations half-an-hour before the starting times of ordinary trains.

3. Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Castle Donnington which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Castle Donnington, and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Berrivillock."

Area described in petition :-

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts and Regulations made thereunder the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Order dated the second day of November, 1896, directed that a Special Board should be appointed to determine the lowest price or rate of payment to be paid for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing articles of men's and boys' clothing and wearing apparel, namely, coats (including overcoats and cloaks of every description), vests, trousers, jackets, and knickerbockers, except india-rubber waterproof garments, and directed that such Special Board should consist of ten members (besides the chairman), and that the days for nomination and election of candidates for members of such Special Board should be appointed in a subsequent Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts and Regulations, doth by this Order appoint Thursday, the 7th day of January, 1897, to be the day on or before which nominations of candidates for election on the said Special Board shall be received by the returning officer, and Monday, the 18th day of January, 1897, to be the day for the election of members for such Board.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1153) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land, including every occupier and every owner of Mallee land, from time to time to suppress and destroy all vermin from time to time on any land so occupied or owned by him, or on the adjacent half-width of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and for such purpose to do all necessary or proper acts or things, and that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to name any specified day on and from and after which the duty thereby declared shall, in any part of Victoria described in such

proclamation, be simultaneously commenced, continued, and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land, including every occupier and every owner of Mallee land: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby name the twelfth day of January, 1897, as the day on and from and after which the duty thereby declared shall, in the colony of Victoria, be simultaneously commenced, continued, and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land, including every occupier and every owner of Mallee land throughout the said colony of Victoria.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of December, 1896.

WHEREAS by the *Income Tax Act 1895* (58 Vict. No. 1374) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations not inconsistent with the said Act for the purposes, or any of them, therein mentioned: It is now therefore recommended, for the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following Regulations be made (that is to say):—

1. The time for furnishing the Returns required by the Act from all persons and companies other than those referred to in section 10 of the said Act shall be the 1st day of March, 1897.
2. The time for furnishing the Returns required by the Act from all companies under the provisions of section 10 of the said Act shall be the 31st day of March, 1897.
3. The form of notice prescribed by Regulation 3 of the Regulations dated the 10th day of February, 1896, is hereby repealed, and the following form is hereby prescribed, as the form:—

"Income Tax Acts 1895 and 1896.

"NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS:

"Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of the above-named Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, every person and company (other than a company under section 10 of the *Income Tax Act 1895*) liable to make any return or declaration under the said Acts or Regulations, is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me in the prescribed form such return or declaration on or before the 1st day of March, 1897.

"And every company liable to make a return under section 10 of the *Income Tax Act 1895* or under the Regulations is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me in the prescribed form such return on or before the 31st day of March, 1897.

"And further notice is hereby given that every such return shall be addressed to the Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the Income Tax Office, at Queen-street, Melbourne.

"Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return or declaration at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is under the said Acts liable to a penalty of not less than £2 nor more than £100, and to be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Acts the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged:

"Any person making a false declaration is liable to be prosecuted for perjury:

"Commissioner of Taxes.

"Income Tax Office, Melbourne."

4. Regulation 4 of the Regulations dated the 10th day of February, 1896, is hereby repealed, and it is hereby prescribed that the income tax on assessments of incomes for the year ended 31st December, 1896, shall be paid in one sum on or before the 22nd day of April, 1897.

5. The form of Schedule A prescribed by the Regulations dated the 28th day of January, 1896, is hereby repealed, and the form of Schedule A hereto is hereby prescribed.

6. The forms in Schedule C of the Regulations dated the 10th day of February, 1896, are hereby repealed, and the forms of Schedule C (1), (2), and (3) are hereby prescribed.

7. The form in Schedule E of the Regulations dated the 10th day of February, 1896, is hereby repealed, and the form Schedule E hereto is hereby prescribed.

8. The form No. 1 in Schedule G prescribed by the Regulations dated the 10th day of February, 1896, is hereby repealed, and the form No. 1 Schedule G hereto is hereby prescribed.

9. The form No. 2 Schedule G prescribed by the Regulations dated the 14th day of March, 1895, is hereby repealed.

10. The declaration instead of return by any person carrying on trade as a principal who claims to be non-taxable pursuant to section 18 of the *Income Tax Act* 1896 shall be in the form Schedule H hereto.
