


STATE PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME 2011

Per capita personal income rose 4.3 percent nationally in 2011 after rising 2.8 percent in 2010. Across states, per capita personal income growth ranged from 2.9 percent in Alaska to 6.7 percent in North Dakota.
