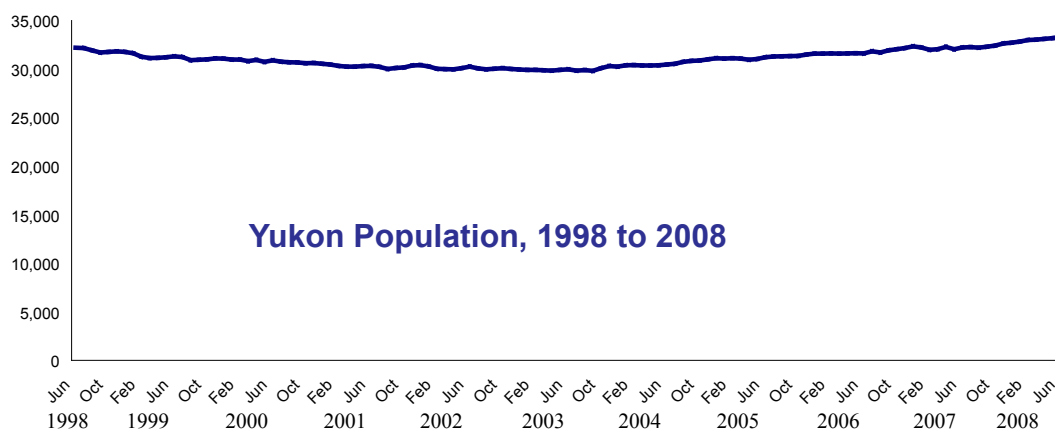


1 Monthly Yukon Population Estimates for 2007 & 2008

- Between June 2007 and June 2008, the monthly population of the Yukon increased from 32,212 to 33,294, an increase of 1,082 people.
- The average population of the Yukon over the last twelve months (July 2007 to June 2008) was 32,747. This is an increase of 681 persons, or 2.1%, from the 2006/07 average of 32,066 for the same time period.
- Looking at the last twelve months, the Yukon's population has exhibited steady positive growth since August of 2007 through to June 2008.

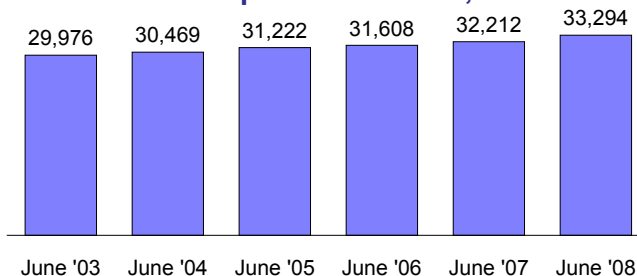

As of June 2008, the population of the Yukon was 33,294. This is the highest population for any June since 1997. This is also the fifth consecutive June population increase after six consecutive decreases in the June population after the Faro mine closure in 1997.

- There were 5,697 people (17.1%) under 15 years of age, 24,988 (75.1%) between 15 and 64 years of age, and 2,609 people (7.8%) who were 65 years of age or older.

Highlights of Population Changes in Yukon's Four Largest Communities

Between June 2007 and June 2008, the Whitehorse population increased by 3.5%. During the same time period, the Dawson City population increased by 0.7%, the Watson Lake population increased by 1.9%, and the Haines Junction population increased by 1.7%.

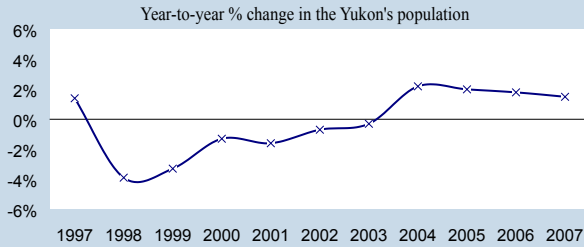

Historical Population Estimates

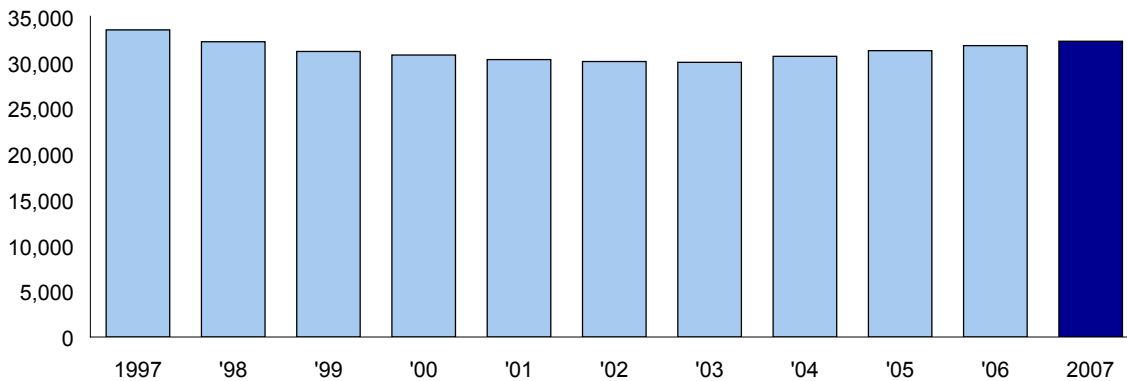
Comparing 1997 to 2007, the annual average population of the Yukon decreased by 1,243 people (from 33,519 to 32,276). This represents an annual average growth rate of -0.4%. However, this growth has not occurred evenly from year to year. Rather, it has ranged from a high of 2.2% between '03 and '04 to a low of -3.9% between '97 and '98.

Population estimates are used by the public sector, private sector and the general public. The Yukon Bureau of Statistics produces population estimates twice a year. Figures for the months of January to June are released in July of the same year while population estimates for the months of July to December are released in January of the next year.

These population estimates are statistically based on the Yukon Health Care Registration file. The figures are sorted by postal codes and community codes. Users of this information should be aware that the community population includes not only the legally defined city limits, but also the population that lives in the immediately surrounding area.
