AGENDA TITLE: Approval of Letter to Congressman Jared Huffman Regarding Testing at the Navy Northwest Training and Testing Range Complex (NWTT)

PREVIOUS BOARD/BOARD COMMITTEE ACTIONS: On April 7, 2009, the Board of Supervisors sent a Letter of Opposition to Preferred Alternative No. 2 for the Navy's Northwest Training and Testing Range Complex (NWTT). This letter was sent to the Naval Facilities Engineering Command NW, the Congressional Delegations of Coastal California, Oregon and Washington, Coastal Counties of Northern California, Oregon and Washington and the National Marine Fisheries Service. The letter pointed out potentially harmful effects on the environmental, economic and public health of Mendocino County residents from testing at the Range. On October 8, 2010, the Board of Supervisors sent a Letter of Opposition to the Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and Overseas Environmental Impact Statement (OEIS) with reference to the NWTRC. The letter identified the lack of protection afforded marine mammals, fish and fisheries. The letter also requested clarification of the effects of sonar, aerial bombardment and undersea detonations on ocean health and pointed to the apparent discrepancy between the State of California's Marine Life Protection Act and the U.S. Navy's continued use of the sea for military testing and training activities. On April 24, 2012, Supervisors McCowen and Hamburg sought authorization from the full Board to compile and submit scoping comments to the Naval Facilities Engineering Command, NW, Ms. Kimberly Kler, Project Manager, by the deadline of April 27, 2012, with copies to state and federal legislators. These comments were to include, but not be limited to, concerns expressed in previous Board correspondence (e.g., effects of weapons testing on marine mammals, fish and fisheries, recognition of biological "hot spots", avoidance of areas identified by Tribes as having cultural significance, cumulative impacts, etc.).

SUMMARY OF REQUEST: The Board of Supervisors is being asked to approve a letter to Congressman Jared Huffman stating its opposition to U.S. Navy testing within 50 miles of the Mendocino County coastline. On the Navy Northwest Training and Testing Range Complex (NWTT) map, the U.S. Navy has drawn a 12-mile buffer line from the County's coastline where testing and training will be "limited." The letter states that this 12-mile buffer line should be extended to a 50-mile buffer zone. The letter further requests that Congressman Huffman petition the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) to reopen the public comment period that ended on February 28, 2014 and extend for an additional 60 days. This period was to allow for official public feedback on testing in the Navy Northwest Training and Testing Range Complex (NWTT). According to the letter, the Board of Supervisors and residents in Mendocino County were not given sufficient advance notice to review the NWTT Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)/Overseas Environmental Impact Statement (OEIS) and to leave their commentary. Finally, the letter requests that Congressman Huffman petition the U.S. Navy to extend the public commentary period for the NWTT Draft EIS/OEIS, which ends on March 25, 2014, for an additional 60 days.
