Pursuant to our conversation, our client has agreed to accept \$ 3,500.00 as settlement in full of your account balance, of \$ 41,786,94

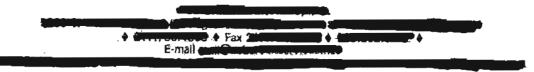
