Advantage Health Centers Awarded New Access Point

On Tuesday, May 5, 2015, Advantage Health Centers (AHC) received a New Access Point grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. The grant will fund a new Health Center site in the Bell Building Health Center.

Currently the Neighborhood Service Organization (NSO) provides 110 permanent housing units and related support services for the homeless from the Bell Building located at 882 Oakman Boulevard. In a unique partnership, the NSO will lease approximately 8,700 square feet of the building to AHC for a new Health Center site to provide medical, dental and behavioral services to both the residents of the building and the surrounding community.

"The New Access Point funding will not only enable us to deepen

our reach within the homeless community, but also introduce primary care services to an underserved area within the community," said Joe Ferguson, Executive Director, Advantage Health Centers. "We have the potential to provide affordable and accessible health care to an additional 65,000 residents within Wayne County."

The 8,700 square foot facility will provide primary care for all life cycles, screenings, well child services, perinatal and gynecological care, oral health care, case management, health education, outreach, behavioral health, substance abuse, health screenings and education services on site or through contractual agreements. In addition, referral services for diagnostic radiology, diagnostic laboratory, emergency medical



services, and other specialty services will be available. The Health Center anticipates providing limited services at the new site in mid August and the permanent site will open in Spring 2016.

AHC is one of 12 Michigan Health Centers to operate Health Care for the Homeless programs and currently serves about 6,000 homeless individuals throughout the region. Nationwide, 23 million patients are served through 1,300 Health Center sites located in over 9,000 communities.

Community Health Centers Federal Funding Extended—Health Center Spending Cliff Averted

After over 1500 letters collected, thousands of emails sent, and a countless number of calls made to federal congressmen and senators, the Medicare and CHIP Reauthorization Act passed in April 2015. The law reserves \$7.2 billion in mandatory funding for the Health Centers Program, as well as continued funding for the National Health Service Corps and Teaching Health Centers for two years.

Without the passage of H.R. 2,

Health Center's would have faced a devastating reduction in funding as early as September 2015.

The passage of this legislation not only secures continued operation and funding for Health Centers at a national level, but it enables Health Centers to continue to serve residents with comprehensive, accessible, affordable and quality primary care services as well as expand to serve underserved communities.
