Composer John Zorn to Present Chimeras at Merkin Concert Hall on Saturday, June 1, 9–10 PM

John Schaefer will host panel discussion about Zorn's work

New York, NY, 5/08/02—On Saturday, June 1, from 9–10 PM, Merkin Concert Hall offers the final performance in the series, Zoom: Composers Close Up, which highlights new works and new composers. The program will focus on Chimeras by composer John Zorn—an ethereal and multilayered classical chamber composition featuring piano, percussion and a virtuosic, wordless soprano line. Premiered in 2001 by the Seattle Chamber Players with soprano Sarah Coburn, the Merkin Hall performance of Chimeras will feature Beth Anne Hatton and Ilana Davidson, soprano; Tara Helen O'Connor, flute; Michael Lowenstern, clarinet; Jenny Choi, violin; Fred Sherry, cello; Stephen Drury, piano; and William Winant, percussion.

The hour-long event includes a panel discussion hosted by New York City's new music radio voice, **John Schaefer.** A meet-the-artists reception will immediately follow the discussion.

New Yorker **John Zorn** was born in 1953. He traveled extensively before coming back home to become a central figure in the downtown music scene, playing saxophone and keyboards in addition to composing. He has listed among his early inspirations American innovators Charles Ives, John Cage, and Harry Partch as well as Ornette Coleman and Jimmy Giuffre, to name a few. His compositional output is diverse, reflecting his experience in a variety of genres, including jazz, rock, hardcore punk, classical and improvised music.
