

TRAVELLING TO CAMBRIDGE

By Train:

Cambridge is well served by trains from London, though rail access from other parts of the country is rarely direct. The National Rail telephone enquiry number is: 08457 484950 or go to <http://www.nationalrail.co.uk/>

There is a taxi rank outside the station, and a bus service (Citi 1, 3 and 7) into the city centre, dropping off in Emmanuel Street and St Andrew's Street.

By Coach:

National Express run regular services to Cambridge

By Car:

Parking is not available in the College. Applicants with mobility difficulties should contact the Admissions Office as soon as possible to discuss their needs and certainly in advance of their visit. Cambridge city centre is usually extremely congested, and there is a one-way system on the streets surrounding the College (please note: there is no access via Silver Street during the day or Emmanuel Road 24 hours a day).

Parking in the city is very expensive and we strongly advise you to use the Park & Ride facilities:
