What is the School for Advanced Studies?

The School for Advanced Studies, or SAS, is part of a statewide program that was implemented to improve educational options and increase professional training to support the development of gifted and talented youth. SAS offers an intensive, articulated academic program in which both innovative and traditional courses are taught. The course content is modified to meet the achievement levels of the students and their capacity for learning.

Here at Hollywood High School, SAS provides students with the opportunity to take Honors courses, as well as Advanced Placement (AP) courses for upper-level students who meet the course prerequisite(s). Courses are offered in a cluster/SLC format where students share common classes and teachers. This allows for collaboration across the curriculum and a greater degree of personalization between teachers and students.

The sample course progression (at right) depicts a suggested timeline. SAS maintains flexibility in programming students who meet course prerequisites.

Sample	Course	Progression

Grade 9	Honors English 9, Honors World History, Honors Biology, Honors Geometry, Foreign Language Level I, PE
Grade 10	Honors English, AP European History, Honors Chemistry, Algebra II, Foreign Language Level II, A-G Elective/ Athletics
Grade 11	AP English Language, AP American History, AP Chemistry, AP Calculus, Foreign Language Level III, A-G Elective/ Athletics
Grade 12	AP Literature, AP Government/ Honors Economics, AP Physics, Honors Statistics, A-G Elective/ Athletics
