TAX FUNCTION

The tax function is led by the Group Tax Director who reports directly to the Group Chief Financial Officer (CFO). Our dedicated team of tax professionals proactively support the Group as business partners to ensure compliance in a tax efficient manner. We aim to provide clear and timely guidance on tax matters and we will seek external advice if necessary. It is our aim to be involved in projects from planning to implementation to ensure that the appropriate tax treatment is applied and tax exposures are managed.
