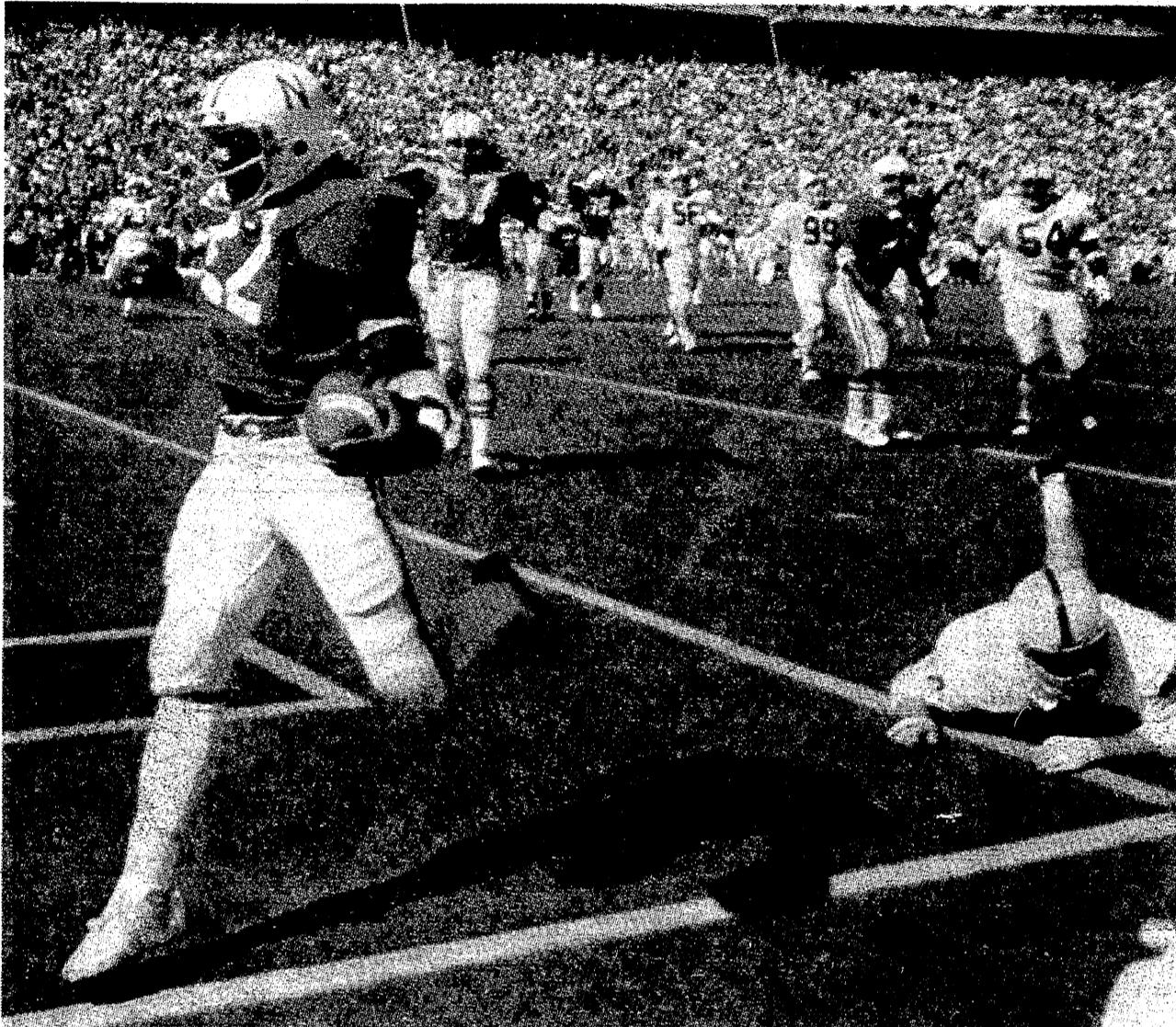

Huskers Leave 'Em in the Lurch

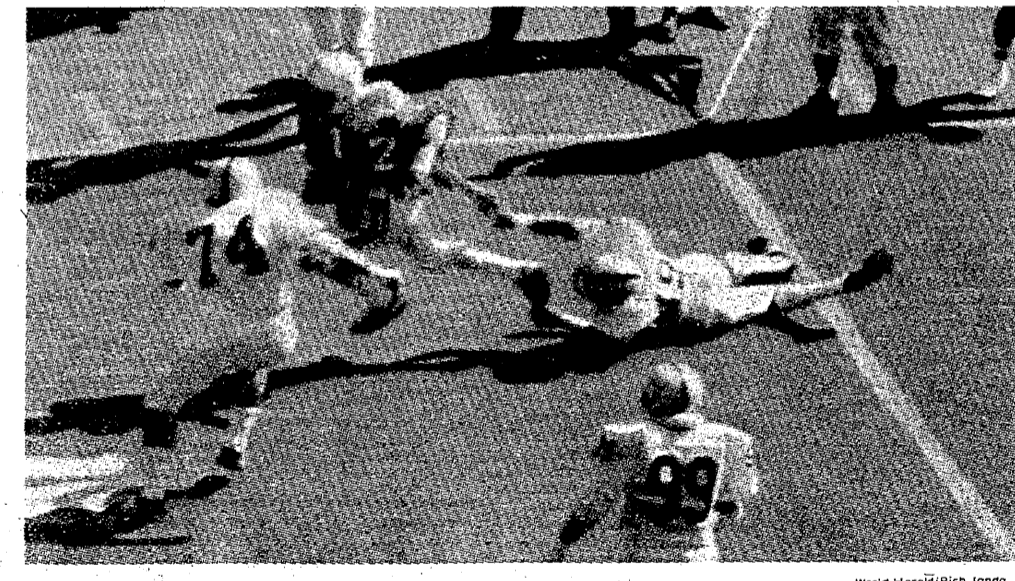
