The Lakers dropped their season finale on a buzzer-beating three by the Trail Blazers. The game saw 15 ties and 15 lead changes, with Portland getting a chance at the final shot and taking advantage. Seven Lakers missed the game due to injury, but the shorthanded squad competed with the playoff-bound Blazers. Kentavious Caldwell-Pope scored a game-high 32 points with eight assists. All five Lakers starters scored in double-figures. Johnathan Williams added a double-double off the bench. Jemerrio Jones grabbed 15 rebounds to go along with 11 points. Three 20-point scorers in Maurice Harkless, Enes Kanter and Damian Lillard paced the Trail Blazers.

LAKERS LATEST

BASKETBALL JONES: In the first start of his career, Jemerrio Jones tallied a career-high 16 rebounds, five points, five rebounds and two blocks.

- He became the first undrafted rookie to ever put up his line and only the sixth undrafted player to ever do so
- Jones followed that up with 15 boards in the season finale and is the first Lakers rookie with 31+ rebounds in their first two starts (since starters were tracked in '70-71)

CARUSHOW: Alex Caruso put together his best night of basketball in the Lakers final non-home contest of the season on 4/5 at LA Clippers, recording his first double-double with career highs in points (32, 5-7 3FG, 7-7 FT) and rebounds (10) to go along with five assists and two steals.

- He joined LeBron James, Brook Lopez, Antawn Jamison, Kobe Bryant (seven) and Cedric Ceballos as the only Lakers with 32+ points, 10+ boards and 5+ 3FG in a game
- The performance built on a strong closing month for the two-way guard as he scored 23 points (7-11 FG, 4-4 3FG) off the bench on 3/31 at New Orleans, adding six assists and four steals on the night, to become the first Lakers player to meet those totals off the bench since steals became an official NBA stat in 1973-74

HELPING HAND: Rajon Rondo finished with a season-high 17 assists, 7 points, 6 rebounds and 6 steals on 3/29 vs. Charlotte.

- The assist total is the most by a Lakers player since Kobe Bryant tallied 17 assists on 1/15/2015 vs. Cleveland
- He's the first Lakers player to notch 17 or more assists and 6+ steals in the same game since Magic Johnson on 12/15/1989 at Boston

MUST SEE MCGEE: JaVale McGee notched new career highs with 33 points (15-20 FG) and 20 rebounds on 3/22 vs. Brooklyn, also adding six blocks in 35 minutes.

- He joins Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (four times) as the only Lakers with at least 33-20-6 and is the first NBA player with those single-game totals since David Robinson in 1994
- It's the first 30-20-5 performance in the NBA this season and just the fifth since 1999-00 (Andre Drummond, DeMarcus Cousins, Shaq, Kevin Garnett)
- McGee followed that up with 17 points (8-8 FG), 13 rebounds and 5 blocks on 3/24 vs. Sacramento, and 20 points (9-11 FG), 15 rebounds and 4 blocks on 3/26 vs. Washington, becoming the first player in NBA history to notch at least 17-13-4 while shooting 75% from the field in three consecutive games

CALL IT A COMEBACK: Los Angeles has won 11 games this season after trailing by 10 or more points, highlighted by a season-best 20-point comeback on March 12 in Chicago to defeat the Bulls, 123-107. Overall, the Lakers have won five games by double figures after trailing by at least 10 points in the contest. Earlier this season, the Lakers became just the second team in the shot-clock era (since 1954-55) to win back-to-back games by double digits when trailing by 10+ at the end of the first quarter (joining the 2017-18 Warriors) following wins on November 30 vs. Dallas (114-103) and December 2 vs. Phoenix (120-96).

A RARITY FOR RONDO: Lakers guard Rajon Rondo recorded his first triple-double with the team on March 4 against the LA Clippers, finishing with a season-high 24 points (10-18 FG), 10 rebounds and 12 assists.

- With the performance, he joined Mark Jackson as the only players in NBA history to record a triple-double with five different teams, having also done so with Boston, Sacramento, Chicago and New Orleans
- It was Rondo's 32nd career triple-double, ranking 11th in NBA history, and he trails only Russell Westbrook, LeBron James and James Harden among active players
- The Lakers became the first team this season to have three different players record a triple-double, as LeBron James (six) and Lonzo Ball have also done so

PERFECT PIERRE: JaVale McGee finished with 21 points (10-10 FG), seven rebounds and one block in 26 minutes 3/2 at Phoenix, becoming the first Lakers player to finish perfect from the field with at least 10 attempts since Pau Gasol in 2010 (10-10, 11/21/10 vs. GSW).

- He is the sixth Lakers player to finish perfect from the field with at least 10 attempts (joining Gasol, Byron Scott, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (twice), Mitch Kupchak and Wilt Chamberlain) and is the first non-starter to do so
- League wide, McGee is only the 12th reserve since 2000 to go perfect from the field with that many attempts, and the third to do so this season
- The performance marked the most field goals McGee has made in a single game without a miss

LEBRON AMONG THE NBA'S ALL-TIME SCORING LEADERS: Lakers forward LeBron James has scored **32,543**, points throughout his 16-year career, ranking fourth on the NBA's all-time scoring list. His most recent climb up the scoring chart took place on March 6 vs. Denver, when James converted a driving layup at the 5:38 mark of the second quarter to pass Michael Jordan for his current position on the all-time list. The 15-time NBA All-Star became the league's active leader in career points against San Antonio on 10/27/18, moving ahead of the seventh-ranked Dirk Nowitzki with a one-legged fadeaway jump shot over Dante Cunningham at the 7:51 mark of the third quarter. James now approaches the scoring mark of Kobe Bryant, whose 33,643 career points ranks third in NBA history. A four-time NBA Most Valuable Player, James eclipsed the 32,000 scoring mark this season to join Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Karl Malone, Bryant and Jordan as the only players in league history to achieve the milestone.

20-POINT QUARTERS BY LAKERS PLAYERS THIS SEASON: Six times this season a Lakers player has scored at least 20 points in a single quarter, highlighted by a 23-point first quarter from Kyle Kuzma on February 10 at Philadelphia.

- The mark was the best single-quarter performance by a Lakers player this season and was the team's highest since Kobe Bryant scored the same amount in the fourth and final quarter of his career (4/13/16 vs. UTA)
- Overall, Kuzma has had four of L.A.'s top single-quarter point totals this season
- The second-year forward is one of only five players in the NBA this season to have four 20-point quarters, joining James Harden (six), Steph Curry (five), Damian Lillard (four) and Kemba Walker (four)

ALL STAR ACCOLADES

KING OF QUEEN CITY: Forward LeBron James appeared in the 15th NBA All-Star Game of his career and his first as a Laker on February 17 in Charlotte, finishing with 19 points, eight rebounds, four assists and two blocks en route to a 178-164 Team LeBron win.

- With his selection, James tied Tim Duncan, Kevin Garnett and Shaquille O'Neal for the third-most all-star appearances in NBA history, trailing only Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (19) and Kobe Bryant (18) on the all-time list
- He garnered more than 4.6 million votes worldwide, leading all players in all-star voting for the sixth time in his career
- The game's all-time leader in points scored (362), James moved to 7-8 in the annual event after winning in 2019



KUZ CONTROLS THE RISING STARS GAME: Sophomore forward Kyle Kuzma competed in the Mtn Dew Ice Rising Stars for the second consecutive season, winning MVP honors after totaling a game-high 35 points (15-27 FG), six rebounds and two assists.

- He became only the second Lakers player to win MVP of the rookie-sophomore showcase, joining Eddie Jones in 1995
- His point total bested Kobe's long-standing Lakers record in the event (31 in 1997) and was tied for the seventh-most points in the game's history
- Kuzma and guard Lonzo Ball (DNP due to injury) were two of only five Lakers players to be selected to the game in each of their two years of eligibility

BOSTON THREE PARTY: The Lakers put together one of their top three-point shooting nights in franchise history on February 7 at Boston, hitting a team-record 22 three-pointers on 41 attempts. The contest marked the first time that Los Angeles had ever connected on 20 three-point attempts in a single game, and it helped to solidify a 129-128 win over the Celtics in the game's final moments.

- LeBron James (5-10 3FG), Kyle Kuzma (5-8) and Kentavious Caldwell-Pope (5-9) each hit five threes, while Lance Stephenson and Rajon Rondo added three apiece
- It's the first time in franchise history that three players have hit at least five three-pointers in the same game
- Rondo hit the go-ahead bucket as time expired, while James recorded the 77th triple-double of his career (28 points, 12 rebounds, 12 assists) to tie Wilt Chamberlain for fifth-most in NBA history

MAGNUM B.I.: Brandon Ingram set a new career high with 36 points (16-20 FG) on 1/29 vs. Philadelphia, adding five rebounds and five assists.

- Ingram is the first Lakers player to score at least 35 points while shooting 80 percent from the field since Andrew Bynum in 2012.
- At 21 years, 149 days, Ingram becomes the second-youngest player ever to go for at least 35-5-5 on 80 percent shooting, behind Dwight Howard (21-127)

MICHIGAN MAN: Kyle Kuzma scored a career-high 41 points (16-24 FG, 5-10 3FG) in 29 minutes on 1/9 vs. Detroit, the highest point total by a Lakers player to appear in fewer than 30 minutes in the NBA's shot clock era (since 1954-55).

- Kuzma became the fifth player in the league this season to score 40 points in three quarters (Steph Curry, James Harden, LeBron James and Klay Thompson)
- His 22-point third quarter was the best single-quarter mark of his career, one that Kuzma has since bested

DEEP IN THE HART OF TEXAS: Josh Hart tallied 14 points, 12 rebounds, six assists and a career-high five steals on 1/7 at Dallas, his first career game with as many combined points, rebounds and assists

- Jusuf Nurkic and Paul George are the only other players with at least 14-12-6-5 this season, while they are joined by LeBron James, James Harden and Draymond Green as the only players to match that line since the 2016-17 season
- Hart joins Vlade Divac, Magic (nine times), Kareem and Jerry West as the only Lakers to do so
- The only rookies/sophomores to match the feat since the 1999-2000 season are Mardy Collins, Chris Paul and LeBron James

CHRISTMAS CHRONICLES: Los Angeles appeared in their 45th overall and 20th consecutive Christmas Day game this year, building up as much as a 31-point second-half lead before knocking off the defending NBA champion Golden State Warriors, 127-101.

- L.A. shot 55.3 percent from the field, and three Lakers players recorded double-doubles
- With the victory, The Lakers surpassed the New York Knicks for the most wins on the holiday, moving to 23-22 on December 25
- Los Angeles earned win No. 20 in their 34th game, reaching the 20-win threshold in the fewest games since the 2011-12 lockout season, when the team started 20-13

DOUBLE TRIPLE-DOUBLE: LeBron James (24 pts, 12 reb, 11 ast) and Lonzo Ball (16 pts, 10 reb, 10 ast, 5 stl) became the second-ever pair of Lakers teammates to notch triple-doubles in the same game on 12/15 at Charlotte, joining Magic Johnson and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (1/22/1982).

- They were the first teammates to match the feat league-wide since Jason Kidd and Vince Carter on 4/7/2007
- James and Ball are the eighth pair of teammates in NBA history with same game triple-doubles, as the Lakers become the first franchise with multiple occurrences
- Ball is the first Laker with a triple-double and five steals since Magic Johnson on 1/24/1989, joining Johnson (5 times) and Jerry West (2/3/1974) as the only Lakers to do so

DECEMBER TO REMEMBER: Kyle Kuzma put together some of the best basketball of his career in December 2018, averaging 22.2 points (.480 FG%), 7.0 rebounds and 3.6 assists through 15 games.

- Kuzma's monthly averages in points (22.2) and assists (3.6) are the highest single-month marks of his career
- Scored 20 or more points in 12 of the 15 games, including a career-best 20+ streak of six games to begin the month
- The Lakers outscored opponents by an average of 3.0 points with Kuzma on the court in December 2018

50 IN MIAMI: LeBron James scored a season-high 51 points on 11/18 at Miami, shooting 19-of-31 from the field, and 6-of-8 from three-point range.

- It was his 12th career 50-point game, moving ahead of Allen Iverson for sixth-most all-time
- He became the fifth NBA player to score 50+ with three different teams (Wilt Chamberlain, Moses Malone, Bernard King and Jamal Crawford)
- The 51 points set a new franchise scoring record against Miami and were the most scored by a Lakers player since Kobe Bryant's 60 points on 4/13/16

TRAIL BLAZING 'BRON: LeBron James finished with 44 points (13-19 FG), 10 rebounds, nine assists and three blocks on 11/14 vs. Portland, becoming the first player in NBA history to reach those tallies with fewer than 20 field goal attempts

- It was the first time in James' career that he has recorded 44-10-9-3 in a single game, also becoming the first player in Lakers history to match those totals
- With a three-point play at the 3:55 mark of the fourth quarter, James passed Wilt Chamberlain to become the fifth all-time leading scorer in NBA history
- James recorded his 900th block in the win, becoming the fourth player in NBA history with at least 30,000 points and 900 blocks (K. Abdul-Jabbar, D. Nowitzki & K. Malone)

FIRST 10: LeBron James became the first player in Lakers history to total at least 265 points (268), 75 rebounds (76) and 75 assists (77) in his first 10 games with the team.

- He joins James Harden, Russell Westbrook (2016-17), John Havlicek (1970-71) and Oscar Robertson (1961-63, '66-67) as the only players with those totals through their first 10 games of a season
- James - who also accomplished the feat in 2007-08 and 2011-12 - joins Robertson as the only player to do so in multiple seasons
- JaVale McGee blocked 34 shots through 10 games, the most by a player in their first 10 games since Miami's Hassan Whiteside (46) in 2015-16
- McGee's 34 blocks were the most by a Laker in the first 10 games of a season since Vlade Divac (36) in 1994-95
- Divac, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (52 blk, 1975-76; 35, '80-81) and Elmore Smith (81, '73-74) are the only Lakers to block 34 or more shots in their first 10 games of the season

ALL-TIME TYSON: Lakers center Tyson Chandler currently ranks third on the NBA's career field goal percentage list.

- Chandler is second among active NBA players and trails only Dallas center DeAndre Jordan and Hall of Famer Artis Gilmore on the all-time chart
- The Compton, CA, native led the NBA in shooting percentage in 2011-12 (.679), also finishing second in 2007-08 (.623)
- A 17-year NBA veteran, he has shot at least 50 percent from the field in 15 seasons, including each of the last 14

CENTER OF ATTENTION: JaVale McGee had 16 points (8-15 FG), 15 rebounds, 5 blocks and 2 steals on 10/31 vs. Dallas.

- It was the third 15-15-5 performance of his career and first since 1/14/12 (WAS vs. PHI). The center became the first Lakers player since Pau Gasol to notch at least 15-15-5 in a game (LAL at CHI, 1/20/14)
- The double-double was his first since the 2015-16 season and the 50th of his career
- McGee ranks eighth in the league in blocks per game (1.87).

ALAMO CITY ACCOLADES: LeBron James (35 pts, 11 reb) moved into sixth place on the NBA's all-time scoring list on 10/27 at San Antonio, passing Dirk Nowitzki to become the league's active leader.

- James also jumped Shaquille O'Neal in career field goals on 10/27, moving into sixth place on the all-time list and becoming the active leader
- His 30-point performance was the 432nd of his career, moving ahead of Kobe Bryant for fourth-most all-time

LEBRON IN THE NBA'S TOP-20 REGULAR SEASON WINS LIST: Lakers forward LeBron James owns **789** career regular season wins, 18th on the NBA's all-time victories list, after surpassing former Lakers ironman A.C. Green (782 wins) on February 7 at Boston. The Akron, OH, native sits 22 victories away from surpassing Scottie Pippen for 17th all-time. James is one of 30 current or former NBA players to achieve the 750 career wins milestone and sits behind Dallas's Dirk Nowitzki and Charlotte's Tony Parker on the active wins list.

LBJ ALL DAY: LeBron James recorded his first triple-double as a Laker and the 74th of his career on 10/25 vs. Denver with 28 points, 11 rebounds, 11 assists and 3 steals

- It was his third triple-double in the STAPLES Center, after recording one each with Cleveland and Miami
- The game marked LeBron's fifth career triple-double against the Nuggets
- He was the first Laker to have a 20-point triple-double since Kobe did so on 12/30/14 at Denver

LANCE-A-LOT: Lance Stephenson tallied 23 points (10-14 FG), 8 rebounds, 8 assists and 2 steals in 25 minutes off the bench on 10/24 vs. Phoenix.

- He became the first player since Cedric Maxwell (3/31/88) to notch at least 23 points, 8 rebounds and 8 assists, while shooting at least 70% from the field as a reserve
- Magic Johnson (2/16/96) was the last Lakers reserve to match Stephenson's 23-8-8

ALL HAIL JAVALE: JaVale McGee notched 16 points, 6 rebounds and 5 blocks in 20 minutes of play on 10/20 vs. Houston.

- He became the first Laker since Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (15 pts, 6 blk, 2/24/80 vs. Hou) to score 15 or more points and block 5 or more shots in 20 or fewer minutes of play
- Since 1980, only Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (LAL, 1980), Josh Smith (ATL, 2007) and Herb Williams (IND, 1983) have matched those tallies league-wide

LEBRON'S A LAKER: LeBron James finished with 26 points, 12 rebounds and 6 assists in his Lakers debut 10/18 in Portland.

- His 26 points tied Magic Johnson (1979) and Stu Lantz (1974) for second-most points ever by a Laker in their first game with the franchise ... Kareem Abdul-Jabbar is the all-time leader with 27 points in his 1975 debut
- James joins Abdul-Jabbar and Elgin Baylor (1958) as the only three Lakers to put up at least 25p-10r-5a in their Lakers debut

OF ASSISTANCE: Three players on the Lakers roster averaged more than 7.0 assists last season: LeBron James (9.1), Rajon Rondo (8.2) and Lonzo Ball (7.2)

- James finished second in the NBA in assists per game and his 9.1 assists average was a career high
- Rondo has averaged more than 7.0 assists in nine of his 12 NBA seasons, leading the NBA on three occasions
- Ball was the first Lakers rookie since Magic Johnson to notch more than 7.0 assists per game (7.3 apg)
