TLG – ELL/LEP Performance	Dr. Shelton presented the Board with a Power Point on TLG – ELL/LEP Performance. Dr. Shelton reported on the following: 1. Design and implement a program that significantly increases the current academic performance of ELL/LEP students to meet or exceed standards. 2. Examine and benchmark effective instructional methods used in immersion and self-contained instruction. Identify the most effective instructional practices in enabling students to achieve academic standards and redesign current program. 3. Explore more effective transition practices that better support students with limited English to be successful in general education classes. 4. Align ELL/LEP curriculum and assessments to academic curriculum standards.	
	Mr. Glover asked Dr. Shelton if the majority of the district's new students required ELL services. Dr. Shelton said she would supply that information to the Board. Ms. Porter asked why thirty-five MNPS schools are not offering ELL services. Dr. Shelton stated that resources, number of students who need services per school, and transportation issues are reasons some schools do not have ELL services. Mr. North asked about the state's ELL student population. Dr. Shelton said there are about 35,000 ELL students in Tennessee's schools. Mr. North asked if the external appraisal conducted by George Washington University would be simply a diagnostic evaluation or will it also offer solutions? Dr. Shelton said that it would be a diagnostic evaluation but was unsure if recommendations would be provided. Mr. Glover asked Mr. Henson if the change in BEP funding would keep up with the rapid growth of ELL students. Mr. Henson stated that he would supply that information. Mr. Fox asked about plans to provide Professional Development to ELL teachers. Dr. Shelton said a Professional Development Institute is planned. Schools also invite the ELL Department to conduct faculty in-services on a school-by-school basis. Dr. Register said it is extremely important for the community to respond to the 2010 Census. MNPS will receive funding based on the information received from the
