Colorado skiers dominate biathlon

LAKE PLACID - John Ruger of Boulder, Colo., fired perfect scores from both the prone and standing positions Thursday to capture the second biathlon event in the United States team tryouts for the 1982 World Biathlon Championships.

Ruger skied today's 10-kilometer race in 35:02 to outdistance Don Nielsen, Fraser, Colo., by 10 seconds. Nielsen finished the course in 35:12, but had to ski three trips around the 150-meter penalty loop, one trip for a miss in the prone phase and two trips for misses in the standing position.

Nielsen continues to hold a fiveminute lead over Ruger following two days of competition on the Olympic biathlon course at Mount

Van Hoevenberg.
Martin Hagen, Jackson, Wyo., finished third Thursday with a time of 35:30. He fired a perfect score in the prone position and skied one penalty loop for a miss in the standing phase. Greg Cress, Anchorage, Alaska, skied four penalty loops for two misses from both the prone and standing positions to complete the course in 36:51 and a fourth-place

Nat Lucy, North Conway, N.H., completes the top five finishers Thursday with a time of 37:25 and dve dips around the penalty dop:

The top five finishers from the men's competition and the first four from the junior division will represent the U.S. in the World Biathlon Championships scheduled for Minsk, Russia, in February.

Craig Walker, Anchorage, Alaska, topped the junior division with a 39:32 and four penalty loops.

Raymond Dombrovsky, Saranac Lake, finished second with a time of 40:05 and four penalty loops. Finishing third was Glen Eberle, McCall, Idaho, with five penalty loops and a time of 40:31, just seven seconds ahead of Paul Swenson, Bozeman, Mont., who had four penalty loops and a finish time of

Eberle holds a two-minute lead over Dombrovsky and a three-minute edge over Swenson. Brian Wadsworth, Redmond, Wash., the winner of the first race, finished seventh Thursday and is in fourth place for a position on the junior

The women are also competing at Mount Van Hoevenberg this week, although there are no spots for women on the world team. Pam Weiss, Jackson, Wyo., placed first Thursday with a total time of 44:13 and three penalty loops. Second was Patrice Jankowski, Cloquet, Minn., with a time of 36:39 and four four






