# Imus: The gripes of wrath

**D**ON Imus doesn't wake up every morning with a smile. It's more of a growl.

Imus likes to complain about everything, both at home and at work. And WFAN-AM (660) wouldn't have it any other way.

Since his arrival at WFAN in 1988, when his former station WNBC was yanked from the airwaves, "Imus in the Morning" has been a hit for the all-sports station. Imus attracts legions of male fans, but one-third of his audience is women.

In the latest Arbitron ratings, "Imus in the Morning" scored a 6.2 share with men 25-54, placing him third behind WINS-AM and WXRK's Howard Stern in the lucrative morning-drive market.

"He's worth more than he's paid every year," said Joel Hollander, WFAN's advertising director, of Imus, who signed a five-year, \$10 million contract last year.

Sitting in his cluttered office, with his cowboys boots on a shelf and an autographed photo of Meredith Vieira on his wall, a relaxed Imus says that the secret to

the success of his show is its consistency.

"It's the same show we've done forever," Imus said. "It's reveling in the agony of others. That's the source of my humor, whether it's Imelda Marcos, Trump, Steinbrenner or the rodent-like features of Monica Seles. It's my cynical point of view."

But, he added impishly, "it's funny. I don't think it's mean-spirited."

Imus doesn't like to analyze his success. Or his style. "It always sounds so lame," he protests. For 18 years, Imus has been Imus. An irascible curmudgeon who believes that many listeners are too polite to gripe — so he does it for them.

"The show is a reflection of me and what I'm doing," he said. "It's a commentary on my hideous life and everyone else's hideous life."

On this particular morning, hideous is Imus' word *du jour*. People are hideous. Life is hideous. The weather is hideous.

"I like the sound of the word," he explains.

But before arriving at WFAN, his life was hideous. Battling a longtime drug and alcohol addiction, he checked himself into Hazelton clinic in 1977 to clean up his act. WNBC had tired of his unreliability and gave him the boot that year, and he was forced to take a job in Cleveland. Two years later, however, all was forgiven and WNBC rehired him.

"I had a serious drug and alcohol problem," he admitted. "I did recover and now can maintain a life and career, but that's not what happens to most people. Most people end up ruining their lives."

"Things are a lot better because I'm sober," said Imus.

But through all these changes, there is one constant — Imus still loves to complain. But with a \$2 million paycheck, a hit show and a better state of mind, he can't complain too much.

# Cameras tracking Mandela's N.Y. visit

**E**XTENSIVE radio and television coverage is planned for the visit to New York of African National Congress Committee leader Nelson Mandela and his wife Winnie, who begin their U.S. tour here on Wednesday.

In a special TV-radio linkup, WNYC's TV (Ch. 31) and radio stations (820 AM and 93.9 FM) will combine to provide nearly 75 hours of coverage up until the Mandelas' departure on Saturday.

Events planned during the visit include a tickertape parade along Broadway, an Ecumenical Service at Riverside Church and a rally at Yankee Stadium.

Here's a brief roundup of TV coverage. (Note: the schedules below are subject to change; consult the daily TV listings for further information.)

Channel 31 will be on the air with highlights of the Mandelas' arrival at Kennedy Airport at 9 a.m. At noon, the station will go live to City Hall, as well as keep track of the tickertape

and whether the Jewish community should be concerned.

On Thursday, the station will have live coverage of the Riverside Church Ecumenical Service at 9 a.m. and highlights of the Yankee Stadium rally, beginning at 7 p.m.

WWOR/Ch. 9 will keep tabs on Mandela Wednesday through Friday during "Nine Broadcast Plaza," beginning at 10 a.m., including Friday's address to the United Nations.

WNYW/Ch. 5 plans live coverage of the Mandelas' arrival, beginning on "Good Day New York" Wednesday at 7 a.m. The main events later in the day and on Thursday will be carried live.

WNBC/Ch. 4 plans live and taped coverage of most events.

WCBS/Ch. 2 will show the arrival live; some parts of the tickertape parade and the City Hall reception live.

CNN will air live coverage of the main events all three days beginning at 10:30 a.m.

All-news radio stations WINS (1010 AM) and WCBS (880 AM) will carry regular bulletins throughout the

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REQUEST OF THE BUREAU:

Conduct psycholinguistic analysis of unsub based on enclosed letters from unsub.

Enclosed for the bureau are xerox copies of 6 typewritten letters from unsub which were received via the U.S. mail by victim, DONALD IMUS, who is a radio personality on WFAN radio at New York City. Also enclosed is a copy of a New York Post article on the victim to provide some background information.

A total of 7 letters were received by victim and were addressed to the Manhattan sales office of WFAN radio. The first letter was destroyed by victim but he advised that it contained threats similar to those in the other 6 letters, and it was definitely from the same unsub. Victim's office and studio are at Astoria, Queens, New York but the only address shown in the New York telephone directory for WFAN is the Manhattan address. Victim frequently mentions on the air that he is located at Kaufman Studios at Astoria but subject is apparently unaware of the address there or that the victim is at Astoria and not New York City. The return addresses on the 3 envelopes that were retained by victim are all of real persons living at New Jersey who advised that they had no knowledge of subject or the letters. All 3 addresses were listed in telephone directories, and these three envelopes bore New Jersey postmarks.

Victim's program frequently jokes about every racial and ethnic groups

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as well as homosexuals, prominent public figures and current news events. One of victim's fictional comedy characters is touted as having three testicals. This could be what unsub refers to in the letter dated May 14, 1990. Victim has [redacted]

[redacted] Unsub refers to [redacted] in one of the threats. Unsub threatens victim's wife in one letter but victim advised that he is divorced 10 years, has not seen his wife [redacted] in some time and does not mention his ex-wife or marital status on the air. Victim is a white male and has, in several comedy skits, joked about black male homosexuals desiring sex with him.

Victim advised that he has received no threatening telephone calls concerning the letters and has not received such threatening mail before. Should any additional background information on victim be needed by psycholinguistic examiners, contact SA [redacted] New York, x3246, Squad C-19.

Enclosed for the Bureau are six original typewritten letters and three original envelopes. The letters were received via US mail by victim, DONALD IMUS, who is a New York City area radio personality on WFAN radio, which broadcasts from KAUFMAN STUDIOS, Astoria (Queens), NY.

The letters were provided to FBI NY by [redacted] a private investigator hired by victim. The letters were all addressed to victim at the stations sales office address in Manhattan and were then sent to the station at Astoria, Queens, NY, by the sales office. The letters dated May 8, 9, 14 and 17 were opened and handled by numerous station personnel. The envelopes for the letters dated May 8, 9 and 14 were destroyed. Victim hired private investigator [redacted] to open the letters dated May 25 and 28 and who then had them processed for latent prints at a private laboratory in New York City. This occurred before FBI NY was notified of the threats on June 7, 1990.

The letters contain threats of physical violence toward victim, his spouse and [redacted]. Victim denies any knowledge of who may be sending the letters. The envelopes have return addresses of persons who, according to private investigator [redacted], are real persons in NJ who have denied any knowledge of the letters. Victim has been instructed to notify FBI NY immediately of any additional letters and to avoid handling the letters so that they can be examined by FBI Laboratory.

DONALD IMUS was interviewed at his place of employment. He was advised of the identities of the interviewing agents and that the investigation concerned threatening letters received by IMUS. IMUS provided the following information:

DONALD IMUS is a radio personality employed at WFAN RADIO, Kaufman Studios, Astoria Queens, New York (NY), (718) 706-7690. In May, 1990, IMUS received seven letters through the United States (US) Mail from someone using the name [redacted]. The letters contained threats of physical violence toward IMUS, his "wife" and [redacted]. IMUS threw away the first letter which arrived during the first week of May. He believed that it was just crank mail. After he started getting some more letters, he contacted the BEAU DIETL COMPANY, a private investigating firm in NY, who sent out an investigator, [redacted]. IMUS provided the letters to [redacted], who contacted the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

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At this point in the interview, DONALD IMUS was shown copies of six typewritten letters dated May 8, May 9, May 14, May 17, May 25, and May 28, 1990. These were the letters provided to the agent by [redacted]. DONALD IMUS was shown these letters and he acknowledged that they were the letters he was speaking of. IMUS advised that the letters were received at the WFAN sales office located in Manhattan. The letters were then sent by the sales office to him at his studio in Queens, NY.

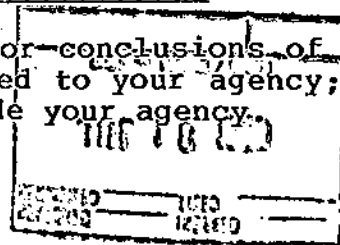
DONALD IMUS has no knowledge of [redacted] and he suspects he might be a white person who is using a false name in an attempt to portray himself as a black male. IMUS has no knowledge of the persons or street addresses on the return address portion of the envelopes, i.e. [redacted] and [redacted].

IMUS recalled that about three or four months ago, he received what he described as "vile letter" and some telephone calls. He advised that the letter was handwritten and that it was nothing like these six letters. That letter and the telephone calls contained no threats and were from a person who identified himself as [REDACTED] IMUS has received letters from [REDACTED] for years and has spoken to him on the telephone. He describes [REDACTED] as a black male and believes that he is harmless. [REDACTED] has called IMUS a "racist" and a "Jew" but IMUS believes that there has never been any threats towards him by [REDACTED].

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DONALD IMUS admits that some of his comedy skits on the radio are sometimes seen as offensive by some, but he could think of no recent programs or changes in programming that may have triggered these letters. IMUS has never received letters containing threats of violence such as these seven letters he received in May, 1990. He has never received any threats toward members of his family until now. IMUS advised that he is not married. He has been divorced for about ten years and his former wife [REDACTED]. IMUS never mentions having a wife on the radio, but he has mentioned that [REDACTED]. IMUS has [REDACTED] in the NY City area. [REDACTED] is named [REDACTED] and another is [REDACTED]. IMUS occasionally mentions the names [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on the air and suspects that that is how [REDACTED] would have heard of [REDACTED]. IMUS recalled that a week or so ago, he was called at his residence by the doorman at approximately 5:00 AM. The doorman told him that there was a white male adult at the desk who said he had an appointment to speak with IMUS. IMUS told the doorman that he had no such appointment. The doorman called him back later and told him that the man returned with two other white men and then left the area when told by the doorman to leave. IMUS has no knowledge of who this person was and does not know if it was connected to the letters.

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IMUS was advised by the interviewing agents to contact them immediately if any more letters like these are received. He was advised not to open the letters but to preserve them as evidence for the agents.

DONALD IMUS is described as a white male who resides at [REDACTED] NY, NY; Date of Birth (DOB) [REDACTED] July 23, 1940.

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[redacted] was interviewed at his business office at his request. He was advised of the identities of the interviewing agents and that the investigation concerned alleged threatening letters to DONALD IMUS. [redacted] provided the following information:

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[redacted] is a retired NEW YORK CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT (NYCPD) Detective and now is a private investigator. His business is called [redacted]

[redacted] New York, [redacted] [redacted] has done some private investigating work for a private investigating company called BEAU DIETEL & ASSOCIATES at New York City, (212) 517-3334. In May, 1990, he was hired by BEAU DIETEL INCORPORATED to provide bodyguard service for WFAN (New York) radio personality DONALD IMUS. It appeared that IMUS had gotten some threatening letters and that IMUS or the station attorneys had contacted BEAU DIETEL for security. [redacted] met IMUS at the radio station which is located at Kaufman Studios, 34-12 36th Street, Astoria, Queens, New York. There, [redacted] was given four letters and one envelope. According to the staff at WFAN radio, the envelopes for the first three letters had been thrown away inadvertently. The letters were all typewritten and were dated May 8, May 9, May 14, and May 17, 1990. According to IMUS, all of the letters were received through the U.S. Mail at the Sales Office for WFAN. All of the letters were typewritten and the envelopes were addressed with a typewriter. They were addressed to "Don Imus, WFAN Radio, 1372 Broadway, New York, N.Y.". There was no zip code on the envelope. The return address on the envelope which enclosed the fourth letter (letter dated May 17, 1990) had a return address of [redacted] [redacted] N.J., [redacted]. These four letters and one envelope had been handled by numerous persons at the WFAN studio prior to being received by [redacted].

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[redacted] spent two weeks as IMUS' bodyguard during the period May 23 through June 3, 1990. [redacted] stayed with IMUS during IMUS' waking hours from 3:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. He would follow IMUS from IMUS' apartment at [redacted] New York,

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N.Y. to the WFAN studios. He stayed at the studio and then followed IMUS back to his apartment. No threatening letters were received during that period.

[redacted] advised that the address, 1370 Broadway, is the address for the WFAN Sales Office. Only about three persons work there. They do not have anything to do with the station or the broadcasting except the sales of advertising. When these letters were received at the Sales Office, the personnel there sent the letters to the WFAN studio for IMUS. There, employees at the WFAN station opened the letters for IMUS.

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[redacted] advised that after he finished his bodyguard detail, two more letters were received by IMUS at the WFAN studio. These letters were dated May 25 and May 28, 1990. [redacted] was contacted by the station and he went to the station to pick up the envelopes and letters. These envelopes had not been opened so [redacted] was the first person to open the envelopes and remove the letters. He wore gloves while doing this in order to avoid contaminating any evidence. When he opened the envelopes, it was apparent that they were from the same author who had sent the other four letters to IMUS. The author of the letters did not sign the letters but used the name [redacted] in the signature block of all the letters. [redacted] brought these last two letters and envelopes ALL CITY INVESTIGATIONS, (718) 232-3202, which is a private laboratory. There, [redacted] processed these letters for latent fingerprints. [redacted] noted that the words "Route 19" on one of the envelopes had been put there by personnel in the mail room of WFAN. The last two letters contained threats of violence against IMUS. The letter dated May 25 was contained in an envelope with a return address of [redacted] [redacted] N.J., [redacted] The envelope was addressed to "Don Imus, WFAN Radio, 1373 Broadway, New York, N.Y." [redacted] marked the envelope with an identification number 6890AB for identification purposes. The letter dated May 28 was contained in an envelope with a return address of [redacted] [redacted] N.Y., [redacted] The envelope was addressed to

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"Donald Imus" at the same sales office address. [redacted] marked the envelope with identification number 68901AB.

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The envelope with the return address of [redacted] had a postmark "Paterson, N.J. 075 PN 25 May, 1990". The envelope with the return address of [redacted] had a postmark of "Newark, N.J. 2A071, PN 18 May, 1990". The envelope with the return address of [redacted] had a postmark that was difficult to read. It appeared to be "Paterson, N.J. PN 28 May, 1990".

After seeing the last two threatening letters, [redacted] felt that the FBI should be notified. [redacted] then contacted the FBI Office and advised them of the threats. [redacted] recalled that during his security detail with DONALD IMUS, there was one threatening telephone call which occurred on May 23. It was received at the WFAN studio and it was shortly after IMUS had done a comedy bit on the arrest of VINCENT "Chin" GIGANTE, a New York Organized Crime figure. The called sounded like a white male and said "I want to talk to Imus. He's not getting out of the studio alive today. He's making fun at the "Chin". He's making fun at me. He can't make fun at me, not me. I'll get him." [redacted] does not believe that this call is connected to the letters.

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[redacted] went to New Jersey and did some checking on the return addresses. He noted that the names that appeared on the return addresses are listed in the telephone books for the respective cities. The zip codes are not in the phone book.

[redacted] learned that the return address of [redacted] is an [redacted] at [redacted] N.J. [redacted] spoke to the office manager, [redacted], and a Doctor [redacted] about the letter. They had no knowledge of [redacted] anyone who may have been responsible for the letter. No employees there or patients, to their knowledge, are former WFAN employees.

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The name [redacted] is listed in the phone book with telephone number [redacted]. The address is that of a an Old Age Home for Women. It is called [redacted].

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There is a woman there in her 80s who's last name is [REDACTED]. She has a grandson, [REDACTED] whose name is listed in the telephone book at the [REDACTED] address. [REDACTED] attempted to speak with the woman but was not allowed to speak with her by the retirement home personnel. [REDACTED] left a message for her family to contact him. [REDACTED] was contacted by an individual who identified himself as her son, [REDACTED] who was very upset because [REDACTED] had attempted to contact his mother. [REDACTED] hung up on the telephone. [REDACTED] has not spoken to [REDACTED] or his mother since then. [REDACTED] thought it was unusual that [REDACTED] name would be listed in the telephone book with her telephone number. [REDACTED] is not a former WFAN employee. Also at [REDACTED] is a small college, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] checked with the college administration and found no one in the administration with the name [REDACTED].

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Concerning the return address of [REDACTED], [REDACTED] found that the [REDACTED], N.J. address goes to a 20 or more unit apartment building. He checked at the building and could find no such name among the residents. He interviewed some of the residents and they advised that they did not recall the name. [REDACTED] advised that he believes that the author of the letters is picking the names from the telephone book for some unknown reason.

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[REDACTED] advised that after talking to the WFAN station personnel, he learned that there is one former WFAN employee, [REDACTED] who resides in [REDACTED] N.J. His last known address is [REDACTED] N.J., [REDACTED], and [REDACTED]. This address was good as of one year ago. [REDACTED] is not sure when [REDACTED] left employment, but it was within the past two years. This address for [REDACTED] is approximately three train stops from New York City. The train stops between the Presidential Boulevard address and New York City include Paterson, N.J., S. Paterson, N.J., Clifton, N.J., and Passaic, N.J. [REDACTED] advised that someone could have dropped the letters in mail boxes at these stops.

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[REDACTED] advised that DONALD IMUS told him of an incident that occurred on May 19, 1990 at IMUS' residence. IMUS was called at about 5:00 a.m. that morning by the doorman who told him that a white male had come to his apartment asking to see IMUS. The doorman told IMUS that this person said he had an interview scheduled with IMUS. IMUS told him that there was no interview scheduled at 5:00 a.m. and hung up. The white male returned with a second white male who identified himself as [REDACTED]. A third white male was waiting outside the building at [REDACTED]. They left when the doorman would not let them in. [REDACTED] said that according to DON IMUS, this is very unusual for someone to come to his apartment asking to see him.

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[REDACTED] advised Detective [REDACTED] of the NYCPD, 114 Precinct, of the threats in this case. U.S. Postal Inspector [REDACTED] at JFK Airport, [REDACTED], has also been advised of the threatening letters.

The best time to call for DON IMUS at the radio station is between 10:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, (718) 706-7690. IMUS is at the station from 5:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. IMUS finishes his radio program at 10:00 a.m. and then spends the next four hours working on comedy skits for the following days. Everyone in the WFAN station knows about the threatening letters. They know that [REDACTED] was there as a bodyguard.

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[REDACTED] advised that he would contact this agent if he learned of any more information concerning the letters, but added that he has been hired only for a few more days to work on this matter and that after that, he would not be working on this case unless requested by IMUS or the WFAN station.

[REDACTED] provided this agent with six original letters from [REDACTED] dated May 8, 9, 14, 17, 25, and 28, 1990. He also provided this agent with three original envelopes which had contained the last three letters. These items were taken as evidence by the interviewing agents.

Photofacsimiles of six, one-page, typewritten communications were transmitted through the Laboratory with request for psycholinguistic evaluation.

There are similarities of content and style of sufficient number and distinctiveness in all of these communications as to warrant the investigative conclusion of identical origins.

Based upon an analysis of the style and content of these communications, it is my judgment that the author is a high-school educated, Black male approximately between the ages of 25 and 40. The letters are well formed and the level of grammar, punctuation and syntax evidenced in the communications are indicative of above average intelligence. The choice of surname for his pseudonym, considering the prevalence of phallic ideation in the communications, might well represent an association with [REDACTED], the pornographic film star.

The mentation expressed in these communications is consistent with what might be expected from an author who is either homosexual or is expressing latent homosexual fantasies. It is clear that the author intends these homosexual innuendos as sarcasm. However, his psychic investment in these images suggests more than mere bantering. Although this form of communication is outside the boundaries of the typical genre of "fan mail," there is no evidence of the self-destructive and/or reality-loosening ideation which experience and research associate with the immediate precursors of violence. The threats are couched in the vague and future-indefinite terms associated more with ventilative hyperbole than with the threat of imminent action. While it is likely that the UNSUB may author additional communications, he fails to demonstrate either the determination or the resolve to escalate his behavior beyond this level of harassment.

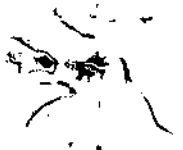

Victim has not reported any additional letters from Unsub. Investigation by Newark, FBI was unsuccessful at identifying Unsub from the three return addresses on the envelopes. Laboratory examination revealed no latent prints that meet criteria for automated search. Search of Anonymous Letter File was negative.
