

## An Updated Checklist of the Birds of Iran

### INTRODUCTION

The present checklist of the birds of Iran has its origins in a preliminary checklist compiled by personnel of the Ornithology Unit in the Iran Department of the Environment in the early 1970s (Scott 1973) during the preparation of *The Birds of Iran* – a field guide to the birds of Iran published in Persian by the Department of the Environment in 1975 (Scott *et al.* 1975). This preliminary checklist was based to a large extent on a provisional checklist of the birds of Iran by Jervis Read (1958) and the seminal works of Hüe & Etchécopar (1970) and Érard & Etchécopar (1970). *The Birds of Iran* and associated checklist (Scott 1975) listed a total of 490 species which were believed to have occurred in Iran at that time. Thirty-two of these were listed as “accidentals”.

The checklist was updated on several occasions during the 1990s, initially in conjunction with compilation of information on Important Bird Areas in Iran for BirdLife International, and latterly as a basis for the species list in the chapter on birds in *A Guide to the Fauna of Iran*, published in Persian in 2000 (Firouz 2000). This book lists 502 species for Iran. Further updating was carried out in 2002 during the preparation of the revised and enlarged edition of Firouz’s book, which was published in English in 2005 (Firouz 2005). This edition listed a total of 514 species of birds believed to occur in Iran. The discrepancy between the two editions of Firouz’s book was due partly to the inclusion of several species that had been recorded for the first time in Iran in the intervening years, and partly to the adoption of recent taxonomic changes that had

elevated former subspecies to full specific status.

The present list is a further update of the list adopted by Firouz (2005), and contains 517 species. Three of the species listed by Firouz (2005) have been omitted: Upland Buzzard *Buteo hemilasius*, Roseate Tern *Sterna dougallii* and Hume’s Owl *Strix butleri*. Hollom *et al.* (1988) refer to an old record of Upland Buzzard from south-eastern Iran, but the source of this information is unknown, and Porter *et al.* (1996) excluded the species from their list of the birds of the Middle East. The only record of Roseate Tern in Iran is a report by I. Green and J. Overfield of one or two seen off Hormoz Island in the Persian Gulf during a natural history tour in October 2000, but the record has never been adequately documented. As regards Hume’s Owl, it has often been suggested that this species could occur in southern Iran, but there do not appear to have been any confirmed records. Six species have been added to the list. Three of these result from recent taxonomic changes, with Green Warbler *Phylloscopus nitidus*, Desert Whitethroat *Sylvia minula* and Hume’s Whitethroat *S. althaea* now being given full specific status. One species, the Oriental White-eye *Zosterops palpebrosus*, was first recorded as long ago as the 1970s, but the original report by Reynolds (1978) was overlooked by the authors until 2005, when the species was rediscovered in south-eastern Iran by Hamidi (2006). Two other new species have been added to the Iranian list in recent years: the River Tern *Sterna aurantia* (Foekens & Schlevis 2006) and Basra Reed Warbler *Acrocephalus griseldis* (H. Buck, pers. comm.). The latter presumably breeds in the extensive marshes

of the Hawr Al Azim on the Iran/Iraq border, but this huge wetland appears never to have been surveyed by ornithologists during the breeding season.

Several other potentially new species for Iran have been reported within the last few years, e.g. Oriental Pratincole *Glareola maldivarum* (WIWO in prep.), Sabine's Gull *Larus sabini* (Amini & Sehhatisabet 2005) and Asian Brown Flycatcher *Ficedula daurica* (Sehhatisabet in press), but these have been excluded from the present list pending further confirmation and/or publication of the records.

In the following checklist, the sequence of families follows Morony *et al.* (1975). The sequence and treatment of species within families and the scientific nomenclature mostly follow Sibley & Monroe (1990, 1993). The English names mostly follow Beaman & Madge (1998),

with some commonly used alternatives given in brackets. The Persian names are taken from the *Encyclopaedia of Birds* (Adhami 2005) published by the Great Persian Encyclopaedia Foundation. This new nomenclature has been approved by the Ornithology Council of the Foundation\*\*, and includes most of the Persian names used in *A field guide to the birds of Iran* (Mansoori 2001). Alternative names used by Scott *et al.* (1975) and Firouz (2000) are given in brackets.

The checklist includes 29 species that are considered to be globally threatened or near-threatened by BirdLife International (2000): three in the category Critical (CR); one Endangered; 12 Vulnerable (VU); one Conservation Dependent (CD); two Data Deficient (DD); and ten Near Threatened (NT).

Some indication of the status of each species is given as follows:

R - common resident (breeding; present year round)

r - scarce resident

S - common summer visitor (breeding)

s - scarce summer visitor

(b) - may breed

W - common winter visitor

w - scarce winter visitor

Vw - scarce and irregular winter visitor (less than annual)

P - common passage migrant (in spring and/or autumn)

p - scarce passage migrant

Vp - scarce and irregular passage migrant (less than annual)

O - common non-breeding visitor to the Persian Gulf and/or Gulf of Oman

Vo - scarce and irregular visitor to the Persian Gulf and/or Gulf of Oman

V - vagrant (fewer than five records)

? - status uncertain

I - introduced by man

An asterisk denotes that there have been no records for at least 50 years.

**\*\* The Editor:** In this checklist, some new Persian names are used, e.g. for Pelicans, Cormorants, Egrets, and Ibises. We still need to give Persian name for the ESTRILDIDAE, Pipits, Booby, etc. Readers are encouraged to give their suggestions.
