

The University of Calgary Chancellor Role and Responsibilities

ROLE

The Chancellor acts as the Chair of the Senate, presides over degree-conferring ceremonies at the university and acts as an ambassador in advancing the interests of the university and the post-secondary education sector.

RESPONSIBILITIES

In carrying out this role, the Chancellor will have the following responsibilities:

- 1. Act as the Chair of the Senate;
- 2. Grant, on the authorization of the Senate, an honorary degree on a person. Selection of recipients to be granted an Honorary Degree is done in conjunction with the President and Vice-Chancellor;
- 3. In conjunction with the President and Vice-Chancellor, select Order of the University of Calgary (OTUC) recipients;
- 4. Preside over all degree-conferring ceremonies of the university, including the presentation of Honorary Degrees and OTUCs;
- 5. Participate in activities that advance the university's interests as agreed to by the Chancellor and the President and Vice-Chancellor or the Vice-President (University Relations);
- 6. Participate in Development activities for the university as agreed to by the Chancellor and the President and Vice-Chancellor; and
- 7. Serve as a member of the Governors of the University of Calgary.
