## **Background**

Created in 1895 when the private libraries of John Jacob Astor and James Lenox were consolidated with the Samuel Jones Tilden Trust, The New York Public Library (NYPL) comprises simultaneously a set of scholarly research collections, a network of community libraries, and a range of robust digital resources available through the Internet and its libraries. NYPL's intellectual and cultural range is global and attuned to local New York City issues. That combination lends to the Library an extraordinary diversity and richness.

The Library is a privately managed, nonprofit corporation with a public mission, operating with both private and public financing in a century-old, still-evolving partnership.

Catherine Marron serves as Chairman of the Library's Board of Trustees. Dr. Paul LeClerc serves as the Library's President.

The research collections, numbering more than 44 million items, and located in four major centers, resemble the holdings of the great national and university libraries. The community circulating libraries offer a wide range of free services, including literacy tutoring, English-language instruction, computer training, and computer access. Online resources include reference databases, digital collections, and downloadable books, audio books, films, and music.
