General Admission Requirements

• National Senior Certificate (NSC)

The statutory minimum requirements for degree studies is a National Senior Certificate (NSC) certified by Umalusi, with an achievement rating of 4 (50-59%) in four recognised NSC 20-credit subjects from the designated subject list, below

- Accounting
- Agricultural Science
- Business Studies (previously Business Economics)
- Consumer Studies (previously Home Economics)
- Dramatic Arts
- Economics
- Engineering Graphics and Design (previously Technical Drawing)
- Geography
- History
- Information Technology
- Languages *
- Life Sciences (previously Biology)
- Mathematical Literacy
- Mathematics
- Music
- Physical Science (previously Natural Sciences)
- Religion Studies
- Visual Arts

* With regard to the medium of instruction, the University uses two official languages, namely English and Afrikaans. In formal teaching, the medium of instruction is **either** English **or** Afrikaans, **or both of these languages** provided that there is a demand and that it is academically and economically justifiable. However, it remains the student's responsibility to ascertain on an annual basis in which language a course and any further level of that course is presented. In respect of administrative and other services, a student has the right to choose whether the University should communicate with him or her in English or Afrikaans.

Provisional admission is based on the results obtained in the final Grade 11 examination. Please note the final Grade 12 results remain the determining factor with regard to admission.

Please note that the achievement of the minimum

requirements does **not** necessarily guarantee admission to any programme or field of study.

• Calculation of Admission Point Score

The Admission Point Score (APS) is calculated based on a candidate's achievement in any SIX 20-credit recognised subjects (not only designated subjects) by using the National Senior Certificate 1-7 Rating Scale of Achievement (see Table 1).

Life Orientation is a 10-credit subject, but this subject is EXCLUDED when calculating APS. The University of Pretoria, however, requires an achievement level 4 (50-59%), or more, in Life Orientation.

International Students

International students will be required to present a Full or Foreign Exemption Certificate should they wish to enrol for undergraduate studies at the University of Pretoria.

Full or foreign conditional exemption certificate

This is a prerequisite for all students wanting to enrol for undergraduate studies at the University of Pretoria. This certificate can only be obtained from Higher Education South Africa (HESA). To obtain this endorsement or certificate, you have

Candidates with an APS of **21, 22 or 23**, who have already been admitted on their Grade 11 results and no longer comply with the minimum requirements as stated above in the final Grade 12 examination, may write the entrance test in January 2010. The Faculty's Admissions Committee will reconsider these applications for placement in the **Humanities Extended Programme (01130000)** after the results of the admission test are available. The admission of candidates with an APS of 24-25 can be considered depending on places available.
