

Black Rapids Training Area

Description

The Black Rapids Training Site (BRTS) is made up of 3,807 acres, and is located 30 miles south of Delta Junction, next to the Delta River. The BRTS is to the east of Fort Greely and the Donnelly Training Area. This training area is surrounded by a mixture of private and public land. The BRTS is self sufficient, with a water filtration system in place and power that runs from onsite generators. The BRTS barracks can accommodate 100 students and 30 cadre at one time. There are male and female latrines and showers. There is also one large classroom, equipped with smart boards, that can accommodate 100 students and one small classroom. The dining facility (DFAC) onsite can feed 130 within 1.5 hours.

Courses for the U.S. Army Northern Warfare Training Center (NWTC) are conducted at the BRTS while the NWTC is based at Fort Wainwright. The NWTC provides training in demanding cold weather and mountain environments. There is glacier access 30 miles south of BRTS used for the Basic Mountaineering Course. There is a 12 lane Land Navigation Site at BRTS that is point certified by both military and civilian survey teams. No points are within 300 meters of each other and elevation points range from 2K' to 6K' levels.

Training venues at Black Rapids Training Site include:

- Land Navigation Site
- High Angle Marksmanship Range
- Rock site with permanent protections
- Small Arms Range: 25M
- Ski lift, downhill skill runs, and 5 and 10 km cross country trails
