## Abstract

This report contains historical population and employment by minor civil division. Decennial population counts from 1900-2000 are listed for each township, village, and city that existed during the time period in Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, St. Clair, Washtenaw, and Wayne Counties of Southeast Michigan. Decennial employment counts by minor civil division range from 1970-2000.

## **SEMCOG releases historical population and employment figures for Southeast Michigan**

In 1900, the total population of Southeast Michigan was not quite 600,000, with fewer people then in the entire region than the population of the City of Detroit now. A century later, in 2000, Southeast Michigan's population was just over 4.8 million. With the exception of a couple of population dips in 1980 and 1990, the region has experienced steady growth.

These numbers are included in a new report, *Historical Population and Employment by Minor Civil Division*, released by SEMCOG, the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. The report has a table of decennial population counts for every county, township, village, and city in Southeast Michigan using data from U.S. Censuses since 1900. The report also contains decennial employment counts by community since 1970, based on data from the U.S. Census, U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, and the Michigan Employment Service Agency.

"There are a myriad of stories here," said Jim Rogers, Manager of SEMCOG's Data Center, who oversaw compilation of this report. "With all the community histories in one report for the first time, we can really see how the region has developed over the past century."

Some communities grew significantly in the early part of the century and then leveled off. The City of Monroe (Monroe County) went from 5,043 persons in 1900, to 18,110 in 1930, and has remained steady at about 20,000 persons ever since. Still others, mainly more rural communities, have experienced steady, but slow growth throughout the century. The Village of Pinckney (Livingston County), had 500 persons in 1900, 695 in 1950, and only 2,121 in 2000. Other communities only had a brief existence. The City of East Ann Arbor (Washtenaw County) appeared in 1950 with a

population of 1,826, was annexed by the City of Ann Arbor, and disappeared by 1960.

One community that has experienced more recent growth is the City of Farmington Hills in Oakland County. The city incorporated from a consolidation of Quakertown Village, Wood Creek Farms Village, and Farmington Township as of the 1980 census, and has grown from 58,056 persons then to 82,111 in 2000. At the same time, the city has nearly quadrupled its employment, from 22,649 in 1980 to 78,835 in 2000.

The growth of employment in the City of Farmington Hills hints at a pattern repeated throughout the region — the decentralization of employment. The top 10 employment centers held about 65 percent of the region's employment in 1970, a number which dropped to about 47 percent by 2000. Detroit was still the leading employment center in 2000, but its share of the region's employment dropped from 38 percent in 1970 to 13 percent in 2000, while six other cities exceeded the 100,000 job mark (Troy, Southfield, Ann Arbor, Dearborn, Livonia, and Warren).

The report shows many villages carving themselves out of their parent townships. Once a village reaches a sufficient population, it usually incorporates into a city. Sometimes, a township of significant population directly incorporates into a city. Annexations and reversions add to the mix of changes experienced by the minor civil divisions. In all, the region went from having 10 cities, 133 townships, and 46 villages in 1900, to 89 cities, 115 townships, and 27 villages in 2000.

Data in this report are organized by county and community. Endnotes for the population table indicate incorporations and other notes. # Historical Population and Employment Tell Story of Growth in Southeast Michigan

This report tells the rich and complex story of the Southeast Michigan region expressed as a simple table of historical population and employment by community (minor civil division). Population counts going back to 1900 reveal a region that has undergone periods of both growth and decline, and experienced waves of both internal and external migration. Employment counts going back to 1970 show steady growth and decentralization of employment. These data were originally assembled by SEMCOG for use in the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department's 50-year master planning process. Data for all townships, villages, and cities in the seven-county SEMCOG region are included in this report.

## Population trends

The region added 4.3 million people from 1900-2000, as can be seen in Table 1. At the beginning of the century, a single county, Wayne, was the large population center. A significant portion of the region's population still resided in the other six other, more rural counties. By 2000, Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb Counties had become the urbanized population centers. The more rural counties held a smaller share of the region's population, representing the shift from agrarian to urban living over the past 100 years. The pattern is also evident in the incorporations of townships and villages, whereby the region went from having 10 cities in 1900 to 89 cities in 2000.

Another striking aspect of the data can be seen in the graphics comparing population change in the centennial periods of 1900-1910 and 1990-2000 (Figures 1 and 2). At the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, cities attracted farmers and international immigrants by their opportunities for higher income in booming factories. By the end of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, city and suburban residents, enabled by inexpensive transportation, continued the suburban expansion. They were moving out to rural areas seeking space and greenery, while overall population growth had moderated. Cities and rural areas have taken turns in being desirable to residents seeking a better life in Southeast Michigan.

Figure 3 shows the period in which each minor civil division grew the most in absolute terms. Cities like Detroit and Pontiac experienced their highest growth periods in the early part of the century from 1900-1930. After a lull during the depression and war years of 1930-1950, growth resumed as a result of suburbanization and the post-war baby boom generation filling in what are now the inner-ring suburbs. Suburbanization continued during the 1970-1990 period, to places further from the traditional core city. Finally, we see the newest high-growth areas continuing to fill out the metropolitan region. This pattern is one general viewpoint of this complex data set.

## Employment trends

In Table 2, one can see significant growth in employment throughout the region during the past 30 years. This has occurred partly through the growth of large employment subcenters, such as the cities of Troy and Farmington Hills. By 2000, the seven largest employment centers each had more than 100,000 workers. Decentralization is evident by the fact that the top 10 held 64.7 percent of the region's employment in 1970, compared to 47.1 percent in 2000.

## Contents of the tables

The population table (Table 3) lists population for each decade from 1900-2000 for every minor civil division that existed during the time period. Population data were obtained from the tables of population by minor civil

division in the U.S. Census Bureau's Decennial Census publications. Footnotes indicate incorporations and other notes.

The employment table (Table 4) lists estimated employment for each decade from 1970-2000. The data were obtained from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) and SEMCOG Regional Development Forecasts. Both BEA and SEMCOG numbers are based on employment data collected by state employment insurance programs. Detailed technical documentation and raw data for both population and employment are available from the SEMCOG Data Center.

### Interpreting the figures

In Figures 1 and 2, the black outlines represent county boundaries and the gray outlines represent present-day community or minor civil division (MCD) boundaries. The counties are Livingston, Oakland, Macomb, St. Clair, Wayne, Monroe, and Washtenaw, reading clockwise from the top-left. Color shades between the two maps are not comparable. However, darkest reds are always the largest percentage decliners of the decade and darkest blues are always the largest percentage gainers of the decade. In other words, the colors indicate relative growth or decline between the MCDs in that decade. Gray shading indicates the change was not available. The inset table shows the overall trend of the decade.

### Data methodology for the figures

Since the figures only show present-day MCDs, they use an estimate of historical population based on Table 3. To estimate historical population for present day MCDs that didn't exist since 1900, population of old MCDs is added to the present day MCDs that would contain the old MCD's population. Almost all old MCDs matched completely to present day MCDs. Some of the old MCDs that became part of two or more present-day MCDs are excluded. The population of these MCDs comprised a small fraction of the regional population. Population adjustments due to annexations are not available or made, even though these may be significant. Therefore, an MCD's population gains would include gains due to both growth and annexations. Some present-day MCDs neither existed nor had any counterparts all the way back to 1900. In these cases, the population during those early decades is zero. The population growth is displayed in gray if either decade of the period is zero.

### Hierarchy of minor civil divisions in the State of Michigan

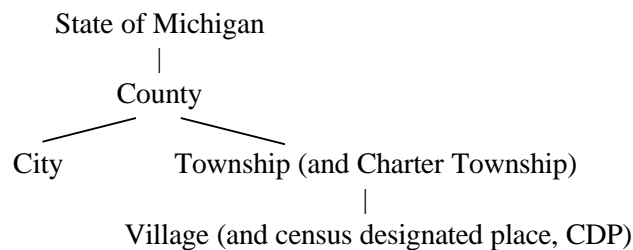

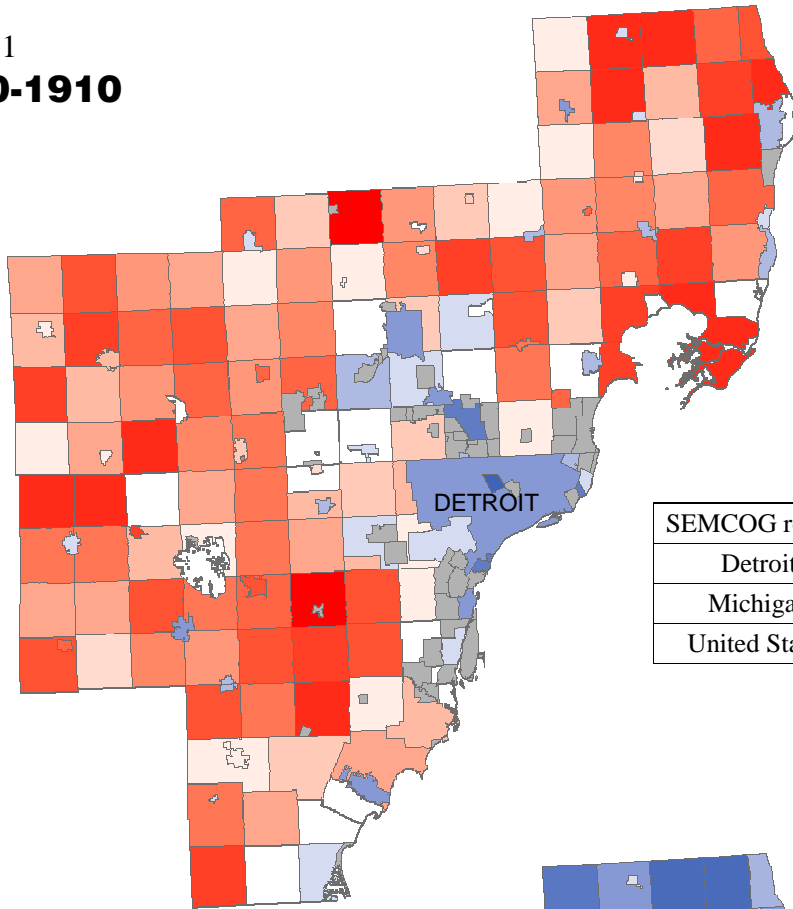

# Population Change in Centennial Periods Southeast Michigan

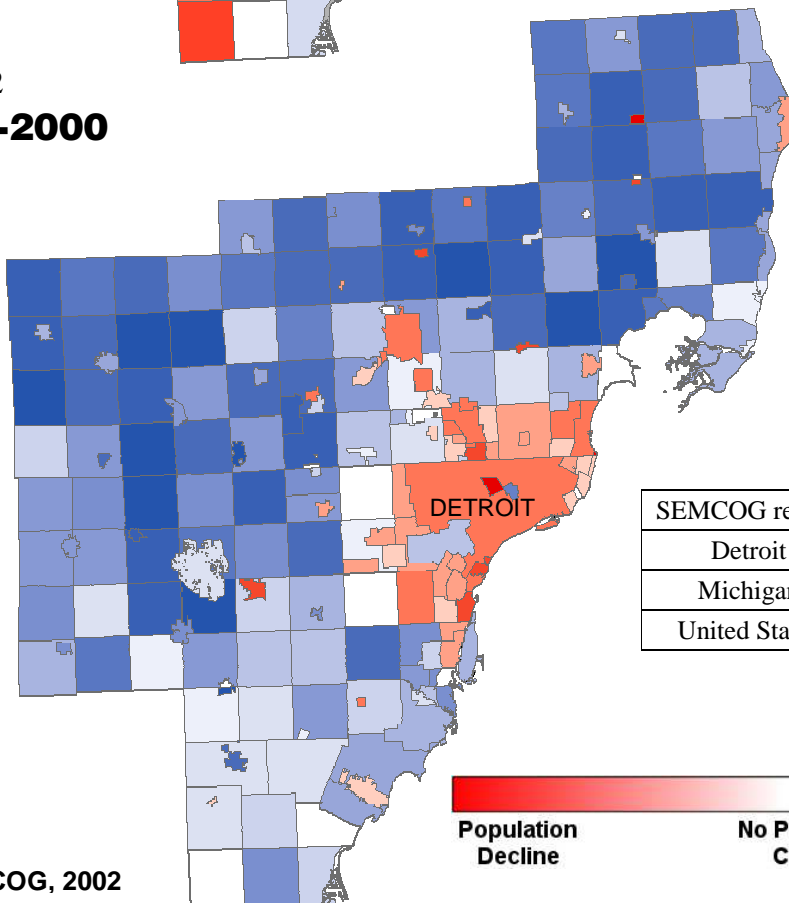

# Peak Growth Period By Community Southeast Michigan, 1900-2000

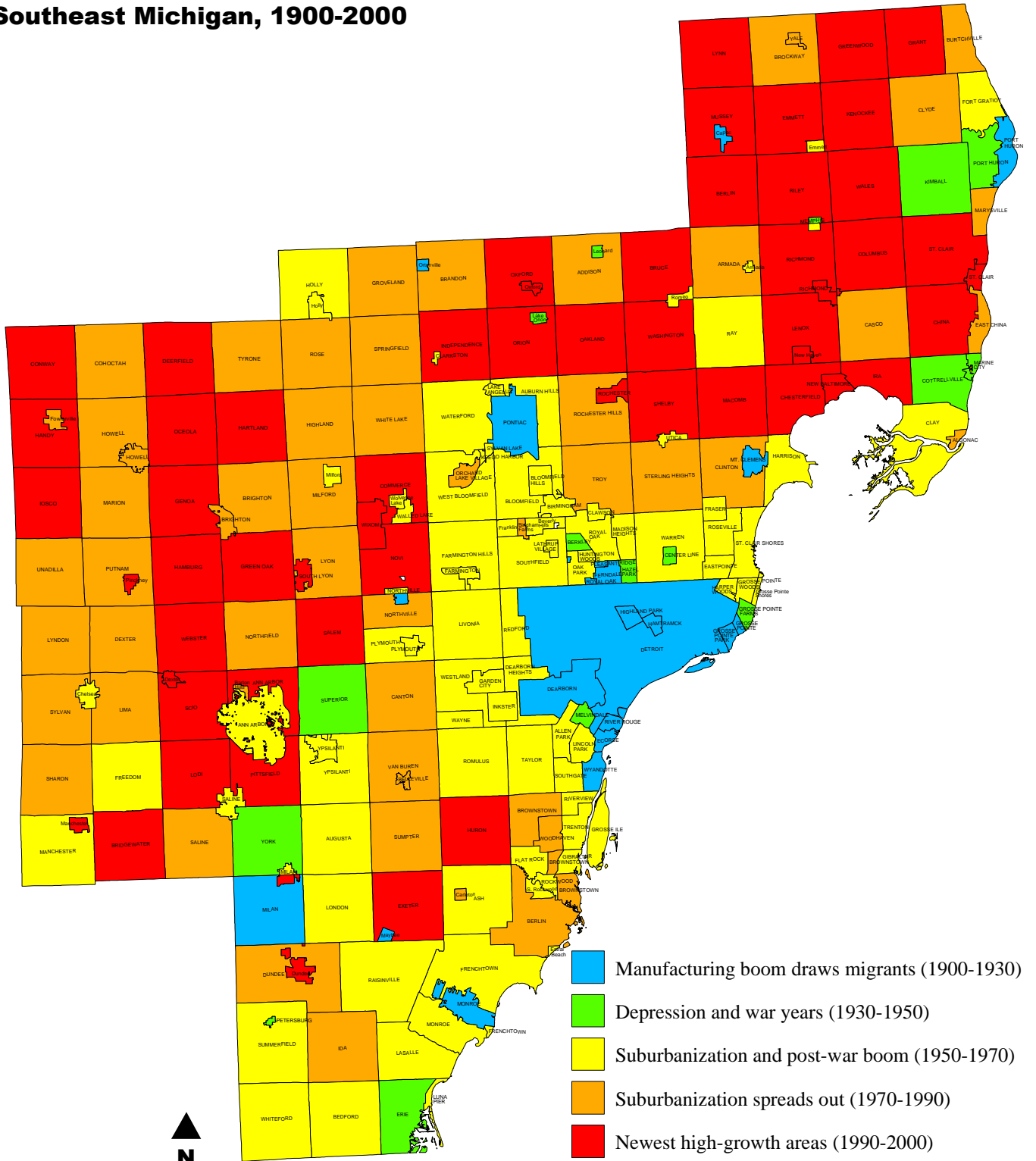

Employment numbers for 1970 and 1980 are primarily based on Census employment numbers by place of work. These numbers are adjusted for proprietors (self-employed) and other types of secondary jobs based on County Employment Estimates from the U.S. Department of Commerce Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA). 1990 and 2000 employment numbers are based on Census numbers, as well as ES202 files, controlled by BEA numbers to include all types of jobs, i.e. full-time, part-time, and self-employed.

  - 6 Incorporated as of the 1980 Census from part of Ann Arbor township.
  - 7 Clarkston village incorporated as Village of Clarkston city in 1992. (Listed as Clarkston city.)
  - 8 Incorporated as of the 1980 Census from a consolidation of Quakertown and Wood Creek Farms villages and Farmington township. The employment in the villages is not broken out separately, and is listed under Farmington township.
