

I. Command Composition and Organization:

a. Command Mission Statement.

- (1) The mission of HUÉ CITY is to conduct prompt, sustained combat operations at sea in support of national policy. HUÉ CITY was specifically designed to defend itself and other U.S. assets against attack by enemy surface ships, submarines, aircraft, and missiles. It was also designed to engage in offensive actions through employment of anti-ship and land attack missiles as well as naval gunfire.
- (2) USS HUÉ CITY is the twentieth of the Ticonderoga Class cruisers. Its Aegis Weapons System is a significant advance in fleet air defense, capable of countering current and projected threats in both open ocean and littoral environments.

January 1994 opened with USS HUE CITY in Selected Restricted Availability at Mayport, FL. This was the first SRA for HUÉ CITY and was limited in scope. Major work items included installation of a halon system shipalt, cleaning of the forward fuel tanks, refurbishing many decks, and installation of an EHF satellite communication system. On 30 January, the second annual Battle of HUÉ memorial service was held in the helicopter hanger. The ceremony and reception were very successful; well attended and heartfelt. Captain Zeimer, Commanding Officer of Mayport Naval Station, was the guest speaker.

In February, after an ammunition onload in Charleston, South Carolina, HUÉ CITY sailed in support of counter-narcotic operations in the Caribbean. Prior to arriving on station, HUÉ CITY conducted Naval Gun Fire Support Qualifications in Vieques, Puerto Rico, scoring a record 105.06 points. HUÉ CITY was then ordered into the Eastern Pacific to patrol for narcotics smugglers. In early March, HUÉ CITY transited the Panama Canal and took station off the Western coast of Columbia. On March 13th, HUÉ CITY crossed the equator, initiating many polywogs into crusty shellbacks. The ship then made a port visit to Rodman, Panama for a few days of rest and relaxation. While inport, HUE CITY crewmembers helped a local Indian Village accomplish needed repairs and construction. Following an additional two weeks on station in the Eastern Pacific, HUÉ CITY transited the Panama canal northbound. After fueling in Cartagena, Columbia, the ship sailed to Poncé, Puerto Rico for the Easter holiday. HUÉ CITY returned to Mayport on 07 April.

The month of April included a Logistics Management Assessment and the beginning of the training cycle towards deployment. Tailored Ship Training Availability One (TSTA I) began in late April with individual watchstander training. In early May, the ship sailed for Guantanamo Bay, Cuba for Refresher Training (REFTRA). After only three days in GITMO, HUÉ CITY was ordered to relieve USS THORN as COMDESRON-22 flagship in support of United Nation sanctions against Haiti. While serving as flagship, HUÉ CITY conducted the 1000th boarding of Operation Support Democracy. After several weeks off Haiti, HUÉ CITY returned to GITMO to complete REFTRA, being relieved as flagship by USS SCOTT. HUÉ CITY returned to Mayport in time for the Memorial Day weekend, arriving 29 May.

TSTA II began in early June, conducted in the local operating area. In mid-June, the ship sailed for Pensacola, Florida to serve as host platform for the Chief of Naval Education and Training change of command and VADM Kihune's retirement ceremony on 21 June. Unfortunately, inclement weather forced the ceremony to be held indoors, on base. During the return trip to Mayport, HUE CITY hosted several "Guests of the Navy" including businessmen and educators. A quick stop in Port Canaveral allowed the guests to depart and "tigers" (guests of crewmembers) to embark for the final day of transit to Mayport. HUE CITY returned to Mayport in time for the Fourth of July holiday, arriving 01 July.

After two weeks inport, HUÉ CITY headed back to the Caribbean to participate once more in Counter-Narcotics Operations. As "AW" (AAW Commander), HUÉ CITY evaluated air and surface contacts going in and out of South America, relaying information to law enforcement agencies ashore in the United States. HUÉ checked off station in late July and, after a brief ASW training opportunity with the USS STONEWALL JACKSON, returned to Mayport for an Intermediate Maintenance Availability (IMAV).

TSTA III took place in August, preparing for Final Evaluation Period (FEP) training. HUÉ CITY was the first ship in the Roosevelt Battle Group and only the third ship in the Atlantic Fleet to be administered FEP instead of Combat Systems Assessment (CSA). FEP incorporated CSA but was structured for more realism. Training was evaluated as a product of a three day scenario, forcing the ship to integrate operations, engineering, damage control, administration, and combat systems to achieve success. HUÉ CITY did extremely well during FEP, earning her Tactical Cruise Missile Qualification in the process.

Early October brought the another major examination to HUÉ CITY in the form of OPPE (Operational Propulsion Examination). HUÉ CITY had an extremely strong showing, receiving an overall grade of GOOD.

HUÉ CITY sailed in early November for Composite Training Unit Exercise (COMPTUEX) 2-94. The first week of training consisted of combined ASW exercises against opposition submarine. After evading tropical storm GORDON, ASW exercises continued until HUÉ CITY joined USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT for AAW and ELW exercises. Several live-fire exercises were conducted with HUÉ CITY's dual five inch and CIWS guns. During the Battle Group's surface-to-surface missile exercise, HUÉ CITY scored the only direct hit of the day. The highlight of COMPTUEX was a surface-to-air missile exercise that was flawlessly planned and executed by HUÉ CITY. In all, twenty missiles were shot with HUÉ scoring two-for-two with direct hits.

HUÉ CITY arrived in San Juan, Puerto Rico for the Thanksgiving holiday on 23 November. While inport, the Commanding Officer hosted a reception for local dignitaries, while volunteer crewmembers spent several days painting and repairing the Rose of Sharon Orphanage. After a quiet Thanksgiving holiday, the ship returned to sea to continue COMPTUEX. In the following week, HUÉ CITY fired two exercise torpedoes, one practice torpedo, and multiple simulated shots - all of which were evaluated as acquiring their targets. A three day "hostilities" phase ended the exercise, incorporating every aspect of naval warfighting to counter opposing air, surface, and subsurface assets. During this phase, HUÉ CITY refined her "AW" skills while also conducting strike warfare via multiple simulated Tomahawk firings.

Following COMPTUEX on 05 December, HUÉ CITY sailed directly from the Puerto Rican OPAREA to Charleston, SC in order to complete her pre-deployment ammunition on-load. Following the onload, HUÉ CITY departed enroute Mayport, again with "tigers" embarked, arriving on 15 December in time to participate in a visit by the CNO to Mayport. The Christmas holiday leave period began on 16 December, highlighted by the annual Christmas party which was held at the beautiful Ponté Vedra Inn & Club. HUÉ CITY ended the year as it had begun- in an IMAV period; preparing to deploy to the Mediterranean Sea in March 1995.
