Capturing the sweep of the U.S. Navy's history during the conflict that solidified the young American republic's standing is the goal of ***The Naval War of 1812: A Documentary History***. This series was originally conceived in 1978 and researched and written over more than four decades.

This final volume surveys the war at sea in the Atlantic and Gulf Coast theaters in 1814 and 1815, encompassing such significant events as the British naval blockade of the U.S. East Coast, U.S. Navy actions at the Battle of New Orleans, and the war's last naval engagements in early 1815. Volume IV includes 1,230 pages of primary source documents and expert commentary; art, tables, and charts; and an extensive index.
