## Command organization and Relations

USS FIATTE was commanded by Captain William ... ADA'S until his relief by Captain Hareld F. SNOWDEN on 12 June 1967 during a defendents day's wise. Captain ShowDEN commanded FIATTE throughout the remainder of the year.

ATTE's homeport was efficially changed from San Fedre to long Beach during the year. Her administrative commander wears two hats as Commander Service Group CNE and Commander, Service Squadron CNE, and his headquarters are in San Diego. Commander, Service Forces Facific, is FIATTE's type commender and is headquartered in Fearl Earbor, Hawaii.

as a fleet eiler, "LATTE is built for and assigned the continuing mission of transporting and transferring to Mavy ships at sea Mavy Special Fuel oil (known in the fleet as MSFO or "black oil"), Jr-5, aviation jet fuel (a clase equivalent to high grade diesel fuel), and high octane aviation gasoline. AATTE also carries supplies of bottled gases and drums of lubricating oil and automotive gasoline which may be drawn upon by units of the fleet as they come alongside for refueling. This operating in the mestern racific alatter assigned the task of carrying freight, mail and personnel to ships operating on stations removed from the lambased supporting facilities.

## Operations

. LATTE started off 1967 in Todd Shipyard, fan Fedre, California undergeing a regular shipyard overhaul. She remained there until 25 April, when she went to sea for the first time in almost five months for sea trials.

Ifter sea trials and fleet exercises, FIATTE arrived in San Diege en 13 May for Mefresher Training where she remained until 2 June. Meady to carry out her mission, the FLATTE went back to long Jeach for leave and unkeep before deploying to LSTIAC. On 12 June the FLATTE held a combination Change of Command and Dependents buy cruise, when Ca tain Mareld F. SNOWDEW relieved Captain Milliam Marie as Commanding Officer. Over 100 dependents enjoyed a day out at sea along the Southern California coast.

The following day on 13 June with FLATTE's fuel tanks leaded, she departed San Fedre bound for the Western Facific.

On 22 June the FATTH stapped in Hawaii for an unkeep seried where she remained until 13 July. Once again taking a westerly heading the rLATTH steamed on towards the chilip ines.

Fleet en 22 July. On 27 July landfall was made as inaTTE entered the San Barmadino Straits. The next day FLATTE tied up at the fuel der U.S. Naval Station, Subic By, epublic of the milliprines. On 29 July LaTTE left port ready to fulfill her consistments to the operating forces in and near Victnamese waters.

Inclusure (2)

on 1 August the FLATTE arrived in the Gulf of Tonkin for her first replenishment of 1967 in Vietnam waters. The USS OLISKARY (CVA-34) and her destroyer escorts came alongside and were topied off with ASFO and Ja-5. After spending another day in the Gulf of Tonkin the FLATTE steamed south along the Vietnam coast refueling the various gunfire suport units. On 6 august with her first line trip coapleted, the PLATTE headed back to Subic Bay.

During the next two months PLATTE made 4 more line trips. These line trips would start at the southern tip of Vietnam in the Gulf of Siam and all TTE would work her way up the coast of Vietnam refueling minesweepers, Coast Guard cutters and gunfire support ships. Ifter four days in Market Time, the FIATTE would usually spend three days in the Gulf of Tenkin refueling the various units located there. This usually ended with a consulidation to a larger piler and then a run back to Subic May to relead fuel once again. The FLATTE averaged about 35 ships alongside during one line trip.

On 10 october the PLATTA arrived in Kasshiung, Taiwan for her first visit to a AMSTRAC port other than Subic Bay. After spending 3 days here the PLATTE steamed south to Subic Bay to lead out freight and mail, ready once again for another market Time run.

After finishing another line trip on 30 octaber the JATTE headed northeast toward the Formosa Straits. After passing through the Strait and into the Last China Sea, the FLATTE arrived in Sasebe, Japan on 4 November for two weeks of well-deserved upkeep. The FLATTE had been on the go for three straight wonths with not more than three days at a time in port. During this three-wonth period, the LATTE transferred more than 21 million gallons of fuel.

On 16 Nevember LATTE departed Sasebe and steamed south towards Subic Bay. After a quick load out she headed towards the southern tip of Vietnam for a short Market Time run. This Market Time run was shortened because . LATTE was called on to travel to Sunda Straits between Java and Sunatra to refuel the USS INTIEFID (CVS-11) on her way back to Norfelk via the Indian ocean.

Laving this opportunity to steam to almost 7 degrees south latitude the LATTE crossed the Equator on 2 December and a suitable ceremony permitted all pollyways to be initiated into the Salemn Mysteries of the Ancient order of the Deep. Sunday found the crew recovered from their transformation from levely pollyways to esteemed shellbacks.

The USS LITRE: ID (CVS-11) was refueled on 4 December and LATTE turned around and headed north. Crossing the Equator again, the LATTE stopped and held swim call. The swimming party was a huge success and many members of the crew swan back and forth across the Equator.

on 7 December PLATTE arrived in Singapore and spent four days of Rest and Macrestian. Many of the crew had the exportunity to visit and talk to many of the British Navy men since Singapore is the heme of the British Far Mast Fleet.

Leaving Singapore on al December another Market Time run was in stere for FIATTM. On 19 December the LIATTM refueled her last ship of 1967 when the USS MUBISUM (DDG-12) come alongside to port.

Ifter spending Christmas in Subic Ray, the IATT departed on 29 December for Chilung, Taiwan where she arrived on 31 December to spend the Law Year's heliday.

During the first  $6\frac{1}{2}$  months of the cruise, LATTE had replenished 320 ships and had transferred over 35 million gallons of fuel.
