Back in June of 1944 the Marines made a landing on the South Pacific island of New Georgia. They knew the Japs were strongly entrenched and expected stubborn resistance on this vital piece of real estate. The first person they met walked down the beach toward them, waved and said to the Marine Commander, «Colonel, the Navy Seabees are always happy to welcome the Marines to enemy held territory». This lone figure was a CEC Lieutenant who had led a Seabee Detachment on the island to survey the jungle for airfield sites.

We have all heard of similiar exploits of the World War II Seabees and perhaps we have heard all about the beginnings of the Seabees, so why don't we review and get the history of our Battalion.

MCB ONE was commissioned October 20, 1949 in time for a brief training period before joining with components of the Fleet, Marines, Army, and Air Force for operation PORTEX. This operation consisted of a concentrated assault maneuver on the island of Vieques, Puerto Rico. It was here that the Battalion received the first of am impressive series of «Well Dones» for her part in the assault and the subsequent rebuilding of the island and also the strengthening of defenses. After this rigorous shakedown period there followed a series of operations in such varied places as Guantanamo, Cuba; Hamilton, Bermuda, and Port Lyautey, French Morocco. These deployments averaged about five months and were followed by a rest and leave period at our home port of Davisville, Rhode Island where in true Seabee fashion, the men played as hard and as fast as they had worked in the preceeding months. The objectives during the foreign deployments were widely varied, and in many cases, highly specialized.

One of the more gratifying operations was the resurfacing of the catchment basins at the Naval Station in Hamilton, Bermuda. This job guaranteed a continued supply of water for fellow sailors on the island.

In addition to our full strength deployments, the Battalion has been responsible for many smaller but equally important tasks. Detachments have been flung far and wide—often working under unfavorable and haz—ardous conditions to gain their objectives.

The history of MCB ONE is distinguished. The Officers and men of the Battalion can be justly proud of the «Can Do» spirit that has been so vital to, and characteristic of, «The First and the Finest.»

SEABEE CAMP AREA JUNE 1960

MCB-1's deployment to Rota began in March 1960 with the arrival of its advance party to lay out the initial stages of the work and to improve and set up the SeaBee Camp at «Silver City».

The main body of the Battalion arrived on 29 May 1960 to begin its Rota deployment. The assigned construction plan primarily consisted of constructing new facilities for the Rota Magazines. These facilities included 11 new Magazines, a Guard House, Battery Charging Building, Vehicle Shed, Inert Storehouse, Guard Tower, Construction Shed, 2 Sentry Booths, and extensive perimeter lighting, fence, road, and utilities installations. The basic construction plan also required construction and improvement of many facilities in the SeaBee Camp, operation of the concrete and asphalt batching plants, and excercising of mobilization equipment. Upon arrival the workload was increased by the necessity of completing certain facilities not completed by MCB-6 and the Magazine project was increased by requiring an addition to the existing AUW Building, and additional work to be done to the Guard House, Battery Charging, and Inert Storehouse buildings.

Additionally the Battalion was assigned, in late October, the task of construction new Aircraft Maintenance Facilities consisting of 35,000 square meters of new parking apron for aircraft and refuelers, construction of 4 shop quonsets placed on 6 foot side walls, and construction of a quonset hut administration building including utilities and access paving. During the course of the deployment, the Battalion also sent detachments to Sigonella, Sicily, and Port Lyautey.

Rear Admiral Corradi, Deputy Chief of the Bureau of Yards and Docks, presented Letters of Commendation and the Naval Commendation Ribbons to Donald T. LaFLAMME, SWE 2, and Richard D. WILLIAMSON, CN, during pass-in-review ceremonies held in the Admiral's honor.

The Battalion Adjutant read the Citation which stated to each:

«For heroic conduct during the period March 1 to March 5, 1960, as a member of the rescue unit for Naval activities, Port Lyautey, Kenitra, Morocco, at the time of the Agadir, Morocco, earthquake disaster. During this period he participated actively in hazardous rescue operations. Without regard for his personal safety or well-being, he repeatedly endangered his life by entering the ruins in search of victims. Utilizing hand tools, he worked in spaces so restricted and so difficult to enter that he was required to crawl, tunnel, or otherwise work his way to entrapped persons.»

The Citation was signed by W. B. Franke, Secretary of the Navy.
