- 2. <u>MISSION</u>. Pursuant to reference (a), the Battalion is to deploy to Camp Lejeune, in conjunction with military training requirements for the operational readiness of Naval Construction Battalions.

- e. Direct liaison is authorized with MCB SEVENTY-FOUR, MARCORBASE, and component activities.

- 4. The USN Equipment required for this training is located at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, in the custody of the Base Motor Transport Officer/Mobile Construction Battalion holding the equipment. The Battalion Alfa Company Commander or his designated representative will sign for the custody of the equipment utilizing Form DD-1149 and will release custody to the relieving Battalion or Base Motor Transport Officer utilizing Form DD-1149. A copy of the executed transfer of custody of all USN equipment will be provided to the 21ST NCR representative who will coordinate the equipment turnover.
- 5. During the training deployment and while the equipment is being utilized by the Battalion, the Battalion will be responsible for all maintenance and minor repairs required to maintain the equipment in 0-2 condition in accordance with reference (a).

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- 6. Equipment requiring Class "C" PM's, major repairs, or required repair parts are not readily available, will be turned in to the Base Motor Transport Officer who will effect such repairs as may be necessary.
- 7. There will be a Battalion Equipment Evaluation Program (BEEP) held at the time of the equipment acceptance/turnover from/to the Base Motor Transport Officer/relieving battalion. The BEEP will be held in accordance with reference (h).
- 8. Operational records on all equipment will be maintained in accordance with reference (i) and will be turned over to the 21ST NCR representative upon completion of the training deployment.

# 9. LOGISTICS SUPPORT

- a. <u>Subsistence</u>. Berthing and Messing facilities will be provided by the Marine Corps Base.
- b. <u>Supplies</u>. Administrative and operational supplies shall be procured from the Marine Corps Base. The Battalion will provide appropriation data to the Marine Corps Accounting Office, Building 1005, for issuance of the supplies. There is a Serv-Mart location at the Marine Corps Base which carries a wide range of supplies.
- (1) Combat Rations. Combat rations will be utilized for meals where it will be impracticable for the Battalion to subsist at a mess hall. Combat rations will be ordered from NSC, Norfolk, Virginia, for delivery to Camp Lejeune. Combat rations not utilized by the Battalion will be turned over to the next battalion or put in the custody of the Base Property Control Officer, Marine Corps Base.

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# ANNEX C PUBLIC AFFAIRS

1. <u>MISSION</u>. Collect and disseminate public affairs material that will illustrate the defensive, military posture and smartness of today's Seabee.

### 2. EXECUTION

- a. The release of public affairs material in connection with the deployment shall be in accordance with references (e) and (f).
- b. Extreme care must be exercised to ensure that public affairs releases conform with the following:
- (1) Do not make reference to any aspect of the deployment which may be considered classified.
- (2) Do not contain any material which may reflect with discredit on the United States or any branch of the U. S. Armed Forces.
- (3) Do not contain any material which tends to degrade or redicule the customs or living conditions of the area where employed.
- c. News releases will be made only through the operational/area Commander.
- d. A copy of each release will be forwarded to this Headquarters with the Distribution List.
