TASK ORGANIZATION: MCB SEVEN (Herein known as the Battalion)

- 1. SITUATION. Peacetime deployment and employment of Naval Construction Battalions requires continuing rotation of units in the Atlantic area with emphasis on mobility and readiness. Accordingly, it is necessary to move the Battalion from the U.S. Naval Construction Battalion Center, Davisville, R.I., to the U.S. Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, N.C. in August 1964 for military training, under the following conditions:

- 2. MISSION. Pursuant to reference (a), the Battalion is to deploy to CAMLEJ in conjunction with military training requirements for the operational readiness of Naval Construction Battalions in support of U.S. Atlantic Fleet activities.
- 3. EXECUTION. When directed in August, the Battalion will depart from CBC Davisville and will deploy to CAMLEJ for a period of approximately six weeks. During this time the following minimum readiness conditions will be maintained by the Battalion:
- a. While in transit, be capable of being organizationally redeployed or dispersed within 72 hours to emergency, contingency, or mobilization assignments.
- b. While on deployment site, be capable of being organizationally redeployed within 10 days.
- c. During the deployment period, the Battalion will take maximum advantage of available facilities in order to improve its operational preparedness through improvement of its material condition and prosecution of a vigorous training program in accordance with the training assignment of Annex A, including conducting continuing preparations for immediate redeployment.

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### 4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOCISTICS:

- a. The standard operational procedures set forth by reference (a) will be followed.
- b. Leave shall be administrated in accordance with reference (h).
- c. Make movement reports in accordance with reference (c).
- d. Equipment assignment is made by Annex B.

## 5. COMMAND AND SIGNAL:

- a. The Commanding Officer is hereby directed to report to the Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, CAMLEJ in accordance with Article 1324, U.S. Navy Regulations.
  - b. Authority to deploy an Advance Party is hereby granted.
- c. The Battalion is authorized direct liaison with the Commanding General, MAR-CORBASE, CAMLEJ, and component activities.

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# ANNEX B USN EQUIPMENT ASSIGNMENT

- 1. The USN equipment authorized for deployment with the Battalion at CAMLEJ is listed by the EAM listing.
- 2. Any item of USN equipment in the custody of the Battalion for this field training and not listed shall be reported. A verified copy of the list shall be returned to COM-CBLANT (Code 41) promptly.
- 3. Reference (a) sets forth the responsibilities for custody, maintenance, and disposition of the equipment. Reference (b) sets forth the requirements for control and management reporting on the equipment monthly.
- 4. Upon completion of the field training at CAMLEJ, the equipment listed shall be promptly returned to the CBLANT Ready Line at CBC Davisville. At that time, the Battalions will conduct a joint inspection in conjunction with CBC (CED) to effect sub-custody transfer. Necessary forms for this transfer action will be furnished by this Headquarters (Code 41). A copy of the executed form on each piece of USN equipment must be returned for the files of COMCBLANT. At the time of sub-custody transfer, a completed shop repair or (NavDocks 1948) for each piece of equipment showing parts required (by manufacturers' part number) and work necessary to place it in 0-1 condition will be submitted to CBC (CED), with an information copy attached to the COMCBLANT copy of the sub-custody transfer form.

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# ANNEX C PUBLIC INFORMATION

- 1. MISSION. Collect and disseminate public information material that will illustrate the defensive, military posture and the military smartness of today's Seabees.

### 2. EXECUTION:

- a. The release of public information material in connection with this deployment shall be in accordance with the provisions of references (a) and (b).
- b. Extreme care must be exercised to ensure that public information releases conform with the following:
- (1) Do not make reference to any aspect of the deployment which may be considered classified.
- (2) Do not contain any material which may reflect with discredit on the United States or any branch of the U. S. Armed Forces.
- (3) Do not contain any material which tends to degrade or ridicule the customs or living conditions of the area where deployed.
