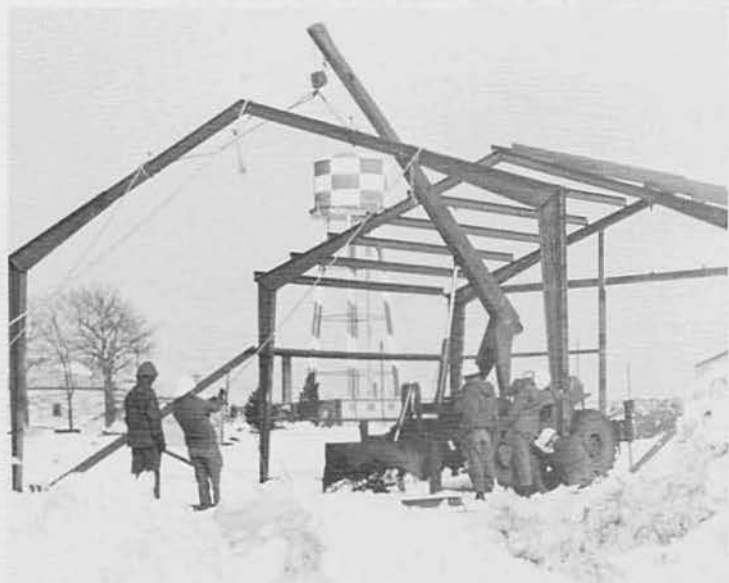


SEABEE TEAM TRAINING FACILITY

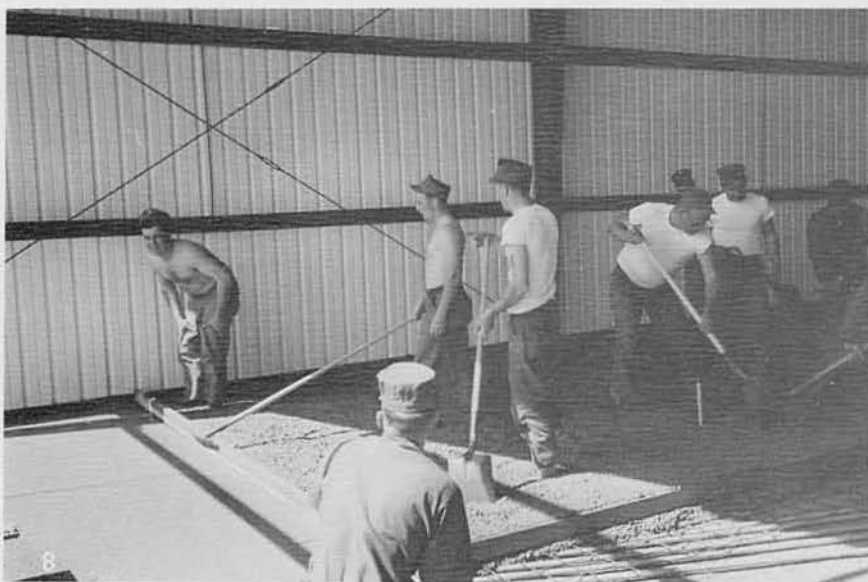

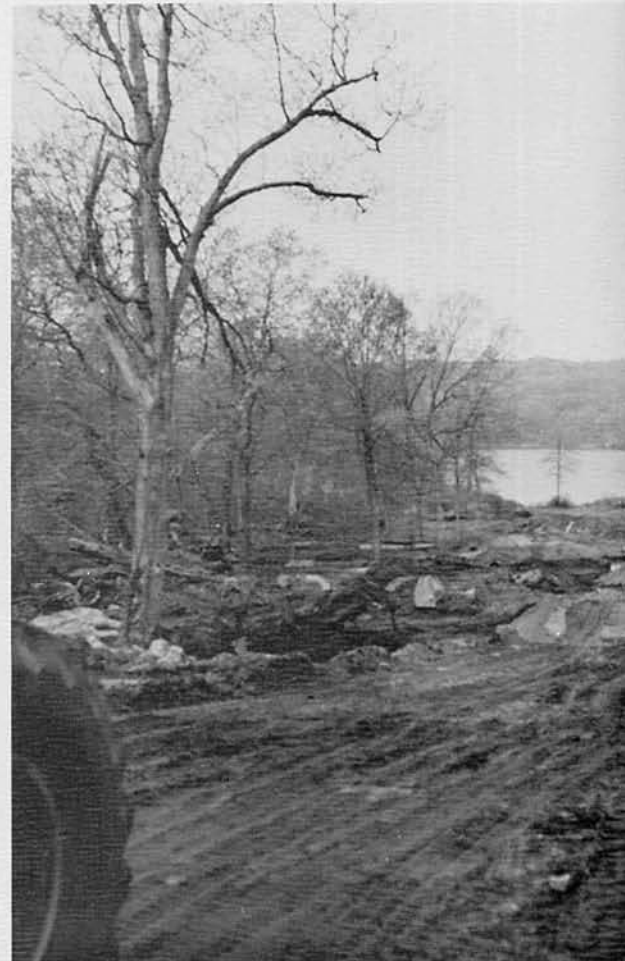
LADD SCHOOL

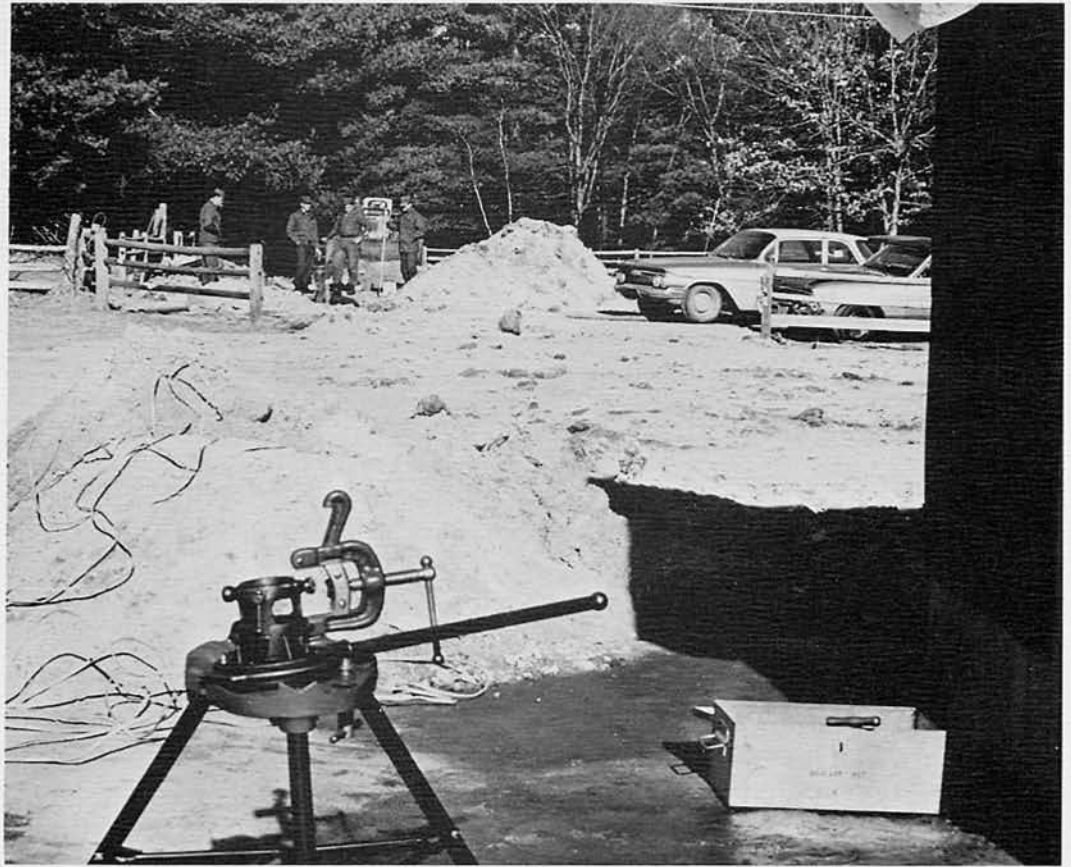


BUCK HILL

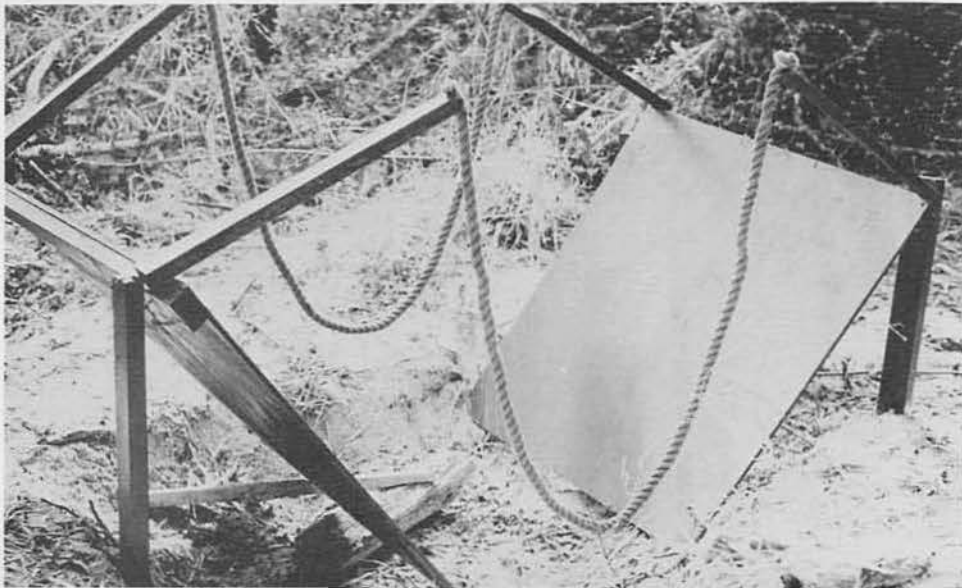
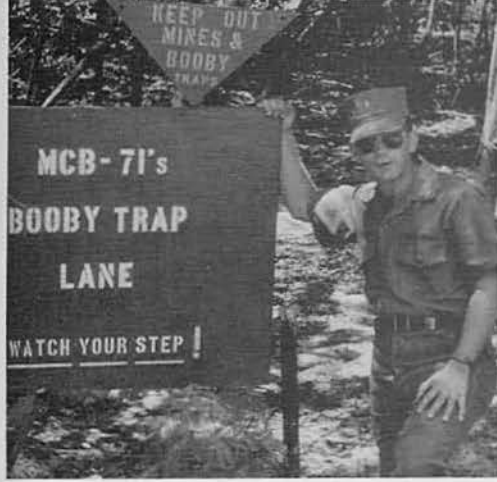


READINESS INSPECTIONS AND TRAINING



On June 25th, the first class of MCB 71 Seabees was initiated in 71's new Mines and Booby trap course. It was on this same day that the first LTJG blew himself up—on a simulated device of course.

The course was constructed in support of MCB 71's deployment mission—to attain highest state of combat readiness and to provide contingency construction support. It contains both simulated traps, which produce pops, bangs and whistles, and displays which include punji pits, foot spike traps and falling mace devices. The devices in the booby trap course are patterned after those which the men may encounter in Southeast Asia.



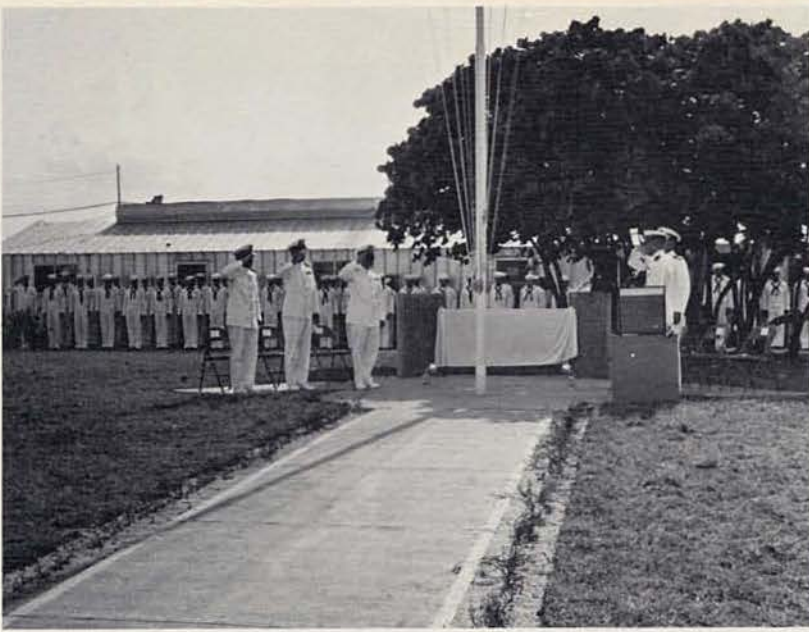

Seabee Team 7102 is deployed to the Phuoc Tuy Province, Republic of Vietnam. Since deploying to Vietnam, 7102 has completed many jobs including: pre-cast concrete dome buildings for VIS reading rooms in Long Dien, Baria and Binh Ba, and a large rice warehouse. A five man detachment under CEC Lorenzo spent two months in the Rung Sat Special Zone constructing three buildings. HM1 Coldiron has been seeing nearly 1000 patients a month on joint Medcap with the Australian Civil Affairs Team.





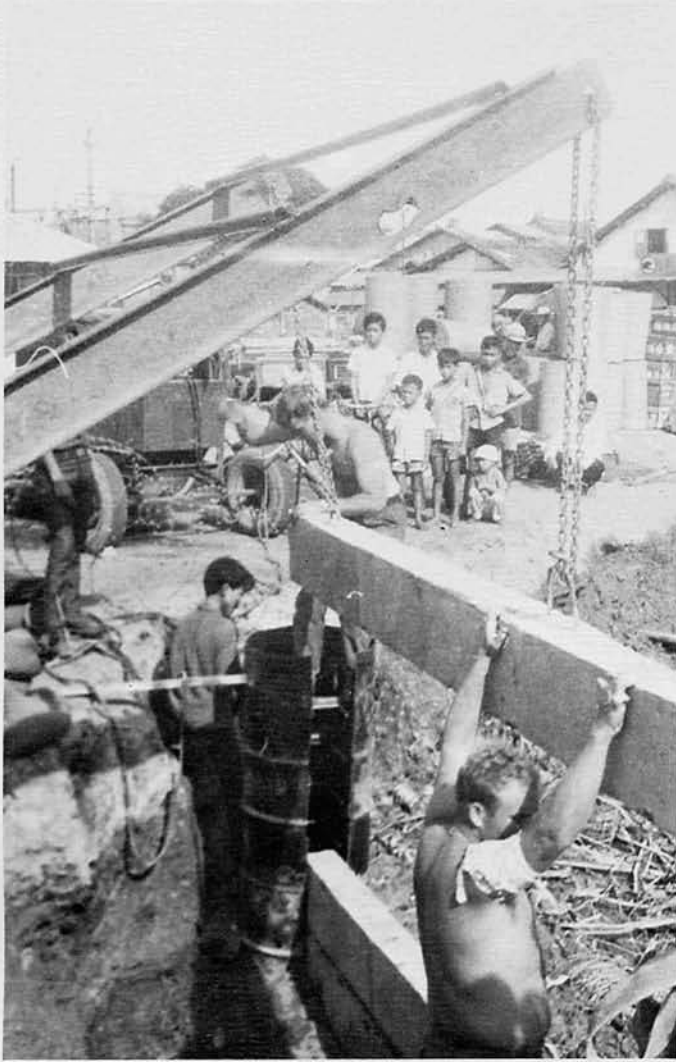
SEABEE TEAM 7103

Shortly after MCB 71 arrived in Puerto Rico the battalion was tasked with providing one additional Seabee Team to the Republic of Vietnam. Seabee Team 7103 was formed and detached to the 21st Naval Construction Regiment in Davisville to undergo 18 weeks of training prior to deployment to South Vietnam.

The team arrived in Vietnam in October at Phu Vinh in Vinh Binh Province (approximately 70 miles south of Saigon). After that time the team undertook an ambitious and diversified construction and civic action program in conjunction with joint U.S.-Vietnamese pacification plans.

The men of 7103 completed many projects in the Phu Vinh area: the erection of a cement block retaining wall and drainage system at the Chieu Hoi center, interior partitioning at the NPF headquarters, and erection of a concrete pier, wing walls, and a ramp complex at the Tra Vinh canal to open up boat commerce to the city market place. 7103 initiated a continuous program of road upkeep and maintenance in the area, and team members prefabricated and placed numerous foot bridges, culverts, and pieces of playground equipment throughout the district.

Construction of three more schools, a dispensary, and an irrigation canal, and major repairs to over 70 miles of washed-out roadway only partially completes the list of Seabee Team 7103 achievements.

SOLOMONS, MARYLAND





In early December, Detail Tango deployed to Solomons, Maryland to construct facilities at the new Naval Recreation Center to be located there. The project, which includes tent, trailer and camper accommodations, cottages, a lodge, and a myriad of outdoor recreation facilities, is situated in a relatively isolated location on the western shore of Chesapeake Bay. 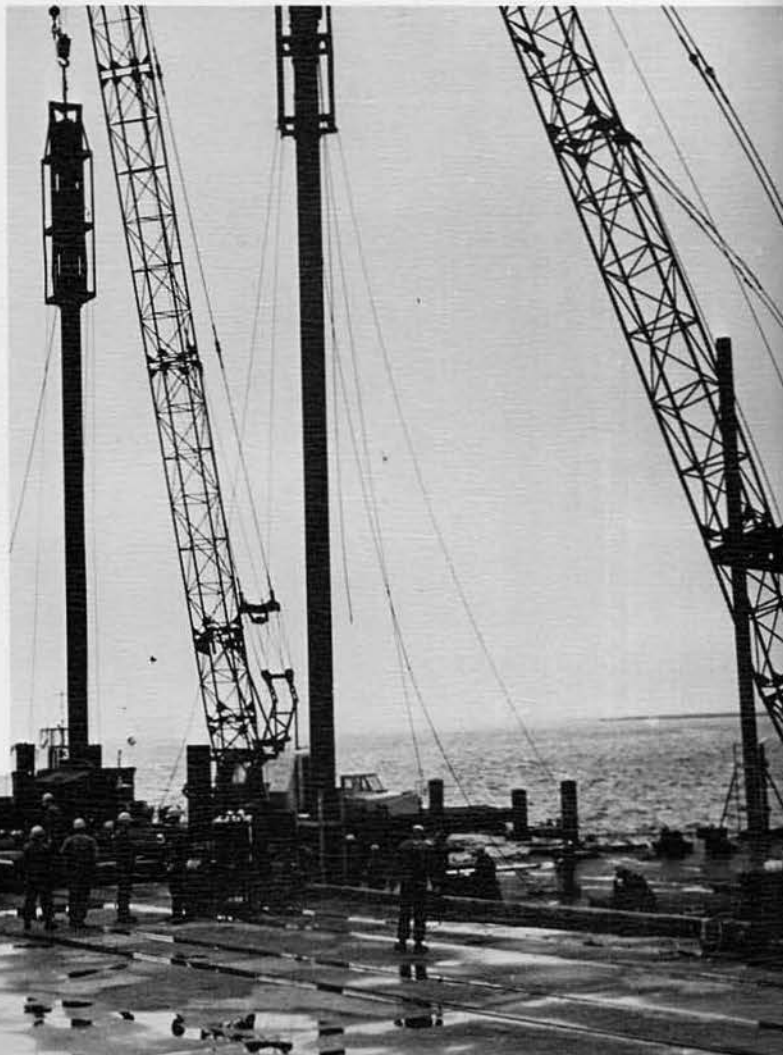

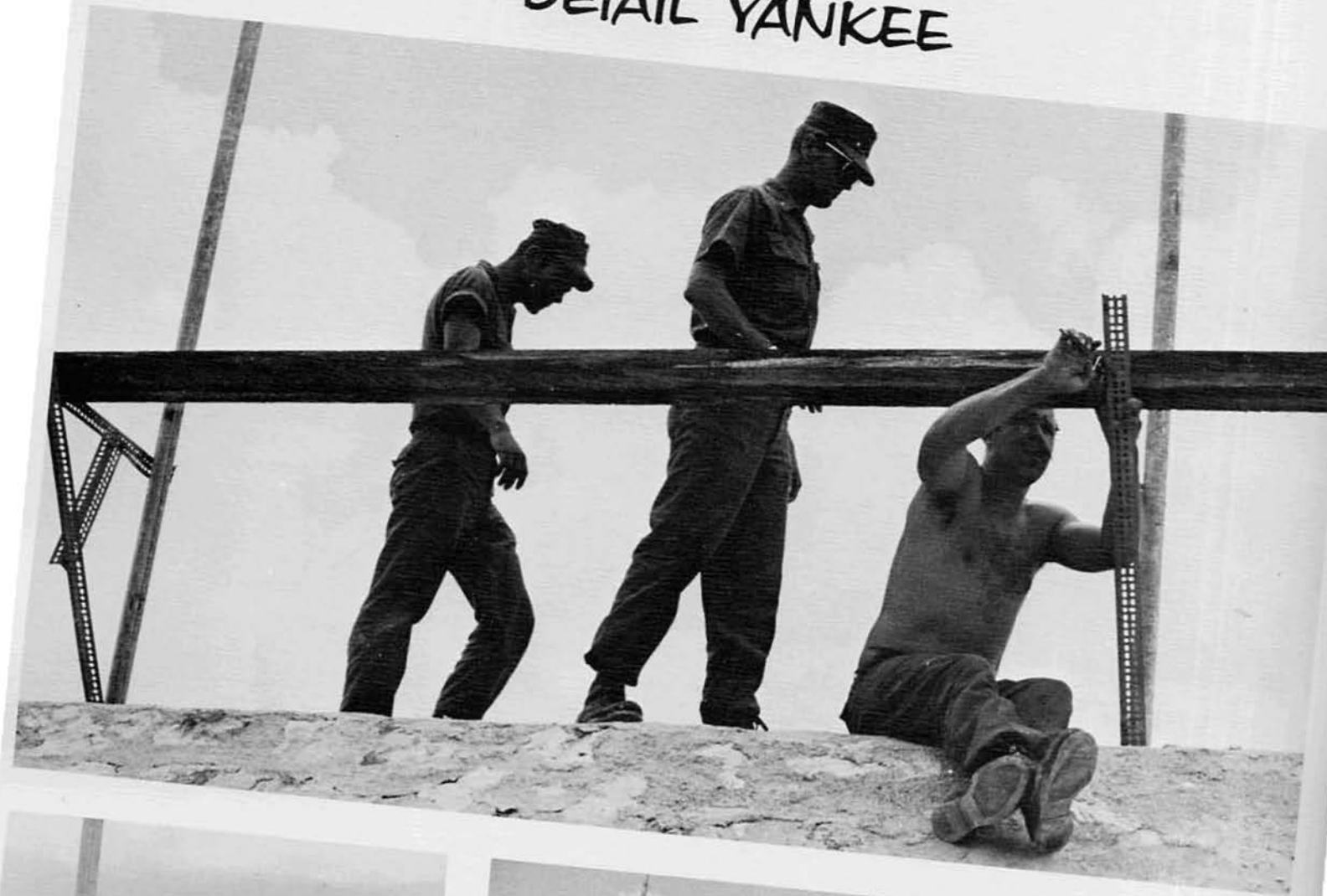
A prototype in drydocks, the AMMI dock is an advanced base functional component lift dock, utilizing Ammi pontoons as pier and lift sections — flooded with water to submerge. A combination of winches and air flotation raises the pontoons and the ship needing repair to an elevated position. The dock, the first of its kind ever constructed, is large enough to accommodate a 2500-ton destroyer. The high degree of mobility of its components and its adaptability to Seabee construction are two of its foremost features.

Detail Zulu, the first and largest of the Battalion's detachments, remained in Davisville for the duration of the 1969 deployment.

At Culebrita, generators were installed in a new generator building and the helicopter pad was enlarged and paved.

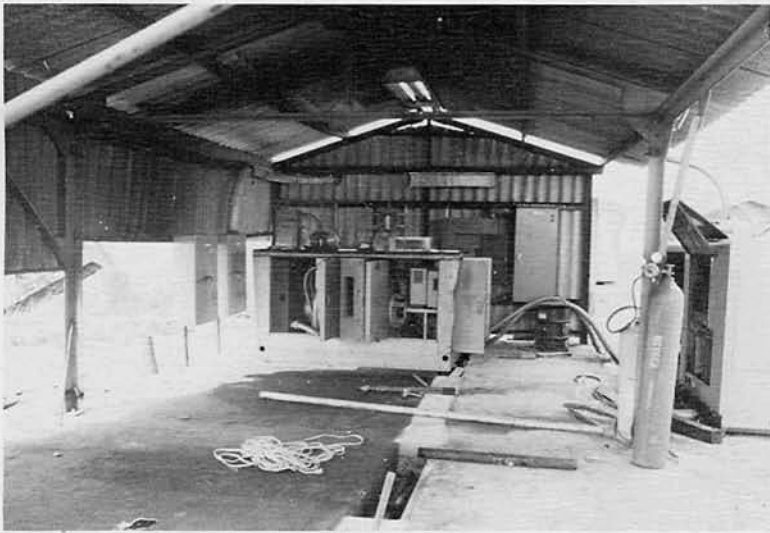

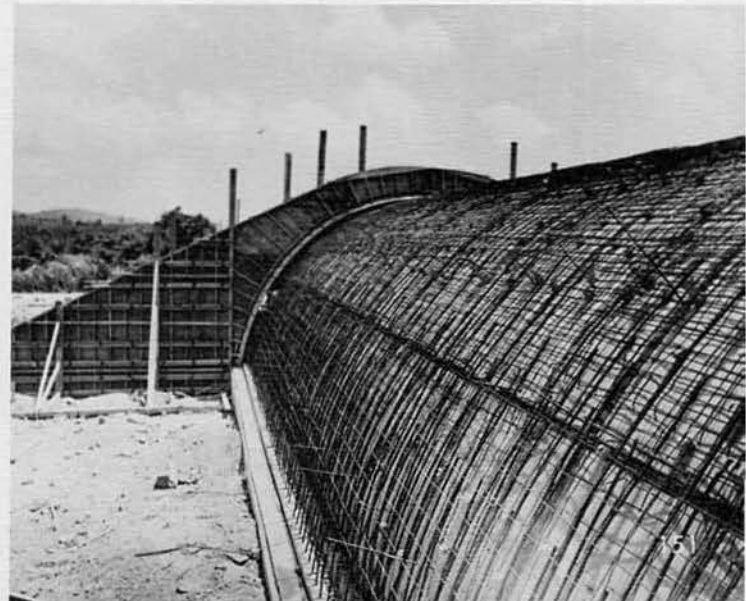
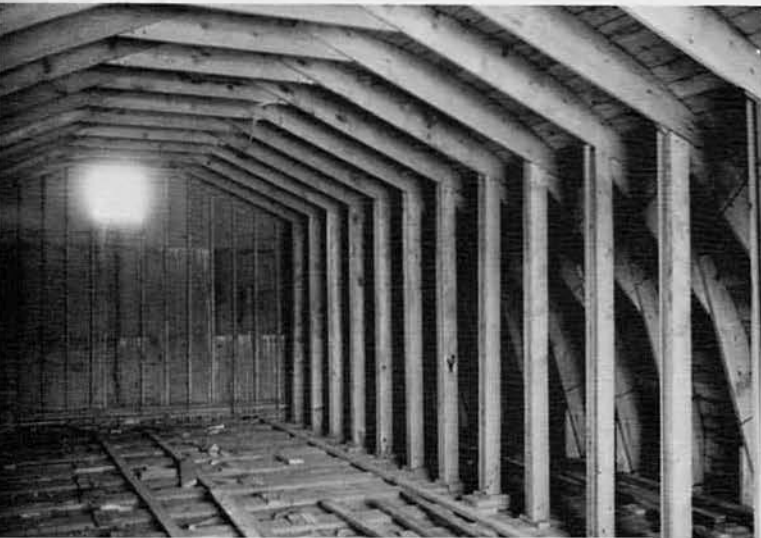


The high explosive magazine job consists of two magazines, designed as half cylinders, 50 feet long and 24 feet across, each wired with $\frac{1}{2}$ inch copper grounding system and covered with two feet of fill. In front of each magazine's entrance is a blast wall 83 feet long, 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet high and tapered from 15 inches thick at the bottom to 8 inches at the top. Alfa Company repaired and resurfaced the main access road to the magazines and surfaced the new driveways to both magazines number one and two. Approximately 4,000 man days were expended on the project.

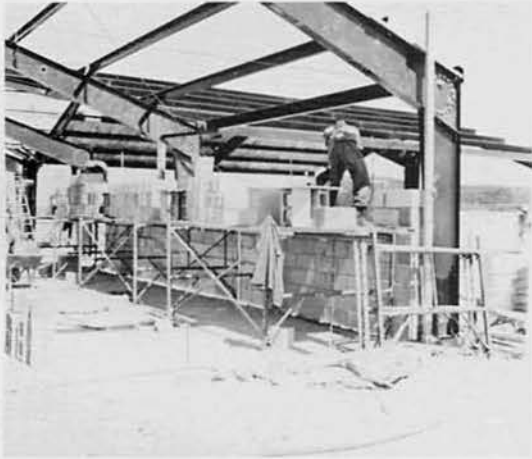
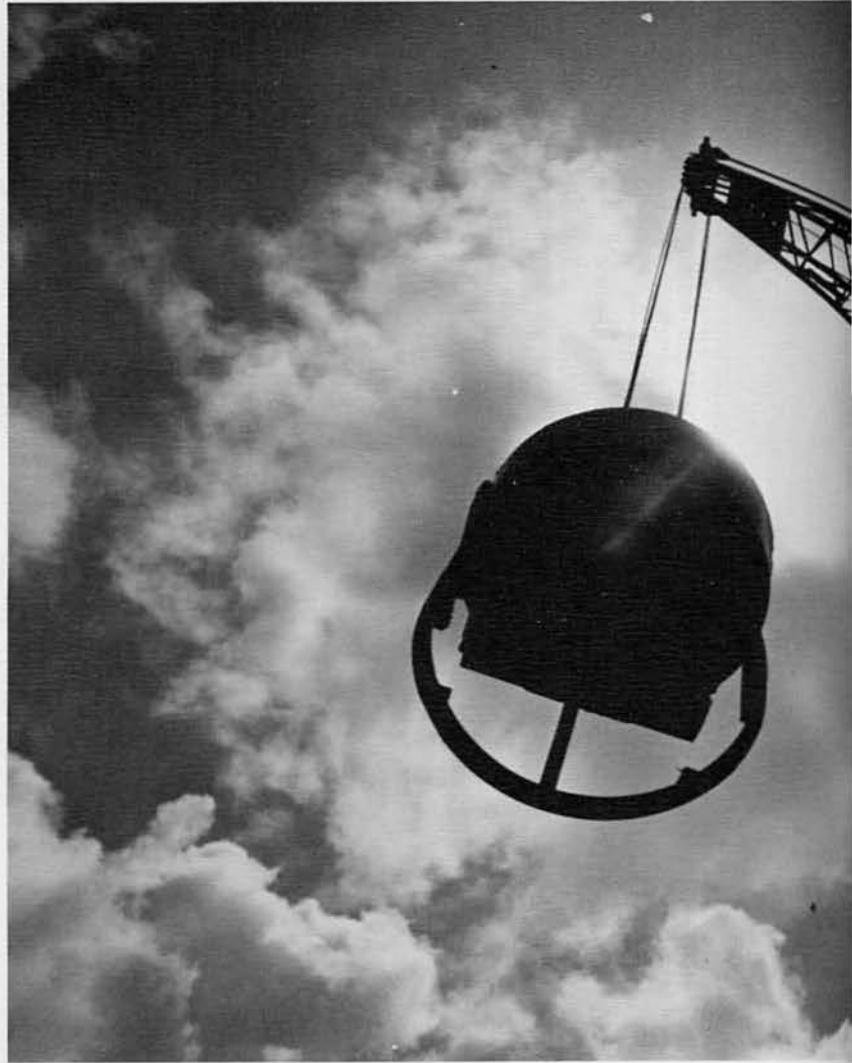

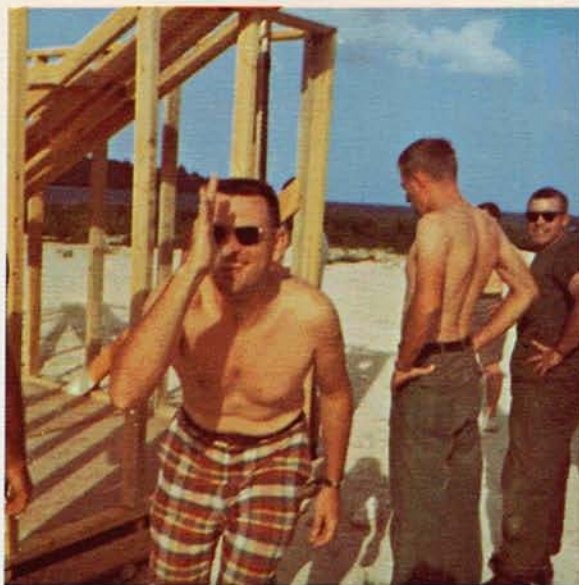


THE VOLLEYBALL AFFAIR

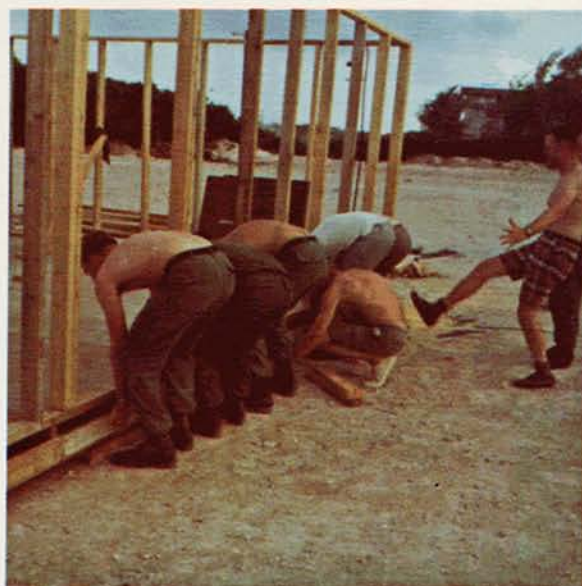
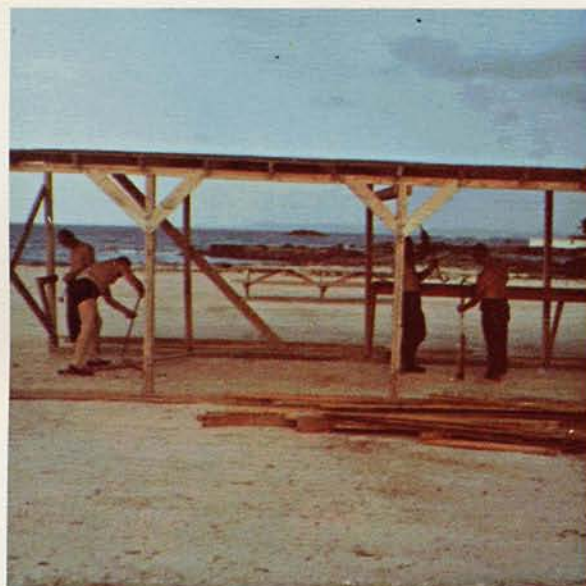
