

REQUIREMENTS	<b>NOTE:</b> A total of 72 hours of EMS education is required to re-register. Requirements for re-registration are listed below.	
<b>1. Refresher</b>  Complete an approved DOT National Standard EMT-Basic Refresher  24 hours	The Basic refresher course can be completed through two different options:  <b>(1) Traditional refresher course</b>  Completion of a 24 hour approved DOT National Standard Basic Refresher or CECBEMS approved refresher course.	<b>(2) Continuing education topical hours</b>  EMT refresher may be completed by continuing education* and must include the following:  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Preparatory ..... 1 hour</li> <li>• Airway ..... 2 hours</li> <li>• OB, Infants, Children ..... 2 hours</li> <li>• Patient Assessment ..... 3 hours</li> <li>• Medical/Behavioral ..... 4 hours</li> <li>• Trauma ..... 4 hours</li> <li>• Elective ..... 8 hours</li> </ul> <hr/> TOTAL ..... 24 hours  <i>*Some states require the traditional refresher course and will not accept continuing education hours. <b>3. CPR Certification</b>	Submission of an approved CPR credential for the professional rescuer. Credential must be current through the March 31 expiration date. Verification may be in the form of an instructor's signature on the re-registration form or copies of both sides of a current card.	

**To obtain locations for continuing education, contact your state EMS office or local EMS training center.**

**Hours from the following courses can be applied hour for hour with no maximum:** Advanced Trauma Life Support, Refresher Course Instruction, and Wilderness EMS Training.

**Courses That Cannot Be Applied Towards Additional Continuing Education Hours:** Clinical Rotations, CPR, First Responder Course, Home Study Programs, Instructor Courses, Management/Leadership Courses, Performance of Duty, Preceptor Hours, Serving as a skill examiner, and Volunteer time with agencies.

Thank you for your commitment to re-registering your certification. NREMT certification gives you recognized credibility across the nation, and demonstrates your desire to serve the public with the highest of standards. Your certification will continue to serve you well during the course of your EMS career.

# EMT-Basic Re-registration Requirements

## To re-register your certification you need to:

1. Be actively working within an emergency medical service, rescue service, or patient health care facility using your EMT skills.
  2. Complete all educational requirements prior to March 31.
  3. Complete the re-registration report in its entirety and submit the completed report prior to March 31.
  4. Complete a total of 72 hours of Continuing Education to re-certify, which includes:
    - Completion of an approved 24 hour DOT National Standard EMT-Basic Refresher
    - Completion of 48 hours of **additional** continuing EMS related education as outlined in this document
    - Obtain CPR certification at the appropriate level current to March 31
- See reverse side for detailed re-registration requirements.**
5. Maintain skills as verified by your Training Program Director, Director of Operations or Physician Medical Director. (Requires signature on your re-registration application validating competency of skills).
  6. Submit re-registration application processing fee (non-refundable) of \$15.00.

**Re-registration forms are mailed in November, prior to your expiration date. Returned forms must be postmarked no later than March 31.**

*EMTs requiring a National Registry card to work must submit re-registration materials to the NREMT by mid-February of the year of expiration date.*

*All continuing education hours, to include the refresher, must be completed within the current re-registration cycle. Education completed prior to your previous March 31 expiration date will NOT be accepted. If this is your first re-registration, only education completed after the date of the initial registration will be accepted.*

## Audits

The National Registry reserves the right to investigate re-registration materials at any time from the registrant. Registrants must retain verification of attendance of all education they acquire. Failure to submit verification or documentation when audited will result in denial of eligibility to re-register.

## Disciplinary Policy/Revocation of Certificates

NREMT has disciplinary procedures, rights of appeals, and due process within its policies. EMTs applying for registration or re-registration who wish to exercise these rights may contact NREMT for copies of the Disciplinary Procedures. Requests to appeal must be submitted within forty five (45) days of receipt of notice of the determination.

## Reinstating Active Status from Inactive Status

## Terms of Re-registration

In applying for re-registration, registrants agree to comply with all re-registration requirements, rules and standards of the NREMT. The registrant bears the burden of demonstrating and maintaining compliance at all times. The NREMT considers the individual to be solely responsible for his/her registration. Individuals must notify NREMT, within 30 days, of change of mailing address. Change of mailing address can be made via our website: [www.nremt.org](http://www.nremt.org). Individuals must notify the NREMT within 30 days of any felony convictions.

Individuals must notify the NREMT within 30 days of any disciplinary action taken by any state that has resulted in the following:

- Suspension, revocation, or expiration of state registration/license
- Termination of right to practice
- Voluntary surrender of state registration/license while under investigation
