Charles Patrick Daly, jurist, lecturer, and writer, was born in New York City in Description 1816, and died in Sag Herbor, N.Y., in 1899. After his father's death he left school and worked at various jobs before entering a law firm in 1836. In 1839 he was admitted to the bar and began practising in New York City. In 1843 he was elected to the N.Y. Assembly and in 1844 he was appointed a judge of the New York City Court of Common Pleas where he served for over 40 years, the last 27 as chief justice. He was a prolific lecturer and writer. His wife, Mary Lydig Daly, was a person of substance in her own right. Active in the Democratic Party, she was also involved in the Woman's Cantral Association for Relief for the Army, the United States Sanitary Commission, and other similar welfare organisations of the Civil War period. Her diaries of this period were published in 1962 by Funk & Wagnells under the title, "Diary of a Union Lady, 1861-1865".

The papers include correspondence, 1829-1897, of Charles P. Daly relating to his military service, lend transactions, promotion of emigration, law suits against the U.S. government for the loss of cotton during the Civil War, and the social, political, andlegal mores of New York City. There are also his digries and notebooks, 1851-1881, of travel in the U.S., Iroland, England, France, and Germany, manuscripts of addresses, lectures, and writings on law, judicial history, the Jews of New York City, Irish-Americans, and numberous other subjects, and some land papers, accounts, legal papers, 1834-1899. Also in the papers are Mrs. Maria Lydig Daly's correspondence, 1856-1897, including letters reflecting her relief work during the Civil War, and other charitable activities, some of her accounts and land papers, and her digries, 1861-1878, which provide interesting insights into the social and political life of New York City. In addition there are some accounts of Daly's law partner, Henry Hoyt, two account books of the father of Maria Daly, Philip Nester Lydig, and correspondence of the French-born explorer and author, Paul Balloni Du Chaillu, with the Dalys, Harper Bros., and Charles Scribner's, and a few personal papers and royalty statements.

1851 | Mar. 12-| Apr. 15 Diary of Judge Charles P. Daly, of New York City, cover ing his stay in England while on a tour of Europe in
1851 for the benefit of his health. Sailed from Boston,
March 12 and arrived at Liverpool, March 23; follow passengers; sightseeing in London included Judge and
Jury Society, British Museum, Italian operas, Tower of
London, Crystal Palace, Westminster Abbey, National
Gallery, Lincoln's Inn, Court of Chancery, House of
Commons, Travollers Club, Vernon Gallery in Marlborough
House, the Temple, Temple Church, Athenaeum Club, Christ
Church, Cchool, Old Bailey, Seven Dials and the Rockery,
and a court session at Westminster Hall where he saw Lord
Trupo, Lord Chancellor, when he characterized. Judge
Daly was entertained by the American Ambassador, Abbot
Lawrence, the Prussian Ambassador, Chevalier Buncen, Sir
Peter Laurie, Sir William Wightman and others. Among the
distinguished persons whom he met were the Duke of Well ington, Sir John Herschell, and Ceneral Pollock.

1874 May 9-June 11 Diary of Judge Charles P. Daly, of New York City, who sail ed with Mrs. Daly from New York City, May 9, 1874, and landed at Queenstown, Ireland, May 18, for a tour of the country. The itinerary includeddork, Glengariff, Kenmare, Killarney, Innisfallen Island, Limerick, Thurles, Kildare, Dublin, Trim. Glendalough, Mavan, Drogheda, Dundalk, Omagh, Londonderry, Port Rush, Giant's Causeway, Coleeraine, and Bolfast, where places of scenic, archeological, historical and literary interest were visited.
