This analysis merely identifies the industries that are projected to have the greatest net and percent growth in the next decade in the Central WIA. Projections are presented for 2-, 3-, and 4-digit NAICS (North American Industry Classification System) industries.

#### Background:

Every two years, the Center for Workforce Information and Analysis (CWIA) releases long-term industry employment projections. Revisions are made according to this schedule to incorporate economic changes that have occurred across the nation. Industry employment projections reveal possible job opportunities by determining which industries are expected to increase employment in the coming decade. Furthermore, educators and economic developers can implement training programs to meet the anticipated workforce demand of certain industries. Similarly, training programs can help transition employees in industries that may experience a reduction in manpower in the coming years. Finally, long-term industry employment projections can assist in strategic planning by providing an insight into future employment trends.

Information contained in this report can be especially helpful for **schools** (youth deciding on what careers to pursue), **CareerLinks** (emphasizing areas that may offer job opportunities), **economic developers** (implementing strategic planning), and **educators** (training courses).

#### Methodology:

CWIA provides estimates of nonagricultural employment for industries in 2004 and projects these values to 2014. A monthly survey of employers (Current Employment Statistics Program) and a quarterly tax report from employers (QCEW program) provide the data to support these industry projections. Long-term industry projections were produced by software designed by America's Labor Market Information System, utilizing regression analysis using historical employment data, with the consideration of economic and demographic factors. Emphasis is given to an area's projected population

of person ages 16 and over, labor force participation rates, industry employment trends and the share of national employment.

Projections were produced at the 4-digit North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) level with the appropriate 3-digit and Major Industry Division aggregations (i.e., 2-digit level). "Other" categories represent the sum of the 4- and 3-digit industries that cannot be disclosed as individual values due to confidentiality issues. All projections reflect the number of jobs in an industry and not the number of people. This is the result of not compensating for multiple job-holdings. Additionally, there is no distinction between full-time and part-time positions.

#### Results:

CWIA provides long-term industry projections for the state, 22 Workforce Investment Areas, and 14 Metropolitan Statistical Areas. Projections are not broken down by county. This analysis looks at the industry employment forecasts from 2004 to 2014 for the Central Workforce Investment Area, which is comprised of Centre, Clinton, Columbia, Lycoming, Mifflin, Montour, Northumberland, Snyder, and Union Counties.

Between 2004 and 2014, industry employment (all nonagricultural jobs) in the Central WIA is expected to increase by about 12,430 jobs (or about 4.8%). Goods producing industries<sup>1</sup>, which currently account for approximately 21.9% of all employment in the Central WIA, are expected to lose over 4,000 jobs (about -7.7%) in the same time period. Service providing industries<sup>2</sup>, which constitute about 78.1% of all employment in the Central WIA, are projected to increase employment by nearly 17,000 jobs (about 8.1%).

Certain industries are expected to increase at a faster rate than the overall employment growth rate in the Central WIA. Such industries demonstrate an increase in employment proportions between 2004 and 2014. The following industries (at the 2-digit NAICS level) may provide job opportunities due to their expected rapid employment growth from 2004 to 2014:

Six (6) industries are expected to increase employment proportions in the Central WIA between 2004 and 2014, which indicates that the number of jobs in these industries may increase at a faster rate than the overall growth rate in the region. Job seekers may find ample opportunity in these industries in the coming decade due to their rapid growth.

The following tables identify the industries that are projected to experience the largest net and percent growth in the region between 2004 and 2014 for all 2-, 3-, and 4-digit NAICS industries in the Central WIA.

Between 2004 and 2014 in the Central WIA, *Educational Services* is expected to increase employment by nearly 7,000 jobs (about 15.4%), while employment for *Finance* 

& Insurance may increase by about 250 jobs (4.0%). Similarly, *Professional & Technical Services* may increase employment by 16.9% (about 1,190 jobs), and for *Other Services*, *except Public Administration* it may increase by 4.6% (about 440 jobs). Nine (9) industries are common to both charts, indicating that these industries are expected to increase employment at a rapid pace (*Finance & Insurance* is unique to the "net change" chart and *Real Estate and Rental & Leasing* is unique to the "percent change" chart).

Of the 15 industries having the largest net employment growth forecasted over the next decade, 12 different industry sectors (i.e., 2-digit NAICS levels) are represented. For those according to percent change, 11 unique industry sectors are apparent. Between the industries identified as having the largest potential net and percent employment increases in the Central WIA from 2004 to 2014, 9 industries are common to both charts (note: these rapidly growing industries are italicized). Health Care & Social Assistance (NAICS 62) may be one of the fastest growing industries in the region, as evidenced by

Ambulatory Health Care Services (NAICS 621), Nursing & Residential Care Facilities (NAICS 623), and Social Assistance (NAICS 624).

Of the 20 industries having the largest net employment growth forecasted over the next decade in the Central WIA, 10 different industry sectors (i.e., 2-digit NAICS levels) are represented. For those according to percent change, 12 unique industry sectors are

apparent. Between the industries identified as having the largest potential net and percent employment increases in the Central WIA from 2004 to 2014, 6 industries are common to both charts (note: these rapidly growing industries are italicized). Health Care & Social Assistance (NAICS 62) may be one of the fastest growing industries in the region, as evidenced by Offices of Other Health Practitioners (NAICS 6213), Home Health Care Services (NAICS 6216), Community Care Facilities for the Elderly (NAICS 6233), and Individual & Family Services (NAICS 6241).

#### Conclusion:

From 2004 to 2014, industry employment will increase by an average of about 1,243 jobs per year in the Central Workforce Investment Area (WIA). As discussed in the introduction, unforeseen events may occur during this time period to reduce this projected increase, such as improvements in technology or efficiency that may reduce the need for manpower in certain industries. Regardless, overall employment is expected to grow by over 12,000 jobs (about 4.8%) for the Central WIA, and a variety of industries are projecting significant increases in the number of jobs. It is important to note that job growth refers to only newly created jobs in an industry. Replacement jobs, which are job openings that occur as result of individuals retiring, transferring to a different job, et cetera, are not considered job growth. Job openings in various industries should be expected as a result of these types of circumstances in addition to the jobs created as described by this document.

Educational Services (NAICS 61) and Health Care & Social Assistance (NAICS 62) combined may account for over 11,000 new jobs (about 90.7% of all job growth) by 2014 in the Central WIA. Manufacturing of both Non-Durable (NAICS 31) and Durable (NAICS 32-33) Goods, however, are expected to lose over 4,000 jobs (a change of about -9.1% in employment) in the same time period. Construction (NAICS 23) is the only goods producing sector projecting job growth, where employment may increase by about 210 jobs (or about 2.1%).

At the 4-digit North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) level, approximately 50% of all disclosed industries are projecting a positive increase in employment between 2004 and 2014 in the Central WIA. Furthermore, about 18% of all industries are forecasting an increase of at least 100 jobs in the same time period. Conversely, about 12% of all 4-Digit NAICS industries are expected to lose at least 100 jobs.

Individuals may find the most job opportunities in the industries that are expected to increase employment in the next decade in the Central WIA. Of course, these projections do not guarantee the availability of job openings or the willingness of companies to hire certain individuals. Projections merely present possible future levels of employment in certain industries which may or may not relate to job availability. It is important for job seekers, educators, economic developers, and other decision-makers to consider the information presented in this report. However, the usefulness of these projections is limited, so other economic resources should be considered in making decisions relating to career pathways, training programs, and strategic planning.
