OVERSEAS CAMPUSES

SAIS Bologna Center in Italy (established 1955)

Approximately 185 American and non-American students study at the center, the only American graduate institution of its kind in Europe. A multi-national faculty teaches courses in international politics and economics, European studies and foreign languages.

Hopkins-Nanjing Center in the People's Republic of China (established 1986)

The center, host to as many as 100 Chinese and American students, is administered jointly by Nanjing University and SAIS. Classes for American and other international students are taught in Mandarin by Chinese professors, while Chinese students study in English with American professors.
