**1907.**

Hollywood and North Reddish Council Schools opened—August 26.  
Grimesbottom Recreation Ground (5 acres), opened—May 31.

**1908.**

Trinity House Club, Shaw Heath, opened—February 1.  
New Zealand Road Recreation Ground (area 5 acres), opened—March 10.  
Edgeley House Estate (through the generosity of the Sykes' family) opened  
as a public park and called Alexandra Park (area 10 acres)—April 15.  
New Reddish Baths, Library and Fire Station opened—May 7.  
New Town Hall, Wellington Road South, opened by the Prince of Wales (now  
King George) who was accompanied by the Princess—July 1.  
Vernon Park Jubilee celebrated September 19.

**1909.**

New Golf Links for Stockport Club opened—August 1.  
Stockport Sunday School Centenary Hall opened—October.

**1910.**

Municipal Secondary School, Greek Street, opened—April 22.  
Reddish Recreation Ground opened—August 21.  
High School for Girls, Cale Green, opened—October 13.

**1911.**

Annie Walthew Nursing Home, Heaton Norris, opened—June 14.

**1912.**

Reservoir and Waterworks at Kinder opened—July 11.  
Foundation Stone of Nurses' Home at Infirmary laid—November 13.

**1913.**

Thornfield Road Recreation Ground (4 acres), opened—June 1.  
New Stockport Savings Bank opened—August 11.  
Central Library (gift of Mr. Andrew Carnegie), opened—October 14.  
First meeting of enlarged Town Council, after inclusion of Heaton Moor, Heaton  
Chapel, and Heaton Mersey within the Borough—November 9. The number  
of Aldermen was increased to 18, and the number of Councillors to 54.
