

ERDMAN PROFILE

Help Alumnus Mike Erdman '69 Win a Seat on the Board of Trustees and Ensure a Successful Future for the University

Goals Include Managing Tuition Costs, Increasing Global Education and Promoting
Acceptance of Minorities

What do you do after you've retired from a successful career, proven yourself a life-long community leader, raised your family, and started a farm in upper New York State? If you are Penn State Theta Delta Chi alumnus, Mike Erdman '69, you run for Penn State's Board of Trustees.

The role of the Board of Trustees is extremely important to the university and covers many responsibilities. The Board selects the university president, determines the major goals of the university and approves the budget. Each year three new board members are elected by the general alumni body.

"I plan to bring a strong voice to issues that are important to alumni, parents and students. Tuition costs are unreasonable. Penn State is the most expensive public-supported college in the country!" he exclaims.

Mike believes in ensuring that students are provided with the best security, both on and off campus. He will also strive to improve representation of minorities and provide support structures for them.

"The other thing we need to address is Penn State's ability to educate students from the perspective of today's global economy. We need to provide more in-depth, global experiences for our students," Mike says.

Mike sees this future Board service as the next step in a long career of volunteering. He has served as a Penn State recruiter (20 years) for General Electric and Lockheed Martin, and has lectured many times to student groups on technical and leadership topics. During the past eight years, Mike has served or chaired an Industrial and Professional Advisory Council for the Penn State College of Engineering. Over the past two years he helped form the Alumni Advisory Board in the Department of Engineering Science and Mechanics (ESM), serving as its founding chair. In 2006, Mike was honored as a Centennial Fellow by ESM, and this April Mike was presented with the Distinguished Service Award by the Penn State Engineering Society for his service to the College of Engineering.

Mike graduated from the Engineering Honors Curriculum and began graduate school at Penn State. An opportunity for his dream job took him to California to work for Rocketdyne (Boeing). Mike participated in the design of the rocket engine for the space shuttle during his employment at Rocketdyne, and earned his Masters of Science at University of Southern California before moving back east. He spent the rest of his career working for the Knolls Atomic Power Lab in Schenectady, New York.

"My grandfather was one of the founders of the Quentin Riding Club in Quentin, Pa. My dad and then my sister served as secretary of the club. You could say we are from a third-generation horse family. When our kids graduated from

college, we decided to do something different, so we purchased land and built Nicker Barker Farm where we raise Golden Retrievers and thoroughbred horses," he explains.

His connection to Penn State is also a family affair. His mother, Pat (Behney), Kappa Kappa Gamma; wife, Donna (Laning), Alpha Gamma Delta; and children, Heather and Greg, are all Penn State alumni. Penn State football season tickets, board meetings, teaching personal skills, and fraternity functions keep Mike coming back to Happy Valley often.

When he wins his bid as Trustee, he will have another good reason to return.

Alumni are encouraged to vote electronically. Voting will be closed at 9 a.m. EST, May 15.
