## Dear Minister Ouellette:

It is my pleasure to welcome you to our new team as Minister of Transportation. The purpose of this letter is to outline the priorities and issues that I expect you to address through your ministry.

- 5. Provide the roads, schools, hospitals and other public infrastructure to meet the needs of a growing economy and population.

We will work collaboratively as a team to achieve all of our government priorities, but you will have a specific role to play.

You will work with the President of the Treasury Board to:

 Provide the roads, schools, hospitals and other public infrastructure to meet the needs of a growing economy and population, and

Lead the following initiative:

 Double the provincial investment in highway repairing and bridge repair over the next three years.

In closing, I consider this letter and your agreement to work on mutually-agreed upon priorities and initiatives, in addition to your core businesses in your ministry business plan, to be a contract between us. Your accomplishment of these objectives will help us to realize our goals and will allow Albertans to measure our performance as a government.
