II) BILATERAL RELATIONS WITH INDIA

i) POLITICAL RELATIONS:

Relations between India and Liberia continue to be cordial. Liberia has extended its support to India's candidatures for various multilateral/international Organizations. Liberia has three Honorary Consul Generals in India. Since 1984, Shri U.S. Sachdeva has been India's Honorary Consul General in Liberia.

ii) COMMERCIAL AND TRADE RELATIONS:

Indo-Liberian trade turnover for 2007-08 was for \$262.74 million, with Indian exports accounting for US\$ 22.97 million and imports for US\$ 239.77 million. Major Indian exports include iron and steel products, drugs and pharmaceuticals, textiles and machine tools and major items of imports included Organic and inorganic chemicals, timber and metal scrap.

iii) BILATERAL VISITS:

Since the visit of the Special Emissary of the PM to the Liberian President for the release of Indian Peace Keepers taken as hostage in 1999, no major bilateral visits have been exchanged between the two countries.

iv) <u>INDIAN COMPANIES :</u>

There are about 30 NRI/PIO trading firms operating in Liberia, trading in agricultural, plantation and mining products from Liberia and supplying textiles, electronics, engineering and consumer durables to the country. Arcelor Mittal Group has taken over the largest iron ore mine in the country, LIMINCO in 2005 with an investment of \$930 million over a 20 year period.

i) <u>ITEC/SCAAP PROGRAMME</u>

India awards 16 ITEC slots to Liberian trainees. These are utilized fully, besides India assigns ITEC experts, technicians and professors to Liberian institutions and governmental agencies on ongoing basis.

ii) GRANTS/CREDITS: Nil

iii) AIR CONNECTIVITY:

Connected by air from Sierra Leone, Cote d'Ivoire and Ghana.

iv) <u>BANKS</u>:

Barclays Bank and Free Town International Bank for Trade and Industry are two major banks. No Indian banking presence in the country.

v) <u>INDIAN COMMUNITY</u>:

There are about 625 Indian residents in Liberia. The Indian community in Liberia is the second most influential foreign community in the country – second only to the Lebanese in terms of commercial establishment and socio-economic contribution.
