## A Glorious Defeat

This week, for the first time in thirty years, MHS lost the Crawford Shield to Nth Sydney Boys' School on our home grounds. The 7 rubbers to 6 defeat was even more inglorious as this was the $50^{\text {th }}$ exchange with our Sydney counterpart. There are not too may occasions when we have cause to be thankful for a loss, however, this may be one of them.

The first exchanges involved one sport only; over time, more events were added reaching a peak of 15 several years ago. For the past year, however, the two schools have been undertaking discussions about the ongoing viability of the exchange. Nth Sydney have felt that changes to their student demographic have impacted their capacity to field competitive teams and certainly some events were proving to be lopsided. In was not a good omen for the future of the competition when two long standing sports were removed from the program in its $50^{\text {th }}$ year.

The exchange assembly was, as usual, a robust affair with a healthy exchange of derisive commentary from both sides. As usual, MHS won the unofficial singing contest whilst Nth Sydney may have taken the points in the exchange's first improvised breakdance battle. The earnest spirit of our visitors left us in little doubt that every contest would be hotly contested and this proved to be the case with the outcome of most rubbers being evenly poised.

For the good health of the exchange, there is no doubt that this is a good result. In effect, it maintains a win-loss ration of 8-2 in favour of MHS for each of the last four decades of the exchange. Nevertheless, the last time our Director of Sport, Mr Pritchard, lost the shield he was exiled to America for two years. The consensus is that a tour of duty in Antarctica may be now be in order.

I would like to acknowledge the
commitment of our team coaches, the sportsman-like and competitive spirit of all the boys who competed and the hospitality and support of the many families in the School community who billeted a Nth Sydney student for three nights. We know this is a significant commitment for our families, however, without this support the exchange would not be possible.

## VCE EXAMINATION SUPERVISORS NEEDED FOR THE GAT EXAM - June 11

Due to the large numbers of students sitting the GAT on Thursday 11 June at MHS, additional VCE exam supervisors are required. People doing this supervision need to be confident reading notices aloud to a group of senior students, and available from 8.00am to approximately 2.30 pm on the day. Any close relatives of students doing VCE Units $3 \& 4$ studies this year are ineligible for this employment. There is a small remuneration for the work.

As with last year there is an additional requirement that all supervisors who are not VIT registered teachers must have applied for a Working With Children Check (WWCC). This is now mandatory for any adult working or volunteering with children. Once obtained, the WWCC is valid for five years.
The WWCC costs $\$ 71.50$ and is available from any post office. Once completed and lodged at a post office, the back page of the form will be verified and stamped to become your application and receipt. This needs to be shown to our chief supervisor when you report for GAT supervision on June 11.

## Year 10 Parent Information Evening for Head Smart 2009

The Head Smart program is an interactive program designed in partnership with ORYGEN Youth Health and the Sunrise Foundation which aims to engage, educate and empower young people on the issue of depression. The program has been specifically designed to increase young people's mental health literacy and assist with building the necessary skills that will enable individuals to:

- Recognise depression
- Support others living with depression
- Seek help
- Improve coping strategies and
- To remove negative attitudes and perceptions towards depression.

Year 10 students will receive a two hour workshop which is interactive based, non-confronting, practical and engaging. ORYGEN Youth Health Training and Development deliver the program in partnership with Wayne Schwass from Sunrise Foundation.
