New Yorkers Commemorate 9/11 Generosity by Helping Iowa Tornado Survivors Rebuild

FDNY Firefighters who survived World Trade Center attack to work shoulder-to shoulder with Boy Scouts who survived the Little Sioux tornado as they rebuild Scout Camp hit by deadly twister June 11, 2008

Hundreds of disaster survivors from around the United States to 'pay it forward' at Little Sioux Scout Ranch rebuilding celebration, Sept. 3-6, 2009

NEW YORK, NY & LITTLE SIOUX, IA – September 1, 2009 – A unique volunteer organization born out of the ashes of Sept. 11 will be coming to western Iowa this 9/11 anniversary to help raise the spirits of the Boy Scouts and families who survived last year's June 11 tornado at the Little Sioux Scout Ranch. The New York Says Thank You Foundation, working in partnership with the Mid-America Council of the Boy Scouts of America, will be coordinating a large scale community service project at the Little Sioux Scout Ranch on September 3-6, 2009, in commemoration of the eighth anniversary of 9/11.

Each year on the 9/11 anniversary, the New York Says Thank You Foundation sends New York City firefighters, many of them survivors of the World Trade Center attack, to help rebuild communities across the U.S. affected by disaster. It's the group's way of saying "thank you" for all the love and support Americans from across the country gave to New Yorkers in the days, weeks and months following September 11, 2001. The group is often joined by hundreds of local volunteers, as well as by a growing group of disaster survivors from every community across the U.S. that the organization has helped on previous anniversaries of 9/11, who continually volunteer on subsequent rebuilding projects as their way to "pay it forward."

THE CHAPEL

This year, the New York Says Thank You Foundation will bring over 220 volunteers from New York and from around the U.S. – including 20 FDNY firefighters – to help build a chapel on the foundation of the structure where four young Scouts were lost during the deadly tornado on June 11, 2008. The group will use reclaimed timber from the camp and surrounding areas to construct the chapel, literally transforming the devastation into something full of hope. In addition to the chapel, the volunteers will help build trails to reach the peak of the North Valley overlooking the chapel, and will participate in various other projects around the 1,800-acre wilderness camp.

"What the Scouts went through in the devastating aftermath of the tornado was in so many ways reminiscent of what many first responders experienced in the wake of the 9/11 tragedy here in New York," stated Jeff Parness, founder of the New York Says Thank You Foundation. "The Scouts responded with grace and the highest levels of service and sacrifice and we could not think of a better group of young people to build with on the 9/11 anniversary 2009 than the Boy Scouts at Little Sioux Scout Ranch."

A VERY SPECIAL AMERICAN FLAG PROJECT

In addition to building the chapel and trail projects, one of the highlights of the 9/11 anniversary service project at the Little Sioux Scout Ranch will be the restoration and quilting of a 32-foot American flag that was destroyed when the Twin Towers collapsed. It was sewn back together by the residents of Greensburg, Kansas, during last year's New York Says Thank You 9/11 anniversary rebuilding project. The group will be bringing this living piece of American history to Little Sioux Scout Ranch for the Scouts and their families to add items to as well – literally stitching together the shared history of both the tragedy and triumph in New York and in Little Sioux. The flag will eventually be displayed at the National 9/11 Memorial Museum when it opens in lower Manhattan.

1,000 PEOPLE EXPECTED FOR A WEEKEND OF COMMUNITY SERVICE

Hundreds of Scouts and their families from Iowa, Nebraska and South Dakota are expected to join the New York Says Thank You Foundation for the weekend community service project on September 3-6, 2009. In addition, hundreds of local first responders are expected to participate in an emotional and patriotic closing service on Sunday, September 6, led by Chaplain Steve Holden of the United States Emergency Chaplains Corps. As many as 200 disaster survivors from around the country, including San Diego wildfire survivors, Hurricane Katrina survivors from Slidell, Louisiana and Bay St. Louis, Mississippi, and tornado survivors from Utica, Illinois; DeGonia Springs, Indiana; Groesbeck, Texas; and Greensburg, Kansas, are expected to join the effort in Little Sioux as well. These communities have all been assisted by the New York Says Thank You Foundation on previous 9/11 anniversaries. As with all rebuilding projects, the Foundation welcomes the participation of volunteers from the local community to create a unique weekend of community service.
