Optimism returns for Qantas Hols

Qantas Holidays has said its outlook is less 'cautious' and more 'optimistic' as the wholesaler reported a sustained improvement in the wake of growing consumer confidence.

Speaking to Travel Today, Qantas Holidays general manager Chris Rankin said the

performance of the wholesale division had been somewhat "understated" in the wake of Jetset Travelworld's half yearly results release last week (Travel Today, February 16). While JTG chief executive Peter Collins said the overall outlook was "patchy", Rankin said both Qantas Holidays and Viva Holidays were showing positive signs.

"From a wholesale perspective

I'd say we are less cautious and more optimistic," Rankin said. "The signs are the business has got some stability."

Rankin warned the business would not become complacent, with yields slow to return. But, he said the key outbound markets of Thailand, Bali and Fiji were all showing solid improvements in passenger numbers, while long-haul markets had also come back. "We've seen a good return to passenger volumes," Rankin said.

Since October, the wholesaler had seen more "consistency" in booking patterns, he added, giving confidence that the worst of the poor market conditions were over.

After emerging from a period of cost-cutting last financial year, Rankin said he is unlikely to strip out more costs from the business. "We did most of the cost cutting last financial year. We will look to contain costs, but the business is in pretty good

shape," he said. More from Qantas Holidays later this week.

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Lufthansa pilots call off strike

Lufthansa pilots have called off their strike after one day and have reinitiated talks with management.

The airline's 4,000 pilots had planned to walk off the job until February 25, but will now return to work.

Nearly half the carrier's flights were cancelled at the height of the industrial action, throwing the plans of many Australian travellers into disarray.

Meanwhile, British Airways cabin crew have also reiterated their plans to strike, though no date has been set.

JAL calls for policy changes

Japan Airlines is urging travel insurance providers to review their policies, claiming the refusal of many to offer insolvency protection for JAL is sending a negative message to the market.

It comes as the Australian Federation of Travel Agents called on JAL to act as the merchant for credit card transactions to allay agent fears of another "Ansett-like" collapse.

JAL spokesman Matthew Cupitt told *Travel Today* discussions are continuing with major travel insurance providers, including Cover-More, in the hope that insolvency protection can be reinstated to policies. Cover-More included insolvency cover up until January 19, when JAL went into bankruptcy.

The situation has resulted in some agents having to ask passengers to sign a waiver when booking trael insurance, a circumstance JAL claims is destabilising to its business.

"We are talking to quite a few underwriters and trying

to look at ways at how we can reinstate the insolvency cover and show them there is no risk whatsoever," Cupitt said. "Our circumstances are vastly different to others in the past."

AFTA chief executive Jayson Westbury called on JAL to better communicate their situation

to the industry. Westbury said some agents are nervous as consumers who pay with a credit card on an agent's merchant facility can then invoke a chargeback against that agent, should JAL collapse.

"What JAL should do is come out strongly to the industry and say we will act as your merchant," Westbury said. "Everyone wants to support JAL but I think maybe they need to do more to give the industry confidence."

AFTA is in the final stages of testing the new AFTA webMAIL version 2.0.

Expected to launch in the coming weeks, the enhanced version of AFTA webMAlL will allow suppliers to load their product information into the online database, in addition to having product details included in a daily email alert, which is distributed to around 9000 travel agents across Australia every day.

The service will remain free of charge, chief executive Jayson Westbury said.

China charters

China Southern Airlines has completed a program of eight charter flights from China to Australia as part of Chinese New Year celebrations.

The services included the first ever direct charter from Shenzen to Adelaide. More than 2000 passengers were carried on the charter services.

BA holds firm

British Airways has no plans to alter its 5% base commission, its regional manager has said.

Nicole Backo, BA's South-West Pacific regional commercial manager, confirmed the current 5% base commission will not be changed. She said BA would stick to incentives for agents rather than increase commission.

Moneydirect deal

Moneydirect has signed a deal with Flight Centre's US-based wholesaler, GOGO Worldwide Vacations.

The deal will see Moneydirect process commission payments, automate settlement and report all commissions.



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Skywest set for "major expansion"

Skywest Airlines could be on the cusp of a "major expansion" in the next few years according to brokerage firm WH Ireland.

The carrier released its first half results yesterday, with net profit after tax reaching \$5.26 million. The result compares to a \$2.08m loss in the previous corresponding period. WH Ireland said Skywest had successfully targeted the resource market in WA, resulting in lucrative flight contracts.

V Australia to drop Fiji flight

Virgin Blue will axe one of V Australia's weekly flights to Fiji and replace it with a Pacific Blue service in the wake of what the carrier described as changing "market circumstances".

In a submission to the International Air Services Commission, V Australia said it will operate six flights per week to Fiji, with one Pacific Blue flight added from Sydney to Nadi. A third weekly flight between Melbourne and Nadi will also be added, though no timeframe was given.

V Australia launched daily services from Sydney to Nadi on December 18, but said circumstances on the route had changed.

"V Australia seeks the proposed variation following its experience in this market and in response to market circumstances, including the anticipated entry of a new competitor (Jetstar)," the carrier said.

The changes would enable Virgin Blue Group "more efficient distribution of capacity across its international network".

Jetstar will begin a four-times weekly service to Fiji late next month, and said it was ready to pounce should any additional capacity become available.

We have always desired to have capacity beyond four flights a week," Jetstar spokesman Simon Westaway said.

"If there are additional seats now available out of the Australian market, we would be interested in obtaining them."

Qantas Group wrote to the IASC last year warning that V Australia would pull out of the market once conditions improved. "It is entirely possible that when conditions improve on routes to which the B777-300ER is better suited, V Australia will redeploy this aircraft to other destinations," (Travel Today, November 6, 2009). Calls to V Australia were not

returned ahead of press.

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Volendam savings

Travel the World is offering savings of up to 44% on 2010/11 cruises to Australia, New Zealand and the South Pacific onboard ms Volendam.

Discounts are also being offered for third and fourth guests on all sailings, as well as bonus offers for package bookings made before March 31.

Continental cuts

Continental Airlines plans to cut 600 telephone reservations jobs from April.

The company said the move was due to the increasing number of travellers who choose to book their flight online.

Greek merger

Star Alliance has welcomed the proposed merger between Aegean Airlines and Olympic Air.

Aegean Airlines is set to officially enter Star Alliance later this year. "The integration teams from both sides will soon meet to assess the necessary steps, in order to guarantee a smooth transition of the merged Aegean Airlines and Olympic Air operations into the Star Alliance network," Star Alliance said in a statement.

Jetstar ups flights

Jetstar will boost capacity between Singapore and Vietnam, increasing its eight times a week service to Ho Chi Minh to a double daily service by July.

Two new additional A320 aircraft will join the Singapore based fleet to fulfil the new schedule.

Jetstar is offering sale fares between Singapore and Ho Chi Minh for \$48.88 one way, all inclusive.


