VANCOUVER 2010 PARALYMPIC GAMES GOLD MEDAL

The New Zealand team returned from the Paralympic Winter Games with GOLD. New Zealand last won a medal at a Winter Paralympic Games in 2002 at Salt Lake City.

Adam Hall won Gold in the Standing Slalom at Vancouver 2010 Winter Paralympic Games. Hall, 21 from Otago finished his second run in a combined time of 1minute 45.40 seconds with German Gerad Schonfelder .57 of a second further back for the silver medal and Australian Cameron Rahles-Rahbula in third.

The Team:

Adam Hall, 21, from Otago. Prior to the Paralympic Winter Games he had, over the past 12 months, won 14 medals. Adam was ranked No. 2 in the world at the beginning of 2009 for adaptive slalom skiing. Adam has previously represented New Zealand at the 2006 Winter Paralympic Games in Italy

Peter Williams, 26, from Auckland. He first learnt to ski on his feet, but for the last 13 years has used a monoski. The Vancouver 2010 games were Peter's first Paralympic Games.

Jon Turnbull, Chef de Mission. Based in Wanaka, Jon is the Performance Manger for the NZAS Winter Sports Programme.

Hiro Taniguchi, Coach. Born in Hokkaido, Japan, Hiro has been moving between Wanaka and Colorado for the past few years, coaching Adam Hall.

Peter Sanford, Coach. Based in Wanaka, Pete grew up skiing at Coronet Peak and eventually started ski racing. He was on the NZ ski team for 7 years. He was the coach for the NZ Development Ski Team (Men) 2007 to 2009.

Andrew Duff, Physiotherapist. Based between Wanaka and Australia, Andrew provided the sports physiotherapy and medical care for the team.

2011 IPC ATHLETICS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS – CHRISTCHURCH

The biggest athletics event in New Zealand will take place in Christchurch 21 – 30 January 2011. The IPC Athletics World Championships 2011 will bring up to 1340 athletes from at least 70 countries. In addition 800 team management and 300 international officials will attend.

The second 400m training track has been laid and discussions about the final surface are underway. As a legacy of this event Christchurch will have a dual 400m athletics track facility, the only one in New Zealand. The new training track facility at QEII Stadium includes a long and high jump, throwing circles and Javelin.

RUAPEHU ADAPTIVE SNOWSPORTS PROGRAMME

Adam Hall's gold medal and the impressive performance of Pete Williams at this year's Paralympics has put adaptive snowsports on the map. Disability is no barrier to enjoying the freedom of whizzing down the slopes on skis or snowboard. Most of the main ski fields run adaptive programmes that work with a wide range of impairments - both physical and intellectual. Basically if you can move your head there's nothing stopping you skiing or snowboarding.



Mt Ruapehu is the largest ski area in New Zealand. It has a full-time adaptive program that runs at both Whakapapa and Turoa ski fields. It caters for individual clients and groups of any size. This season it is offering beginner lessons for around \$100 (\$70 for youth) that includes 2hrs tuition plus lift pass all and equipment. Members of school groups get an even cheaper deal. If you've never had the exhilarating experience of being on a mountain in the snow, then now's the time to give it a go.

PARALYMPIC ATHLETES IN DUNEDIN

The ASI and the Dunedin City Council have been working together to improve facilities for the Paralympics athlete squad that's formed in Dunedin. Several young athletes have relocated to take advantage of the high performance environment, including the indoor throwing area, and the guidance of coach **Raylene Bates** (& ASI's Business Manager). This has effectively created a hub of Paralympics athletics. The council's upgrade, which includes revamping circles at the Caledonian, and a ramp into the ASI training facilities at Logan Park to improve access has been a great help, leading the way nationally in the level of assistance.

Raylene believes the squad will make a major difference to performance in the athletes. Relocating here means they can now train indoors over winter, have increased on-to-one assistance and coaching, and work as a high performance team rather than independently. And one of the big pluses is working in an integrated environment with the able-bodied athletes Raylene trains. "They all train as hard as each other, and there is a lot of mutual respect and helping each other out in a family-type environment. It's working really well."

- **Rory McSweeney** has transferred from Wellington, and is studying at the University of Otago.
- **Rebecca Hayman** has transferred from Christchurch and is studying at the Otago Polytechnic.
- **Jess Hamill** will transfer from Invercargill shortly, studying at the Otago Polytechnic.
- **Allistair Johnston** has arrived in Dunedin to study at Otago University, returning to athletics after a break away.

They join Paralympics cyclist **Chris Ross** and Paralympics skier **Adam Hall** who use Dunedin as a base. Raylene says gold medalist Adam has provided enormous inspiration and on-going support for her athletes

Payroll giving is a voluntary scheme and as such, your employer has the choice whether to make this option available to you, and may restrict the choice of charities they will facilitate donations for.
